Statutory Consultation

Proposed Zebra Crossing on Willoughby Lane, N17

Dear Resident or Business,

Following requests from the local community, the Council is proposing to introduce a zebra crossing on Willoughby Lane near the junction with Brantwood Road, as part of this year's Road Danger Reduction Plan.

The proposed zebra crossing on Willoughby Lane near the junction with Brantwood Road will provide a clearly defined crossing point and will give pedestrians the right of way over traffic, enabling them to cross the road safely.

Details of the proposal are listed below and set out on the plan overleaf:

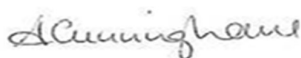
- Introduce a zebra crossing on Willoughby Lane near the junction with Brantwood Road, including associated lighting equipment and road markings.
- Extend the existing island and remove the existing uncontrolled crossing points on Willoughby Lane.
- Remove the existing tree to accommodate the proposed zebra crossing (replacement tree to be planted at a suitable location).
- Provide high skid resistant surface treatment on the approach to the zebra crossing.

This letter marks the start of a three-week public and statutory consultation period during which we welcome your views. The statutory consultation is a formal process whereby the proposals are advertised in the local press and allow a 21-day period for anyone wishing to object to the proposals. You can give us your views, comments, or objections by scanning the QR code above, or using the link to complete our online feedback form.
