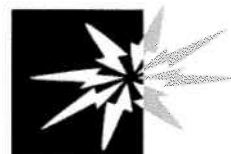

As part of the council's commitment to support local businesses throughout the borough, the council has undertaken a review of the existing pay and display restrictions in the area, which were originally introduced in June 2007.

To gauge the community's views on parking in the area council officers carried out hundreds of face-to-face surveys with traders, shoppers and residents in the area.

We have considered the feedback received from these surveys and have developed amendments with the intention to improve the scheme so it continues to work well for traders and visitors to the area. Our proposals consist of the following changes:

- Increase the Pay and Display periods to existing parking bays in the area particularly along Muswell Hill Broadway
- The removal of waiting and loading restrictions in several bays within the area
- Introduce more Pay and Display parking bays to the area within the main shopping areas
- Introduce double yellow lines at junctions where appropriate
- Introduce additional loading facilities in the area.

The attached plan outlines the changes to be made.

We are introducing the measures under an Experimental Traffic Management Order, as this will enable us to monitor the impact and consider amendments. The duration of an experimental order lasts no more than eighteen months and we will consider making measures permanent after a six month period.
