Councillor Pauline Gibson - Noel Park

Councillor John Bevan - Northumberland Park

The only area where street drinking is a problem is PARK LANE N17, AROUND ABOUT NUMBER 177 AREA and it is because of TERRANCE, see attached. From my observations the police do not seem able to resolve this particular issue / area problem.

I have not noticed any other problem areas. On match days I have not recently been out on the streets so cannot comment on this particular aspect.

Councillor Sheila Peacock - Northumberland Park

I support the controlled zone it is just with less police around to monitor what is the point? Sometimes on match days there are police from outside the area who do not stop street drinkers as they walk along. We do not seem now to have people sitting on walls and drinking like we used to so I think that the zone has been very effective only as I say when the police action the zones. With the cuts we will have less police on the streets, so what then?

Councillor Joe Goldberg - Seven Sisters

I continue to support the controlled drinking zone. I believe it to be effective and receive fewer complaints on the matter than I did 2 years ago.

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Councillor Bernice Vanier - Tottenham Green

Absolutely.

I am a resident of Greenfield Road which is in Tottenham Green Ward, directly across the road from Wickes, and I am directly affected by anti-social behaviour associated with alcohol early in the morning.

My view is that the alcohol control zone close to my home is not being enforced sufficiently. The men who gather to wait for work pick-ups every morning are often drinking from bottles and cans held inside brown paper bags. I have to clear up the empties from my front garden every day.

I do not detect any great improvement as a result of the alcohol control zone, because it is not visibly enforced.

I would like it to continue so that officers have the powers to warn or stop people drinking alcohol in the area, when there are around.

Councillor Nilgun Canver - St. Anne's
