This application is made on the following grounds:

- Prevention of public nuisance.
- Prevention of crime and disorder.

The review is requested because of repeated excessive noise from amplified music and customers, disturbance during late-night and early morning hours, customers gathering outside the premises, alleged operation beyond licensed hours, and incidents of anti-social behaviour, including arguments and fights outside the venue.

I also have concerns regarding public safety following the street party held on 27–28 June, during which a large crowd blocked the public pavement, making access difficult for pedestrians and residents.

I am applying for a review of the premises licence because the operation of the nightclub is causing a public nuisance and is having a significant negative impact on my quality of life.

According to the licensing information published by the London Borough of Haringey, I believe the premises has been operating beyond its permitted licensed hours. The venue advertises that it operates until 4:00 am, whereas the published premises licence states that licensable activities are authorised only until 3:00 am. I have personally observed the premises continuing to operate beyond the licensed hours on multiple occasions.

The issues described began following a change in management/ownership of the premises earlier this year. Since this change, the frequency and severity of disturbances have significantly increased.

The premises regularly creates excessive noise late at night and into the early hours of the morning. Loud amplified music, heavy bass vibrations, and noise from customers entering and leaving the premises, as well as customers remaining in the porch area outside the club, regularly disturb my sleep and my family's sleep. These disturbances are frequent and have continued over a prolonged period.

We have also recently observed alcohol being sold and consumed in the front porch area of the premises, which did not occur under previous management. This has contributed to increased crowding, noise, and disorder outside the venue.

Customers often gather outside the premises shouting, talking loudly, laughing, smoking, and continuing their social activities after leaving the club. On a number of occasions there have also been arguments and fights, including incidents involving members of the club's security staff. This behaviour creates significant noise and disturbance, making it difficult to rest or enjoy my home.

On the weekend of 27–28 June, the club organised a street party on the public pavement outside the premises during the daytime. The event attracted a very large crowd, which completely blocked the pavement and made it difficult for me to access my home after returning from work. The event included a DJ with a full sound system, and alcohol was being sold outside the premises. The level of noise inside my flat was unacceptable. As the weather was approximately 30°C, it was not possible to keep the windows closed, making the disturbance even worse.

On the first day of the event, we spoke directly to the owner and explained the impact the noise was having on us. Our concerns were dismissed, and no action was taken to reduce the disturbance. The same situation occurred again the following day.

More recently, on 4 July, the nightclub remained open until approximately 4:30 am following a football match, and customers continued to gather outside the premises for a considerable time after the venue had closed. This caused further disturbance to nearby residents. I am also concerned as to whether the premises is authorised under its premises licence to broadcast live sporting events.

The disturbance has resulted in repeated sleep disruption on working days, difficulty concentrating, and inability to properly rest in my home during late-night hours.

The ongoing nuisance has caused repeated sleep disturbance, stress, and anxiety. It has significantly affected my ability to enjoy my home and has had a detrimental impact on my health and wellbeing.

We have raised our concerns with the owner on several occasions over a long period. While there were times when some improvements were made, more recently our

concerns have been ignored and the problems have continued. As the issues have continued despite raising them directly with the owner, I have now started reporting incidents of excessive noise and disturbance to the Council. I intend to continue reporting each occurrence and will keep a record of future incidents to assist the Licensing Authority in monitoring the ongoing impact of the premises on local residents.

This has left me with no alternative but to request a review of the premises licence. I believe the operation of the premises is failing to promote the licensing objective of the prevention of public nuisance. I respectfully ask the Licensing Authority to review the premises licence and consider whether additional conditions, reduced operating hours, improved sound insulation, stricter management of customers outside the premises, and effective measures to prevent noise and anti-social behaviour are necessary to protect local residents.
