

Licensing Objective: Prevention of Public Nuisance. Evidence from Log: Repeated late-night amplified music in breach of restrictive clause 4 of planning conditions, unmonitored outdoor events, extractor fan noise cycling through the night, early-morning cleaning, construction noise, raised voices and shouting (staff), and excessive light pollution. These activities frequently take place late into the evening or early morning. The lack of any acoustic barrier or sound-limiting equipment significantly worsens the escape of noise into my home and represents a foreseeable management failure. The operation of the outdoor areas late at night is a primary source of the disturbance. The issues described are not isolated incidents but form a consistent, repeated and escalating pattern, representing a cumulative impact on residential amenity. Impact on Residents: Chronic sleep disturbance, inability to work or study, significant stress and disruption to family life.

Licensing Objective: Public Safety. Evidence from Log: Waste, broken glass and overflowing bins blocking access / fire escape routes; construction and cleaning activities very early morning and late at night. Electrical equipment running unnecessarily in early hours. Given that this narrow pathway is the only access route for 1C and that the area directly in front of the pub is the only access route towards Crouch End or Muswell Hill, safe passage should be guaranteed. Current arrangements do not meet that standard. These obstructions occurred most often during busy events, which appear to be insufficiently staffed to manage crowd and waste flow safely. Impact on Residents: Unsafe and obstructed access to property, risk to pedestrians and children, hygiene issues (attracting vermin).

Licensing Objective: Prevention of Crime and Disorder. Evidence from Log: Lack of supervision at events, partygoers controlling music, confrontational responses from management. Suspected intruder accessing covered dining area by climbing over fence and exiting in front of 1B / 1C as child was leaving for school (14 November 2025), raising fears of a burglary. I am also aware that in 2023 two intruders accessed the premises via the same fence line, stealing alcohol on that occasion. This demonstrates an established vulnerability in this area which has not been mitigated by current management. These repeat incidents demonstrate that the premises has not implemented effective security measures or safeguarding practices for boundary areas that directly affect neighbouring properties. Impact on Residents: Anti-social behaviour, lack of control over noise and guest conduct. The emotional impact on my daughter has been significant. She expressed fear about leaving the house alone and I supervise her departure because of this incident. I am also fearful about further incidents - whether or not this individual returns or other opportunistic intruders access the covered dining area via the fence.

Licensing Objective: Protection of Children from Harm. Evidence from Log: Exposure to swearing, drunken shouting, loud music into early hours, bright lights preventing rest, broken glass on path outside home. Early-morning and late-nights incidents where loud activity in the yard caused concern of a potential intruder. An individual climbed over the fence from the pub side at 8.14am on 14 November 2025 as daughter was leaving for school, raising fears of a burglary. This caused immediate fear for my daughter's safety as she was leaving the house (reported to Met Police, receipt number: BCA-84831-25-0101-00) Impact on Residents: Disrupted sleep, stress during exam period, inability to concentrate or study. Fear for safety of children and self.
