Hi

Thank you for your comments and for outlining the concerns from the Noise and Licensing team. I would like to clarify that my application is **not for a general extension of hours Monday to Sunday**, but **solely for an extension until 02:00 AM on event days only** (Tottenham Hotspur fixtures, concerts, or large-scale events).

I am happy with permits only on event day conditions. so my application should be considered as there are few shops that have till late opening hours / 24 hours licence on the same street.

Given this, I would like to respond to the points raised:

Prevention of Crime and Disorder / Public Safety

The request is specifically tied to event days, when footfall in the area is already at its peak. Allowing the premises to remain open slightly longer **helps stagger customer dispersal**, reducing the likelihood of large groups leaving at the same time and decreasing street congestion and disorder. It also enables us to keep patrons safely inside the premises during the busiest periods rather than having them leave abruptly when streets are still highly active.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

Because this extension would apply *only* to a limited number of event days, its impact on the community is minimal. In fact, permitting customers to remain indoors longer can reduce noise and nuisance on the street and support a more controlled closing process.

We remain fully committed to implementing all reasonable measures—noise management, responsible service of alcohol, and clear dispersal procedures—to ensure we operate responsibly.

Clear, Hold, Build (CHB) Area

We understand the importance of the CHB initiative and believe that a temporary extension on designated event days will not undermine this effort. On the contrary, by keeping customers inside a supervised environment during the peak exit period, we can contribute positively to the coordinated management of the area.

In summary, the request is **not for daily extended hours**, but for a practical, event-specific measure that supports safer crowd management and helps reduce street-level impact. We are committed to working collaboratively with the council and relevant teams to meet all licensing objectives.

Hi,

The Noise and Licensing team are in the view the licensed premises should remain open within their licenced opening hours Monday to Sunday until 00.00 and no extensions to opening hours.

I wish to object to this application on the basis of the following licensing objectives:

- **Prevention of Crime and Disorder**
- **Prevention of Public Nuisance**
- **Public Safety**

The premises are located within Northumberland Park ward on a busy high road, which experiences significant footfall and congestion during Tottenham Hotspur fixtures, boxing events, concerts, and other large-scale gatherings. This area is already subject to ongoing challenges and is well documented by the Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) team for issues including street drinking, late-night noise, violent incidents, and drug-related activity.

The proposed extension of alcohol sales hours from Monday through Sunday, including weekday evenings, is highly likely to increase these existing problems and contribute to increased public nuisance and risk to community safety.

Furthermore, the premises fall within the designated footprint of the **Clear, Hold, Build (CHB) initiative**, designed to address serious and organised crime and reduce ASB through a coordinated, multi-agency approach.

Granting extended hours would undermine these efforts and conflict with the objectives of this initiative.
