# Priority 1: Facilitate High Quality Activities and Spaces for Young People

## Why is this a priority?

- Ensuring that we have appropriate and high quality spaced is an investment in the development, wellbeing, and future potential of young people in the borough.
- Access provides developmental opportunities including building teamwork and resilience, as well as building confidence. Safe spaces with structured activities increase participation and reduces the risk of involvement in youth violence.
- Youth centres and the activities they provide deliver hubs of positivity and creativity, reducing anti-social behaviour and promoting civic engagement.

## Priority 2: Hearing Young People's Voices

## Why is this a priority?

- The UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (Article 12) affirms that children and young people have the right to express their views in all matters affecting them and this strategy looks to enable young people to be at the heart of decision making.
- Young people report that they are underrepresented in decision making in their communities and giving them a platform that encourages and enables their voice to be heard shows respect, builds trust, and affirms their value in society.
- With the planned introduction of lowering the voting age, this encourages young people to become engaged citizens and increases understanding of how local government works. Delivering UK youth parliament elections will enable the voice of young people in Haringey to be heard at a national level.

# What has already been done?

- Engaged young people in a youth panel and enabled their representation at council and cabinet meetings
- o Developed a timescale for elections to establish a formal youth council.


