**Re: LICENSING ACT 2003:
OBJECTION NOTICE ON A TENS – RED CARPET BAR & RESTAURANT, 99 WEST GREEN ROAD, TOTTENHAM, LONDON N15 5DE**

On 23rd April 2026 the Licensing Authority received from you Janet Nyantakyi, a notification in respect of proposed temporary licensable activities due to take place on 14th to 17th May 2026 at Red Carpet Bar & Restaurant, 99 West Green Road, Tottenham, London N15 5DE. The licensing authority has received an objection under section 104(2) of the Licensing Act 2003 (“the Act”).

The objection which applies is indicated by an “X” in the following table.

You are reminded that under section 136 of the Licensing Act 2003, a person commits an offence if he carries on a licensable activity on or from any premises otherwise than under and in accordance with an authorisation; or if he knowingly allows a licensable activity to be so carried on. A person convicted of such an offence is liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to a fine not exceeding £20,000, or to both.

Please inform us immediately if you wish to appeal to the Licensing Sub Committee.

The Noise Nuisance and Licensing team have already submitted an objection representation for the applicant's full premises licence application, on the basis that the business was found selling alcohol without a Premises Licence on the 21st March 2026.

Due to this history of the non-compliance, we submit there is a likelihood that the operator will fail to comply with Temporary Event Notice conditions, which would undermine the prevention of public nuisance, the prevention of Crime and Disorder and public safety objectives.
