Dear Licensing Team,

I am writing to object to the application for a premises licence at **Milcana Cafe Annexe, 50 Park Lane, Tottenham N17 0JS**.

As a neighbouring resident, I have serious concerns about the impact this application would have on the local community. I strongly believe that granting permission to sell alcohol until 11:00 pm every day would undermine the licensing objectives of preventing crime and disorder, preventing public nuisance, protecting public safety and protecting children from harm.

This location has already generated significant concern among local residents. Police have attended the premises on numerous occasions, and there has been a pattern of anti-social behaviour associated with people gathering there. These issues have affected the enjoyment of our homes and have left residents feeling less safe.

Last year, a serious stabbing incident occurred at the premises, demonstrating the risks associated with this location. While this incident was deeply concerning on its own, it forms part of a wider pattern of problems that residents have experienced over time.

There are also ongoing concerns within the neighbourhood that the premises is being used for gambling activities. This attracts groups of people who remain outside the premises for long periods, creating noise, disturbance and behaviour that is intimidating to nearby residents.

The area is home to families and is close to local schools. Children should not have to pass a premises where alcohol-related activity, anti-social behaviour and large gatherings have become a regular concern. Granting this licence would, in my opinion, increase these problems rather than resolve them.

I do not believe the applicant has demonstrated that the sale of alcohol at this premises can be managed in a way that adequately protects local residents or promotes the licensing objectives. Given the history of police attendance and community concerns, I respectfully ask the Licensing Sub-Committee to refuse this application.

Dear Licensing Team,

I am writing to make a formal representation against the application for a premises licence for **Milcana Cafe Annexe, 50 Park Lane, Tottenham, London N17 0JS**.

My name is **XXXXXX**, and I live at **XXXXXX**, directly next to the premises. I am objecting to this application because I believe granting this licence would undermine the licensing objectives of preventing crime and disorder, preventing public nuisance, protecting public safety, and protecting children from harm.

This premises has been associated with repeated police attendance due to incidents occurring at or around the cafe. There has been ongoing anti-social behaviour connected with the premises, causing significant disturbance to local residents. In addition, there was a serious stabbing incident at the cafe last year, which has caused considerable concern within the local community.

The premises is also widely known in the area for people gathering to gamble, which attracts groups of individuals and contributes to anti-social behaviour. This creates an intimidating environment for nearby residents and visitors.

I am particularly concerned that extending the premises to allow the sale of alcohol until 11:00 pm every day will worsen the existing problems. In my view, it is likely to increase noise, disorder, alcohol-related incidents and anti-social behaviour, affecting the safety and quality of life of those living nearby.

There are also schools in the vicinity, and I believe increasing alcohol availability at these premises is not in the best interests of local children and families. The area should remain safe and welcoming, particularly during times when children are travelling to and from school or using local facilities.

For these reasons, I respectfully ask the Licensing Sub-Committee to refuse this application or, if it is minded to grant a licence, to impose very strict conditions that adequately protect local residents and the wider community.

Dear Licensing Team,

I am writing to express my strongest possible objection to the premises licence application for **Milcana Cafe Annex** located at **50 Park Lane, Tottenham, London N17 0JS**. This establishment should under no circumstances be granted an alcohol licence.

1. Failure to Display Public Notice Correctly

The public notice for this application is not being displayed properly. It is taped directly onto the security shutters. Whenever the business is open during the day, the shutters are raised, completely hiding the notice from the public view. This obscures the application process from the local community.

2. Severe Anti-Social Behaviour & Illegal Activity

This location is already a major source of anti-social behaviour and public disruption, directly violating the licensing objectives regarding **Crime and Disorder, Public Nuisance**, and the **Protection of Children from Harm**:

- **Constant Drug Activity:** People gather around this business continuously smoking cannabis. Furthermore, my children and I have directly witnessed people outside inhaling gas (nitrous oxide) to get high during both the day and evening.
- **Disorder & Illegal Gambling:** There is constant shouting, disruptive behaviour, and ongoing card games and suspected illegal gambling taking place.
- **Threat to Local Families:** The constant presence of drug use, aggressive shouting, and anti-social behaviour makes the street unsafe. As a neighbor, I am genuinely scared to let my children go outside my own home.

Conclusion

Granting an alcohol licence to this establishment will only escalate these severe issues and further harm our neighbourhood. **This business should not be given a licence at all**, and I urge the Licensing Authority to refuse this application entirely.
