Statutory Consultation

Proposed speed reduction measures on Perth Road, N22

Dear Resident or Business,

A public consultation was conducted from 3 July to 24 July 2024, on two options to introduce speed reduction measures on Perth Road. We received 73 responses to the public consultation: 24 (43%) in support of Option 1; 42 (58%) in support of Option 2; and 7 (10%) who chose neither option / leave the road as it is.

We considered all feedback received during the public consultation period and in view of the majority support for Option 2, the council has decided to proceed to statutory consultation. This is the legal part of the process and takes the form of a Public Notice advertised in the local press, London Gazette and visible locations within the area to inform the public of the Council's intentions.

The proposed measures for Option 2 will help to improve road safety and pedestrian accessibility. Details are listed below and illustrated on the attached plan.

- Provision of new sinusoidal road humps on Perth Road
- Provision of kerb buildouts and 'at any time' loading restrictions at the junction of Perth Road and Paisley Road to improve visibility
- New and upgraded traffic signs

The statutory consultation process runs for three weeks and would have ended on 25th March 2025. However, this has now been extended to 1st **April 2025** to include Eldon Road residents, who may be impacted by the scheme.
