

APPENDIX C – DETAILED RESPONSES – ST ANN’S ROAD ZEBRA CROSSING PROPOSALS

Objections received:

	Objection Received	Officer Comment
1	I think that this could have been discussed when the North Gate Park development was in consultation. I don't think that it is a good idea. There is already a zebra crossing by Warwick Gardens. There is a pelican crossing further up St. Ann's Road by the Chestnuts Park entrance opposite the entrance to the development. It is too much for traffic on a busy East/West road. La Rose Lane is a quiet road and can be more easily crossed.	<p>The officer acknowledges the objectors’ comments. While formal crossing points are located to the east and west of the proposed zebra crossing, each is more than 120 metres from the site. The existing informal refuge island is already heavily used by pupils travelling to and from Chestnuts Primary School. In addition, one of the principal gates to the North Gate Park housing development will be positioned adjacent to the Tottenham Ambulance Station, which is expected to generate further pedestrian activity at this location. These factors provide clear justification for formalising the crossing into a zebra facility.</p> <p>St Ann’s Road is a B-classified route carrying approximately 6,000 vehicles per day in each direction. With the additional housing development in the area, there will be increased demand for safe pedestrian movement. A formal zebra crossing at this point will provide a safer, more controlled environment for pedestrians to cross this busy east–west corridor.</p>
