



## Statutory Consultation: 10 July – 14 August 2024

### CONSULTATION ANALYSIS REPORT

#### Proposed Zebra Crossing at Compton Crescent, White Hart Lane

The proposed zebra crossing will provide a clearly defined crossing point to give pedestrians the right of way over vehicular traffic, enabling them to cross the road safely.

Details are listed here:

1. Install a zebra crossing on White Hart Lane near Compton Crescent, including associated lighting equipment and road markings.
2. Reduce the pay by phone and permit-only parking bay by 16m outside no. 333 White Hart Lane, to provide adequate visibility.
3. Provide high skid resistant surface treatment on the approach to the zebra crossing.
