Education Strategy Board - Terms of Reference

1. Purpose

- To provide effective support and oversight to the development of the Education Strategy for Haringey.
- To ensure the future strategy sets the direction for the improvement of outcomes for children in schools across Haringey and supports increasing and maintaining resilience in schools across the Borough.
- To set out core principles for the delivery of Education services across Haringey moving forward across 2024-2029.

2. Membership and Quorum

- The panel will be chaired by the Director of Children and Young Peoples Services, or the Assistant Director Schools and Learning.
- The Board will consist of:
 - Lead Member Children and Families
 - Senior Leaders and Heads of Service within Children and Young Peoples Services
 - School Leaders / Headteachers / Governors from a mixture of schools across the Haringey clusters (Community, Voluntary Aided, Foundation, Academy and free school)
 - o HEP Chief Executive
 - o Representatives from the Anglican and Catholic Dioceses
 - Schools HR and Finance Officer(s)
 - o Commissioning and Programmes Team colleagues
- Other individuals may be invited to attend for all or part of any meeting, as and when appropriate and necessary.
- The quorum shall consist of no less than 5 members, of which one may be the chair.

3. Duties

- To support the development of an Education Strategy for Haringey covering the next five years 2024-2030.
- To provide an understanding of local context and provision of education across Haringey.
- To set out areas of improvement for Education across Haringey focusing on improving key educational outcomes for children.
- To consider the current resilience of schools in Haringey and recommend ways to improve the resilience of educational provision across Haringey.
- To identify and approve the ambition and core areas of focus to form the basis of the new Education Strategy.
- To consider future improvement activities and projects to support the new Strategy to deliver its aims, objectives, and outcomes.
- To approve draft and final versions of the Education Strategy for publication in 2024.

4. Decision making and consultations.

 Decisions will be reached by general agreement with the members present as determined by the Chair.

- The Board will make recommendations to Cabinet through a Cabinet Paper when required.
- Areas identified that require statutory consultation or other legal forms of action will be set out and considered in the Strategy and its associated documents.
- Declarations of interest Head teachers or Governors declaring an interest will not impact their voting rights when decisions are being made about their own or other local schools.
