

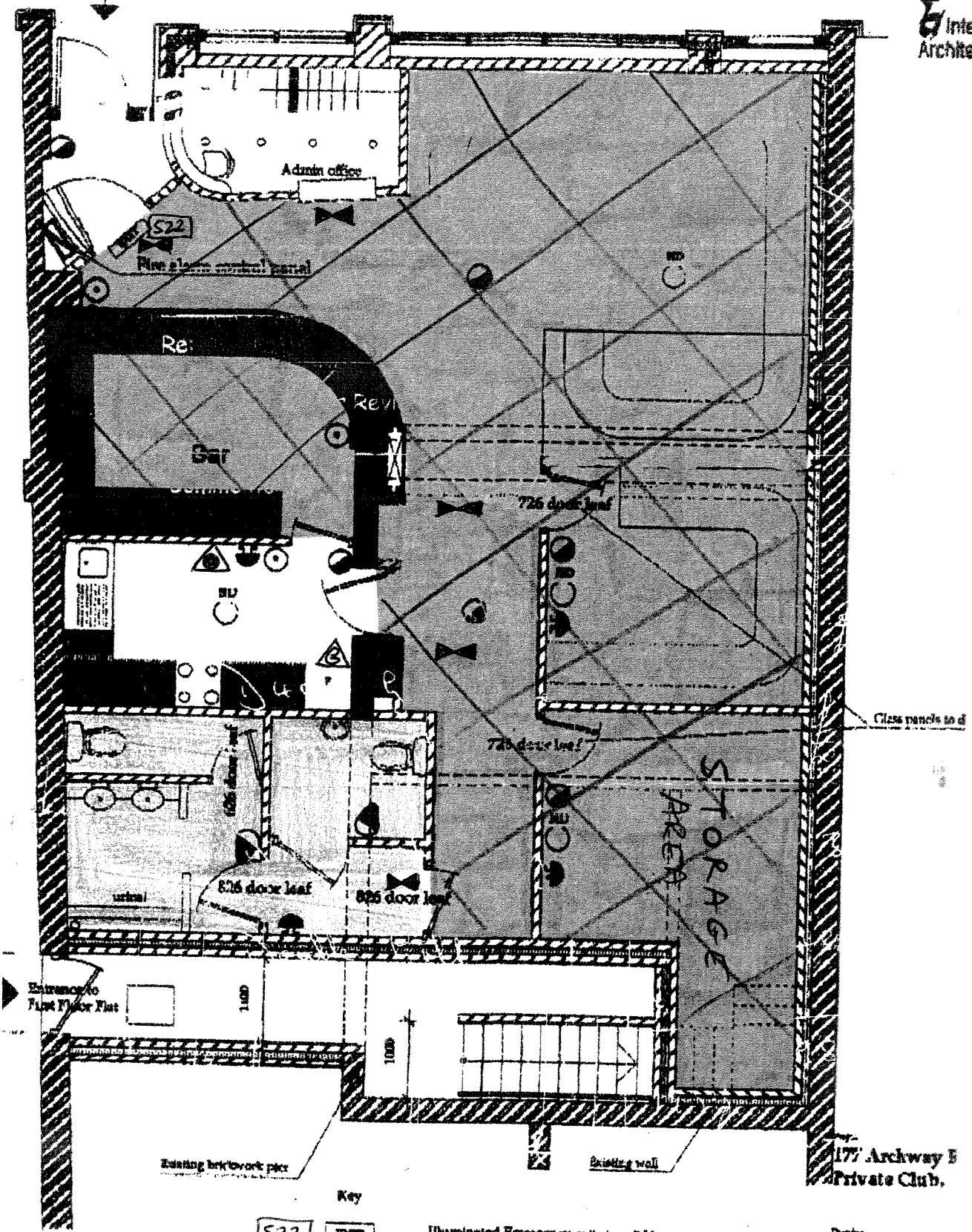

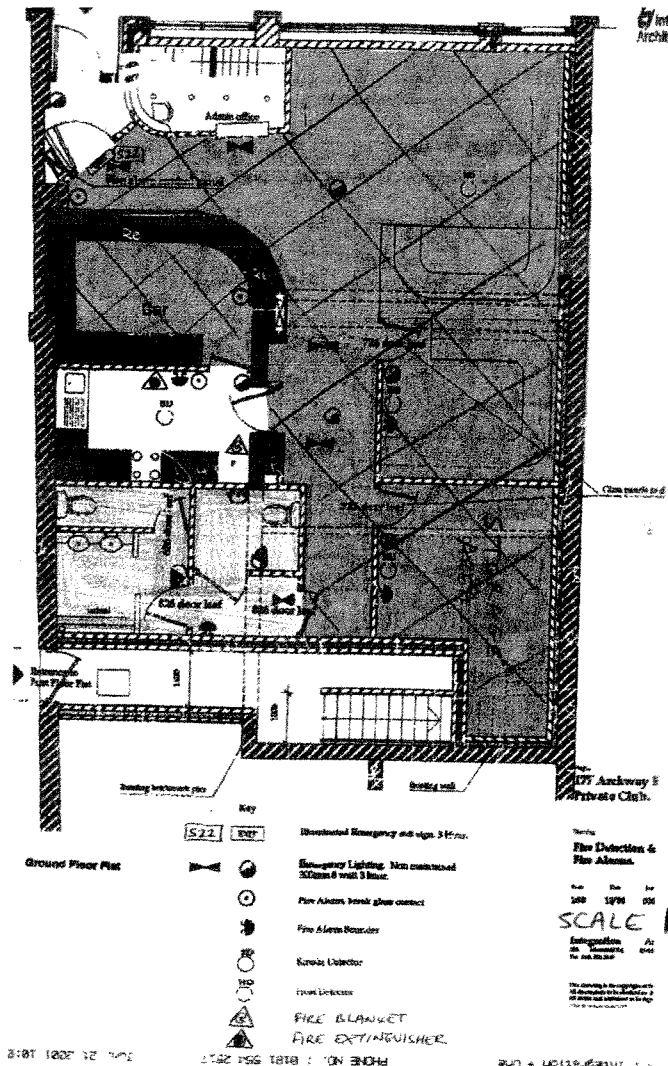

I am writing on behalf of the Cromwell Area Residents Association (CARA) with the following comments on this application

- This restaurant has not been trading to the public for over a year. It is currently being used as a kitchen to prepare food in the West End. Haringey EHO have asked for improvements to the inadequate food preparation arrangements and inadequate flue extract arrangements. This constitutes a public safety (health) threat and public nuisance (smells from inadequate extract)
- In the past the restaurant has been associated with alleged prostitution activities taking place in the adjacent flat. A number of people were arrested from this address. CARA has previously requested that evidence should be provided that there is no physical link between the accommodation and the restaurant. There is a potential criminal activity and threat to public disorder.
- This restaurant has no 'track record' of operation as a legitimate, open to the public, restaurant. Before its current use it seems to have operated a 'members only' kind of operation. CARA requires assurance that a legitimate restaurant is proposed and in operation before any consideration is given to a drinks entertainment music or extended license.
- The adjacent properties in Cromwell Avenue are all residential and already suffer from the noisy and anti social behaviour of patrons exiting the pubs and restaurants on Archway Road and travelling up Cromwell Avenue by foot and car. Another late licence and music licence with the penetrating sound of jazz instruments as advertised on the outside wall (see picture) will be too intrusive. There is potential public disorder.

In summary CARA recommends that this application is refused and an application be considered only when there is sufficient evidence that it is a properly managed and EHO approved restaurant and without any physical link to the adjacent flat.



- The adjacent properties in Cromwell Avenue are all residential and already suffer from the noisy and anti social behaviour of patrons exiting the pubs and restaurants on Archway Road and travelling up Cromwell Avenue by foot and car. Another late licence and music licence with the penetrating sound of jazz instruments as advertised on the outside wall (see picture) will be too intrusive. There is potential public disorder.

I urge you to please refuse this application.




We act for the applicants for a Premises Licence in respect of the above premises. We have received a copy of your representation objecting to the grant of this licence.
