## **1 Describe the issue under consideration**

- 1.1 To report on the objections and submissions to the statutory consultation carried out from 27 November 2024 to 18 December 2024 on the proposal to introduce cycle hangars at various locations in the borough.
- 1.2 To request approval to proceed with implementation of the proposed 25 cycle storage facilities, having taken objections and submissions into consideration.

## **3 Recommendations**

- 3.1 It is recommended that the Head of Service for Highways and Parking in consultation with Cabinet Member for Climate Action, Environment and Transport:-
  - 3.1.1 Considers the objections and submissions raised during the statutory consultation on the proposals as set out in section 4 of this report, and officer responses to each objection set out in table 2, section 6 of this report; and
  - 3.1.2 Having considered the proposals, the objections to the statutory consultation and officer comments, and having due regard to the needs set out in Section 149 (public sector equality duty) of the Equality Act 2010: -
    - Agree to proceed with Implementing the 24 new cycle storage (cycle hangar) facilities at the proposed locations detailed in Table 1 of section 6.
    - Agree not to proceed with the installations of 3 cycle hangars at the proposed locations on Farrer Road N8, 50 Oakfield Road N4, 106 The Avenue, 210 Middle Lane, 159 Mount

View Road N4 and 52 Winchelsea Road for the reasons set out in section 4.6 of this report.

3.1.3 Approve the total estimated implementation cost of £108,072.00 which includes consultation, inventory survey, design, traffic management orders, supply, and installation of the cycle hangars. This is from the £487k approved budget for the implementation of the Cycle Parking Programme for year 2024/2025.

#### **4 Reasons for decisions**

- 4.1 Encouraging more people to cycle is an important part of the central Government and Haringey council policy to tackle traffic congestion, improve air quality, promote physical activity, and improve accessibility. However, many residents, particularly those who live in flats, find it difficult to keep bicycles at home due to a lack of storage space. The Council, therefore, has a rolling programme which started in October 2014 to provide more secure cycle storage (cycle hangar) on street for residents' use.
- 4.2 The locations for the proposed cycle hangars have been selected based on requests received from local residents.
- 4.3 A total of 181 responses were received to the statutory consultation with:
- 123 objections
  - 55 in favour
  - 3 comments
- 4.4 Objections received to the statutory consultation were in response to the proposals for cycle hangars to be introduced into the following roads – Barnard Hill, Chesterfield Gardens, Cranbrook Park, Farrer Road, Handsworth Road, Middle Lane, Milton Avenue, Milton Road, Mount View Road, Nightingale Road, North View Road, Oakfield Road , Palmerston Road, Radley Road , Raleigh Road, Rathcoole Gardens , Ridge Road, Rowley Road, Rutland Gardens, Seymour Road, Sirdar Road, Sylvan Avenue, Tetherdown, The Avenue, Umfreville Road, Wembury Road, Whittington Road, Willan Road, Winchelsea Road, Womerlsey Road, Woodland Rise, and Woodlands Park Road.
- 4.5 Of the objections received, the main theme presented related to the loss of vehicle parking space. Most objectors were concerned about the proposed cycle hangars would have an impact on being able to park on their street. The majority of objections received for this batch of cycle hangar locations have not been upheld. The Council, as the highway authority has a duty of care to manage the network, ensuring, along with other responsibilities, that cycle storage facilities are provided for those residents who find it difficult to keep bicycles at home due to lack of storage spaces. The provision of cycle hangars also contributes to the Council's commitment to encourage the use of alternative sustainable modes of Transport and meeting the requests and demand from the local communities they have been proposed.
- 4.6 Objections received from residents in Farrer Road N8, 50 Oakfield Road N4, 106 The Avenue, 210 Middle Lane, 159 Mount View Road N4 and 52 Winchelsea Road have been upheld. Residents recommend alternative locations for placing the bikehangars. Officers agreed with the suggested location and will revise the proposed cycle hangar locations accordingly. This will require for re-advertisement of Traffic Order and report approval before the installation of the cycle storage facilities.
- 4.7 A summary of objections received, and officer recommendations are detailed in Table 2, section 6 of this report.

- 4.8 The proposals contained within Table 1 section 6 impact 2 or more wards; however, in assessing the proposals, officers conclude that the proposed changes are not likely to be significant in terms of their effects on communities living or working in the area. Therefore, approval can be sought through delegated authority in consultation with the Cabinet Member for Climate Action, Environment and Transport and the Deputy Leader of the Council to make the relevant traffic management orders and implement the recommendations.

## 5 Alternative options considered

- 5.1 An alternative considered was to 'not' to proceed with the introduction of new cycle hangers. However, this is not recommended as it would be against the Council's commitment to providing more secure cycle storage facilities (cycle hangars) on street for residents' use.

## 6 Background Information

- 6.1 Many residents in the borough, particularly those who live in flats, find it difficult to keep bicycles at home due to a lack of storage space. This is often inconvenient and impractical, meaning that people may not be able to own a cycle at all.
- 6.2 In recent years, cycle hangars have emerged as a game-changing solution. These offer secure, sheltered cycle parking on residential streets. A cycle hangar is a communal bicycle locker that stores six bicycles and only takes half a car parking space on street. It is easy to open with a self-lifting door and protects bicycles from vandalism and wet weather.
- 6.3 The Council, therefore, has made a commitment and has a rolling programme from October 2014 to provide more secure cycle storage (cycle hangars) on street for residents' use and also to encourage the uptake of cycling.
- 6.4 A cycle hangar is a communal bicycle locker that can accommodate six bicycles, it occupies 2.5m of kerb side space, approximately half a car parking space.
- 6.5 The Council has a contract with Cyclehoop, one of the companies in the market that provide cycle storage facilities, to install and manage cycle hangars in Haringey.
- 6.6 Locations for the installation of cycle hangars are selected based on requests received from residents and a point-scoring system is established to enable requests to be prioritised. The sites selected then undergo a detailed site assessment by Haringey's engineers, who will consider the best location for the hangar.
- 6.7 Once locations are determined, a statutory consultation exercise is carried out in accordance with the Road Traffic Act 1984 and the Local Authorities Traffic Orders Procedure Regulations 1996. This is a legal process involving a notice of the proposal to be placed in the newspapers allowing 21 days during which anyone wishing to object can write to the Council providing reasons for their objection.
- 6.8 The allocation of cycle hangar space is managed by Cyclehoop once the hangar has been installed. Given the high number of requests across the borough, 1 hangar space is allocated per applicant unless there are sufficient spaces for the number of requests received from the road.
- 6.9 Residents can currently rent a space inside a cycle hangar. The actual cost of renting this space which intended to cover costs is £72. Those costs are subsidised by the council at present, with the Council meeting 50% of those costs and residents paying the remainder. This subject to review at present.

6.10 The sites for these new proposed cycle hangars were selected based on requests received from residents and further site assessment to determine suitability for each of the proposed locations. Table 1 below lists the proposed cycle hangar location.

6.11 Plans, which show the layout of the proposals, are provided in **Appendix 1** of this report.

### Statutory Consultation

6.12 Statutory consultation commenced on 27 November 2024 for a period of 21-days. The process consisted of a Notice of Proposal published in the London Gazette, Enfield, and Haringey Independent and the notice was erected on site in each of the affected streets. The closing date for representations and comments was 18 December 2024.

6.13 Although not a legal requirement, statutory notification letters informing of the proposals and process were also posted to frontages in the streets for the proposed cycle hangars. **Appendix 2** contains copies of the statutory notification letter delivered to affected frontages.

6.14 It is noted that LATOR provides local authorities with the discretion of whether to hold a public inquiry prior to the making of a TMO. This report does not include the recommendation to hold a public inquiry on account of the effect of the order (see paragraphs 6.7 & 6.13), the wider support for the project, that the project will contribute towards achieving a number of policy objectives and that holding a public inquiry would lead to expense and delay while being unlikely to alter the ultimate decision.

### Responses to Consultation

- 6.16 A total of 3345 properties received a letter to notify their occupants of the statutory consultation and how they could object should they wish to. A total of 181 representations from residents and businesses were received, comprising 123 objections, 55 submissions in favour and 3 comments.
- 6.17 Table 2 below summarises the objections received; these have been grouped by the reasons provided for the objections, and an officer response to each reason for the objection is provided. All the responses received are outline in **Appendix 3** of this report.

6.18 After considering the statutory consultation responses, it is concluded that the Council progresses with the installation of 24 proposed cycle storage hangars as it will promote the use of sustainable forms of Transport.

## **7 Contribution to strategic outcomes**

- 7.1 It is important that we have safe, green travel to prevent our roads from being overrun by cars and to support active travel, which is the ambition of the Council as laid out in its [Corporate Delivery Plan 2024 – 2026](#) and [Transport Strategy](#). The installation of the cycle hangars will support the objectives set out in these documents as well as the wider initiatives to improve air quality and support the health of residents as per the Council's [Climate Change Action Plan](#).
- 7.2 The introduction of the cycle storage facilities is in accordance to the borough's adapted [Walking and Cycling Action Plan](#) and aligns with the Council's agreed Transport Strategy and supports its 'aims' which include:
- To make Haringey which has a reputation for being a walking and cycling borough both regionally and nationally
  - Encourage more journeys to be taken by walking and cycling, to improve the wellbeing of our residents, reduced obesity, and improving air quality
  - To have a high quality accessible and wheelchair friendly public transport network meeting the needs of Haringey residents, visitors, and businesses.
  - A well-maintained road network that is less congested and safer

## **8 Carbon and Climate Change**

- 8.1 The overall objective of the cycle hangar installation programme is to provide more secure cycle storage on street for residents' use and also to encourage the uptake of cycling. Cycling reduces CO2 emissions, improve air quality and encourage a healthy lifestyle.

## **9 Comments of the Chief Financial Officer**

- 9.1 This report seeks approval for the recommendations listed under section 3 of this report.
- 9.2 This proposed capital works is estimated to cost c.£154k and will be funded by capital scheme 416 - Walking and Cycling Action Plan (WACAP) Cycle Parking (Hangars) delivery with a total 2024/25 capital budget of £487k. This scheme is financed via a combination of SCIL & TfL LIP grant award.

## **10 Comments of the Head of Legal Services and Governance**

- 10.1 Before reaching a decision to make the necessary traffic management order to implement specific use designated parking bays, the Council must follow the statutory consultation procedures pursuant to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) ("RTRA") and the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 (as amended) ("the Regulations"). All representations received must be properly considered in the light of administrative law principles, human rights law and the relevant statutory powers.
- 10.2 The Council's powers in relation to the making of traffic management orders arise mainly under sections 6, 9, 45, 46, 122 and 124 and schedules 1 paragraphs 1-22 the RTRA
- 10.3 The power of a local authority to make an order regulating or controlling vehicular and other traffic is contained within the ambit of section 6 of the RTRA.
- 10.4 When determining what parking places are to be designated on the highway, section 45(3) requires the Council to consider both the interests of traffic and those of the owners and occupiers of adjoining properties. In particular, the Council must have regard to: (a) the need for maintaining the free movement of traffic, (b) the need for maintaining reasonable access to premises, and (c) the extent to which off-street parking is available in the neighbourhood or if the

provision of such parking is likely to be encouraged by designating paying parking places on the highway.

10.5 By virtue of section 122, the Council must exercise its powers under the RTRA so as to secure the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of vehicular and other traffic, including pedestrians, and the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on and off the highway. These powers must be exercised so far as practicable having regard to the following matters: -

- The desirability of securing and maintaining reasonable access to premises.
- The effect on the amenities of any locality affected including the regulation and restriction of heavy commercial traffic so as to preserve or improve amenities.
- The national air quality strategy.
- Facilitating the passage of public service vehicles and securing the safety and convenience of their passengers.
- Any other matters appearing to the Council to be relevant.

10.6 Prior to making any order the Council must carry out carry out the consultations as set out in Schedule 9 of the RTRA and Regulations 6 and 7 of the Local Authority Traffic Orders Procedure Regulations 1996. A consultation will not be lawful unless it is (1) undertaken at a time when proposals are still at a formative stage; (2) sufficient reasons are given for any proposal to enable people who are interested in the same to consider the proposals and make representations; (3) adequate time has been given for such consideration and response; and (4) all representations have been conscientiously taken into account when finalising the proposals.

10.7 Having carried out the statutory consultation, the Council can proceed with the recommendations set out in this report.

## **11 Equalities Comments**

11.1 The Council has a Public Sector Equality Duty under the Equality Act (2010) to have due regard to the need to:

- Eliminate discrimination, harassment and victimisation and any other conduct prohibited under the Act
- Advance equality of opportunity between people who share those protected characteristics and people who do not
- Foster good relations between people who share those characteristics and people who do not.

11.2 The three parts of the duty apply to the following protected characteristics: age, disability, gender reassignment, pregnancy/maternity, race, religion/faith, sex and sexual orientation. Marriage and civil partnership status applies to the first part of the duty. Although it is not enforced in legislation as a protected characteristic, Haringey Council treats socioeconomic status as a local protected characteristic.

11.3 The proposed decision is to proceed with the introduction of the cycle hangars outlined in Appendix 1 and agree for the Traffic Management Order to be made for these, under sections 6 and 124 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

11.4 Of the objections received, the main theme presented related to the loss of vehicle parking space. Most objectors were concerned about the proposed cycle hangars' impact on available car parking space in their street. The majority of objections received for this batch of cycle hangar

locations have not been upheld, as they did not present any substantial reasons why the hangars should not be introduced. Please refer to Table 1 for Council responses on each objection.

- 11.5 Where substantial objections were made such as to demonstrate potential impacts on individuals with protected characteristics, we have provided necessary mitigations or made the decision not to proceed with cycle hangars at those locations.
- 11.6 The overall objective of the cycle hangar installation programme is to provide a demand-based secure cycle storage on street for residents' use and to encourage the uptake of cycling in the long-term. Cycling reduces CO2 emissions, improves air quality and encourages a healthier lifestyle. These improvements are anticipated to have positive impacts on children and young people, older people, and people with disabilities, who are disproportionately affected by pollution and lifestyle related health disparities. As such, the proposed decision represents a measure to address existing inequalities.





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

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

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Instead of improving accessibility, the proposed location will create more challenges for residents, especially for those with young children or mobility issues. The reduction in parking spaces close to homes will make it more difficult for these groups to navigate daily tasks.

.Impact on residents of Barnard Hill living in flats

The main block of flats on Barnard Hill is situated closer to the end of the road, at the intersection with Muswell Avenue. To truly favor these residents, and to achieve the aim of facilitating a larger adoption of bicycles as transportation means, the Bikehanger should be located nearer to those flats rather than in the proposed location.

In the spirit of compromise, relocating the Bikehanger to a more suitable location where it will not take up valuable car parking spaces while remaining easily accessible to residents appears to be the only solution.

To that end, it appears that the best place where to install the Bikehangar, minimizing disruptions for the community, is at the conjunction between Barnard Hill and Muswell Avenue, on the Muswell Avenue side, because:

.There is plenty of unused space which can easily accommodate a structure the size of a Bikehangar without taking up any parking space, and

.It would be closer to the biggest apartment building of Barnard Hill, thus making it easier for the intended recipients of such service to access it.

I attach photos of the proposed location  
for your consideration.

I am confident that with thoughtful reconsideration  
of the location, the council can achieve its objectives without causing additional distress to residents.  
I would be happy to discuss this matter further or attend a meeting to explore alternatives.

This congestion and busyness is unnecessary given there are a number of other existing parking spaces on the road which could easily be used, and to no one's detriment.</li> <li>• Noise disturbance - Comings and goings from the housing association during any working hours (staff and visitors - query if any of these people would drive to the housing association office and need to park), and then comings and goings from the bike hangar at any time of day or night, directly in front of 31 Marquis (including 31A bedroom) and very close to 33 and 29 Marquis. Noise disturbance and busyness on a small stretch of the road seems unnecessary and unfair on the residents it will negatively impact. Noise disturbance to 33/31/29 Marquis Road is unnecessary given other options on the road where the bike hangar could be placed outside of no-one's house or front door (for example on one of the ends of the road, e.g. at the side of 29 Victoria Road or 46 Florence Road).</li> <li>• Proposed examples of other places on Marquis Road a bike hangar could be placed where it would impact no one are (all examples are existing parking spaces): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>o At any of the ends or near the ends of the road in any of the existing parking spaces (either at Victoria Road or Florence Road ends) - in front of high brick walls or high fences which lead onto gardens or sides of houses.</li> <li>o This could include up to 4 existing parking spaces that are in front of the 29 Victoria Road high brick wall or high fence which lead onto the side of the 29 Victoria Rd house or garden (and the house is also further set back off the pavement/ road and there is no window in the side of the house); or</li> <li>o in any of the 2 spots to the side of 31 Victoria Road which are just in front of a side wall/</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
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brick wall; or  
o in any of the 3 spots after 35 Marquis Road leading up to the first set of Ronaldshay communal bins (where Ronaldshay is set well back off the pavement/ road); or  
o in any of the 3 spots before the metal gate on the side of the very high brick wall leading onto 46 Florence Rd side of house and garden (actual house again set off road and there is no window in the side of the house overlooking these spaces) or on the opposite side of the road to the metal gate mentioned which is directly in front of the second set of Ronaldshay bins; or  
o in the existing parking spaces to the side of the 30 Victoria Road house (running down to the basketball court on Marquis Road).

I very much hope the council will take these objections into consideration (and those of any residents or visitors whom this bike hangar would directly, and permanently negatively impact) and move the location of the new bike hangar to an existing parking space on Marquis Road which does not negatively impact any resident (examples of the same given above) but offers the benefits of having a bike hanger.

I would welcome a member of the council coming to Marquis and considering the options in person.

This is a pretty high-density project which will have significant knock-on effects, particularly as I understand from the plans that limited on-site parking is proposed there. If the Council considered the need for a bikehanger space so vital in the road, I question why that was not included as a condition for the grant of planning permission for the Hornsey police station project. Losing one parking space to a bikehanger would have serious implications for Harold Road residents - particularly those who have special car transport needs. The result will be more pressure to park on surrounding roads - with serious implications for residents there.</p> <p>I question the premise that making more bicycle spaces available will help tackle traffic congestion - for multiple purposes, bicycles do not provide a viable alternative to car use, eg weekly shopping, transporting a family, particularly young or old(er) family members, recycling, etc. Cars will continue to be needed and suitable provision should be made for their parking. Residents would welcome proof of demand for bike spaces in Harold Road from the Council - as far as I know, we have to date seen no evidence of this.</p> <p>Other proposed bikehanger locations are close by to Harold Road which will lead to greater congestion in surrounding streets as car owners drive around searching for parking spaces. However, this street consists predominantly of full Edwardian houses with private front and back gardens and cellars, making outdoor and indoor bike storage readily available. The low number of flats on this street do not justify the installation of a bike hanger that will serve minimal purpose, especially when most residents have ample private storage options.</p> <p><b>Not in Keeping with Conservation Area Design Standards:</b> The Bikehangar's design, with its pressed metal sheet construction, gives it the appearance of a cheap and utilitarian structure, unsuited to the character of this conservation area. Its industrial look creates a jarring contrast with the Edwardian architecture of the neighborhood.</p> <p><b>Increased Noise and Disruption on a Quiet Road:</b> The all-metal fabrication of the Bikehangar will amplify noises arising from parking and removing bicycles from the racks. With the potential for up to six bicycles per unit, the noise will be more significant, prolonged, and frequent than opening a car door. This could easily become a source of annoyance for nearby residents, particularly on a quiet residential street like ours. The proximity to houses means this noise will disturb residents during both day and night, disrupting the peace and tranquility of the area.</p> <p><b>Visual Impact and Eyesore from My Property:</b> The proposed location of the bike hanger is close to my property and directly within the line of sight from my front window. Its cheap, utilitarian design is incompatible with the Edwardian character of the street and will create an eyesore in a historically preserved area. Placing this metal structure so close to homes, at the same level as the houses, will dominate the view, further detracting from the visual appeal of the neighborhood.</p> <p><b>Potential for Vandalism and Neglect:</b> These Bikehangars are prone to vandalism, particularly graffiti, as has been seen elsewhere in London. A neglected appearance, with graffiti or other damage, will contribute to the area looking run-down and unkempt until repairs are completed.</p>
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Additionally, leaves and litter that become trapped inside the Bikehangar can't be removed promptly by street cleaners. If not properly maintained, the structure will take on a neglected appearance, further harming the street scene.

**Inappropriate Street Furniture for a Conservation Area:**

This street lies within a designated conservation area, and the respective Conservation Area Statements emphasize that poor-quality street furniture is a problem that needs to be addressed, not exacerbated. Installing the Bikehangar, which is both unsightly and prone to vandalism, will worsen the issue of low-quality street furniture in an area where preserving historical integrity is a priority.

**Alternative Positioning Suggestion:**

If a bike hanger is truly necessary, it should be placed at the ends of the road where there are double yellow lines, rather than taking up valuable parking spaces in front of homes. This would minimize the visual and physical impact on residents, preserve parking spaces, and reduce noise disruption to the immediate residential area.

**Low Public Benefit for High Cost:**

Most homes on this street have private storage spaces such as gardens or cellars for their bicycles. The public benefit of installing a Bikehangar is minimal and does not justify the loss of parking spaces, the potential increase in noise, or the degradation of the street's visual appeal. These funds could be better allocated to projects that benefit the entire community, such as road repairs or completing the resurfacing of the street.

**Increased Urbanization in a Low-Density Area:**

The Bikehangar's modern, industrial design is more appropriate for dense urban environments, not quiet, low-density residential streets like ours. Its presence would introduce unnecessary urbanization to a historical neighborhood and conflict with the area's traditional charm and character.

**Inappropriate for the Needs of the Community:**

Most residents on this street already have private gardens, cellars, or other outdoor storage options for bicycles. This makes the bike hanger unnecessary, as it would serve a small portion of the community. These installations are better suited to areas with high-density flats where storage is limited, not a street primarily composed of full houses with ample storage.

**Increased Traffic Congestion:**

Given the high car ownership on this road and existing parking challenges, the presence of the bike hanger could increase traffic congestion. Cars circling to find parking spaces may lead to more idling, higher emissions, and disruption for residents. Additionally, delivery vehicles or tradespeople may find it even more difficult to park close to the houses they are servicing.

**Safety Concerns for Pedestrians:**

The structure may pose a safety hazard, especially for pedestrians, children, and the elderly. The reduced street space might increase the risk of accidents as people navigate around the hanger, particularly if it's placed near crossing points.

**Limited Demand for Bike Storage:**

There is not a strong demand for public bike storage on this road. Most houses have adequate private storage options such as front/back gardens and cellars

**Parking Concerns:**

The hanger occupies valuable parking spaces in an area that already suffers from parking shortages. Residents often struggle to park due to high car ownership, and this will worsen the issue, especially for visitors, deliveries, and building works. Locating the bike hanger on double yellow lines would preserve a parking space while serving its purpose.

**Security Risks:**

There is a higher security risk when storing bikes in public structures. Such bike hangers are regularly being broken into, and they can inadvertently attract bike thieves. It is safer for residents to store bikes on their own property, particularly since many houses have private front or back gardens and cellars.

**Alternative Investments:**

Instead of installing bike hangers, it would be more beneficial to address essential road maintenance issues. The council recently resurfaced only 50% of the road, leaving potholes and uneven paving untouched. Prioritizing these repairs would be a better use of funds for the community.

**Impact on Aesthetics & Conservation:**

The bike hanger's large metal structure is visually unappealing and does not align with

the Edwardian architecture and overall street character. Given this is a conservation area, the placement of such a modern, obtrusive object is inappropriate.

Indeed as I cyclist myself I can attest that (secured) storage / parking possibilities for bicycles are currently insufficient in the borough. This proposal is a step in the right direction.</p> <p>Specifically for the two hangars proposed in my area (Hangar 45 and 46, both on Meads Road N22), I think these will be appreciated by many as quite a few residences in the area are flats. In addition, many gardens in the area do not have a back entrance meaning that even those living ground floor do not necessarily have good options for bicycle storage.</p> <p>Furhermore, the proposed bike hangars are a good way shift efforts to active modes of transport. Looking at the space currently provided for parking cars in Meads Road, I can only conclude that car parking (and as an extension of that owning and using a car) is overfacilitated in the area. Yesterday afternoon (Sunday 15 September) I found that 28 cars were parked in Meads Road. I estimate the street provides around 48 parking bays. Sightline Restriction for Vehicles Exiting Our Parking Area: The proposed bike hangar's proximity to the entrance of our off-street parking will significantly obstruct the visibility for vehicles exiting the parking area onto Alexandra Park Road. This road is a busy thoroughfare, and clear sightlines are essential for ensuring the safety of drivers, cyclists, and pedestrians. The bike hangar's placement would create a blind spot, increasing the risk of accidents.</li> <li>2. Increased Risk to Pedestrians and Cyclists: As the proposed location is on a busy road, the restricted visibility could result in collisions involving vehicles exiting the parking area and pedestrians or cyclists using the road and footpath. Given that the cycle hangars will increase cyclist activity in the area, this poses an even greater risk.</li> <li>3. Lack of Consideration for Existing Parking Arrangements: The bike hangar appears to have been planned without sufficient regard for the impact on existing parking arrangements, especially in terms of safe access and egress from private parking areas like ours.</li> </ol> <p>I fully support the initiative to encourage cycling, but I believe alternative locations for the bike hangar that do not compromise safety should be considered. I kindly request a reassessment of this location and suggest moving the hangar to a spot where it will not interfere with existing traffic sightlines. There are roads which are both proximate and contiguous to your proposed bicycle hangar location in Alexandra Park Road, for example Muswell Hill Road which is a cul de sac and which would manifest fewer hazards than those which your proposed location would create.</p> <p>Thank you for considering my objection.</p>

However the request may have come from a tenant living in the building, though no prior talk between the homeowners and this tenant has taken place about this.</p> <p>As a car user, bike user and pedestrian (and someone who will first choose to walk somewhere before resorting to other transport methods) I understand the need for hangers to be placed all across an area, for health benefits, the environment and so those who need storage can access them. Going forwards we can't be thinking 'cars only' and also for some, owning a car is overkill. I don't believe that having more bike storage promotes users to ditch their cars for cycles as the two are not the same thing and people can own both to cover the different use-cases (as do we).</p> <p>I understand that there is a long waiting list for people wanting a hanger space. So in principle we are happy with increasing the number of hangers in the area. That said I don't think it makes any sense to place it here (or rather more in front of no 31), primarily for safety reasons. When thinking about anything road-traffic related 'road safety' should be the overriding priority. We should not be placing hangers in unsafe locations when there are better alternatives, just because we need them.</p> <p>This section of Alexandra Park Road (B106) acts as a local artery road where traffic that emerges from side streets has to join this road to get out of the area. For example you can't go from B550 to B106 (or vice versa) via the residential streets as road access is blocked. Thus the volume of traffic and the 'urgency' that drivers often have on these main routes is greater - they don't like to stop for others. So with a lot of faster moving heavy traffic, having a hanger amongst this, increases the chances of incidents where a car/truck/articulated lorry won't see the cyclist joining/leaving mid-road. Most drivers don't stop to let me off my drive when I'm in my car, and forget about it when I'm on my bike.</p> <p>Our side of the road (north side, odd numbers) also has the faster pace of traffic where drivers blitz it from the petrol station to St Andrew's church and they only slow down moments before they approach the bend and crossing. On the other side (south side, even numbers), drivers coming from the library are climbing uphill, pass the crossing and then finally turn the corner so they are naturally going slower. If for some reason a bike hanger simply had to be placed on this section of the B106, it would be far safer for all if it was on the even numbered 'slower' side. The space between Coniston Rd and No26 Alexandra Park Rd is a radically better position for a hanger (or two).</p>
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The situation is sometimes worse at night where the traffic flowing by can be at a much faster pace than in the daytime (as less busy). For reference, I am often in our front room where I have a clear view of the road. I can also hear the traffic noise so am able to easily judge what is happening outside. I am present most daytime, evening and during parts of the night where I have over the years grown very aware of what takes place on this section of the street.

Also, I am not sure as I would need to measure it but I suspect that the pavement area on the even-numbered side (by no26) is wider and more clear than on the odd-numbered side (by no29/31). A bike hanger also sits on the pavement edge, gobbling up the kerb. This reduces the access width a little bit more.

Obviously it is not anticipated that a hanger will be in use all the time but when a user is accessing the hanger they will occupy a portion of the space by it, making it more difficult for pedestrians and mobility users to get by. A cyclist typically has more to do and check when they get their bike than a car user who generally just jumps inside and does internal prep before pulling away. This means they need a bit more space and less disruption to check their bike is still operating well, to put locks on/away, before sorting themselves out (bags, coat, gloves etc) and then leaving. To do all of this safely the cyclist needs the space to operate and to focus on what is happening on the road rather than deal with issues to do with pedestrian/mobility users. On occasion their bike might need adjusting/fixing and that too needs space and a sense of calm around them.

Is there a requirement for the hanger to be well clear of any dropped kerbs and not in front of lamp posts etc? If I have read this correctly, the hanger would appear wholly in front of no31 and would not fall in front of the boundary of no29. This leaves a space between this hanger and the dropped kerb at no29. Will this space be, in a practical sense, long enough for any standard car? I ask because if the space left is a bit smaller then there is a risk that users may be tempted to park there and they will overhang the dropped kerb making car access on/off no29 impossible. Residents who live on this road tend to not do this, as they check if they are blocking our driveway. But non-local car users who come and leave their car for the day/evening generally do not think to check or they assume it is all fine and many times in the past we have been blocked in and unable to use our car when needed. This is made worse on occasion when a small car also parks on the other side (between no29 and no27) and then we have obstructions on both sides.

There also happens to be a dropped kerb at no 31. Not all dropped kerbs are for cars, so

will this dropped kerb be removed (the kerb rebuilt) before the hanger is placed?

Alternate safer locations for this hanger:

- by no26 Alexandra Park Road (possibly space for 2 hangers)
- opening of St Regis Close (quiet cul-de-sac)
- Windermere Road by church (odd number side)

I think in general there is a better possibility for hanger locations. They should not be placed on main 'artery' roads (like the B106) but should be on the quieter side streets. There recently was a notice issued where the length of double yellow lines at the ends of roads/junctions was to be increased. This means users leaving and joining roads can more easily see around corners the oncoming traffic and react safely. I am not sure if this has taken place yet. Could the area reclaimed be partially utilised for bike hangers? This would still leave the majority of the yellow lines free. A bike hanger is shorter in height than most non-sport-like cars and so most car users along with pedestrians and mobility users might still be able to see over a bike hanger to assess the dangers around a junction. Having bike hangers at the ends of quieter roads (and in the middle of them if they are long) seems far more safe than placing on busy main roads. Under this model quiet side roads could all eventually house at least 4 bike hangers (2 at each end) and more if there is space in the middle somewhere.

Grasmere Road, being in an affluent area, does not require this facility as much as other roads might.</p> <p><b>Loss of Parking Space</b> The bike hanger will remove a much-needed parking space, which is invaluable for residents, visitors, and delivery vehicles. Many residents have two cars, and parking availability is already problematic. Your reduction of parking spaces in the area with extended yellow lines has forced us to do this.

Both my children are hyper mobile and have problems with their feet - having to park further away is a health issue.

Our stretch of road is incredibly noisy already - to have people using bike hangar will create even more noise stress for us. We already have buses and motorbikes as we have bollards and a bus stop just a few yards away - and Lorrie's all day long. Now bashing and clanging etc. Please don't do this. The noise pollution is making us ill.

There is Very limited parking for the 13 households on our very small part of the road (or block) only room for 4 cars between house 29-47. You have already extended yellow lines on neighbouring roads eg st Regis Close - so even fewer spaces to park. We can spend 10-15 minutes trying to find a place to park. And it's always a walk away.

Can you please note my strong objection to proposed siting of the hangar for the following reasons.</p> <p>Firstly and most importantly, I have serious concerns with regards to being able to park near my property. It is very important to us that we are able to park outside our house if there is a space available, as we have three small children and we feel the risk of any road injury is greatly reduced if we are able to park as close to our property as possible. We understand that an argument could be made by yourselves that it is not always possible to park in front of your own house in London anyway, so the bike hanger will make no difference. But the fact is, the bike hangar being situated outside ours and our neighbour’s property at 107 does reduce our options to park near our properties by at least one space and so impinges on the opportunity to park near our house. I find this of real concern to me, as I feel my children are more at risk of injury if they are having to cross the road because we are not able to park outside our house and I would like the fact that I have raised this risk and I am very concerned duly noted by yourselves. Likewise, I have concerns about my neighbour at 107 who is registered disabled. I feel that to site the bikeshed between our two properties, one of which has small children and one of which has a registered disabled resident makes very little sense and could contribute to a general lack of well-being for us both and the safety of my family.</p> <p>Secondly, I am already concerned that the lower end of Hewitt Road is already very difficult in terms of parking space availability. Considering the section of Hewitt Road from the passageway down towards Green Lanes; I have calculated that there are approximately 54 houses of which an estimated 20% are flats. This means that there are around 65 dwellings on Hewitt Road with residents who potentially wish to park. However, there are only around 46 parking spaces (23 each side of the road) of which 5 are for disabled parking and 6 are bay-parking spaces. This leaves a total of just 35 spaces between 65 residents. If you then consider the extra parking requirements from non-residents who want to park on Hewitt Road, due to it’s proximity to the shops and restaurants of Green Lanes, parking spaces become even more limited so I can’t see that this section of Hewitt Road which is so heavily used anyway and also has paid parking bays etc is the best place to lose a parking space to accommodate a bike hangar.
