Proposed Zebra Crossing on Mary Neuner Road, between Alington House and Blenheim Mansions, N8

No objections received.

In support of scheme:

	Comments supporting proposals
1	<p>This area needs to be prioritised for local residents, leisure, and a slower pace of life. Having been transformed from an industrial and warehouse district into a modern residential quarter—with further phases still to be completed—the neighbourhood is now home to a diverse community of families, children, and elderly residents who frequently use the green spaces for recreation.</p> <p>Therefore, a zebra crossing connecting both sections of the development is essential. The area currently features a play park and water features on both sides, with the green space hosting regular community events and food pop-ups. Furthermore, a community centre and cafe have recently opened adjacent to the proposed crossing site, and space has been allocated for a nursery and a pub to open nearby.</p> <p>Given the current high levels of footfall and the projected increase as the development expands, pedestrian safety must be the primary concern. Installing this zebra crossing is a vital step in future-proofing the area’s infrastructure.</p>
2	<p>This zebra crossing is well overdue. We have big numbers of children crossing this road from and to the park, and there is also a lot children residing nearby. We are extremely please for this zebra crossing to go ahead.</p>
3	<p>I fully support the proposal to introduce a zebra crossing at the designated place on Mary Neuner road.</p>
4	<p>I live on this street. It can be difficult to cross at times. A zebra crossing is essential. Something else you need to address is the huge number of cars with disabled passes parking outside Avalon mansions. It creates a massive bottleneck and will be a huge problem when the bus route is introduced.</p>
5	<p>I completely support the proposal for a zebra crossing. I would additionally like to see traffic calming measures at both ends of Mary Neuner rd, a fence with gate between the park and the road and addition of disabled parking bays instead of some of the green areas so that blue badge holders are not parking on double yellow lines and forcing all traffic into one lane .</p>
6	<p>Very good idea. Will hopefully stop some road users dangerously speeding down Mary Neuner Road. Hopefully you will also ensure enforcement of the double yellow lines on the street - people park all over the carriageway and outside the allotted parking spaces, particularly at night, making the road one giant carpark and making use thereof incredibly difficult and dangerous.</p>
7	<p>Long overdue and welcome proposal from the council to install a zebra crossing on Mary Neuner Road. As a local resident (the building next to the proposed crossing) I wholeheartedly support the proposal.</p>
8	<p>Adding a zebra crossing can ensure the safety when residents walk through the road</p>
9	<p>I am all in favour and fully support the pedestrian crossing.</p> <p>However I think there two bigger issues on Mary Neuner Road are speeding and parking.</p> <p>Most weekends and some weekdays there are cars parked all along the road, all on the double yellows. They are parked on either side which narrows the road, basically turning it in to a single lane that causes traffic queuing and people unable to get through. Last weekend (6th and 7th Dec 2025) was particularly bad.</p> <p>Secondly speeding is a big issue down this road as it is long and straight and a lot of people see it as an opportunity to put their foot down. I would be worried that due to the position of the proposes pedestrian crossing near the bend in the road, people will speed round the corner and not have a lot of time to brake and stop if there is a pedestrian on the crossing.</p> <p>So yes, please can we have a pedestrian crossing, but can we also have proper parking enforcement and maybe speed traps/cameras. Thanks.</p>
