





In response to and in support of residents, neighbourhood watch groups and resident's associations concerns, I am writing to you to oppose this application. There are a number of reasons why I feel this application should be refused:-

- 1. I believe that granting this licence would be against the general principles of Haringey's Licensing Policy and specifically with regard to the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety and the prevention of public nuisance.
- 2. This premises has repeated applied for and been refused permission for very late hours by the Planning Department on the grounds of loss of amenity to local residents and the surrounding area (including noise, disturbance, parking problems and of course refuse collection). I believe that all these reasons are still very much applicable and that permission should continue to be denied.
- 3. I believe that increasing the opening hours would lead to more anti-social behaviour and more crime.
- 4. Longer opening hours is likely to create noise nuisance to local residents and increase in the level of litter.
- 5. I feel that granting this application would set a precedent and lead to a flood of similar applications which would not be in the interest of the local area.

In conclusion I would urge the Licensing Sub-committee to reject this application and maintain the existing hours of 2am closing for Friday and Saturday nights.



1 INTRODUCTION

The Ladder Community Safety Partnership (LCSP) contains representatives of Neighbourhood Watches and Residents' Associations from the 'Ladder' roads, adjacent to Green Lanes, Harringay and from Green Lanes itself. We are an independent group, although working in partnership with Haringey Council and the Metropolitan Police where appropriate.

We are writing to you as members of the LCSP to oppose this application.

We believe that in the context of the well known problems in the area, granting a licence for the hours requested would be against the general principles of Haringey's Licencing Policy and specifically under the following headings:

- The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- **Public Safety**
- **Prevention of Public Nuisance**

More information on why we believe the Committee should reject this application is provided under appropriate headings below.

2 PLANNING CONSIDERATIONS

We fully understand that Licensing and Planning are deemed to be two separate but parallel regimes. However it is relevant to note that this premises has repeatedly sought planning permission for very late hours, which has been consistently refused by the Planning service on the grounds of loss of amenity to local residents and the surrounding area (eg noise, local disturbance, parking stress, refuse and rubbish collection etc). It is highly significant that these reasons for refusal under planning law are identical to the criteria for **the prevention of public nuisance** under the new licensing legislation.

Recent Planning history of the premises:

- in 2002, 05.00 daily was refused
- in 2004, 02.00 daily was refused (HGY/2004/1432)
- in 2005, 01.45 (Mon-Sat) and 01.00 (Sun) was refused (HGY/2005/0064)
- finally permission was granted on 8th March 2005 as follows
 09.00 -00.00 (Sun-Thurs) and 10.00-02.00 (Fri&Sat) (HGY/2005/0064, amended),
 (copy attached)

3 REASONS FOR OBJECTING

- (a) Relevant sections of the Borough's Licensing Policy/Objectives
 We believe the following statements in the Borough's Licensing Policy support our objections:
- 'the Council considers that licensing law plays a key role in both preventing and controlling ... anti-social behaviour ... by regulating and applying conditions to affect the number, location and hours of premises' [2.4]
- 'the council will have special regard to the local impact of licensing on related crime and disorder ... particularly when concerning location, impact, operation and management of all proposed licenses, applications, renewals and variations of conditions' [7.14]
- 'licensed premises, especially those operating late at night and in the early hours of the morning, can cause a wide range of nuisances that can impact on the people living, working or sleeping in the vicinity of the licensed premises. The Council is committed to protecting the residents in the vicinity of these licensed premises.' [13.1]
- 'in particular, late night activities cause much of this nuisance. Late night cafes ... can have a number of adverse effects on the residents in the vicinity of these premises. Nuisance such as noise, litter, anti-social behaviour, lights and odour all contribute to the loss of amenity to the general public' [13.2]
- 'the potential for additional crime and disorder and/or public muisance is increased with longer hours.' [18.1]
- 'operating hours between 23.00 and 07.00 are considered to give greater potential for

(b) Licensing Hours

In the light of the above statements, we believe that in this case extending thehours until 04.00am on Friday and Saturday nights is totally unreasonable and contrary to the principles of the Borough's Licensing Policy and to the key Licensing Objectives.

We believe that granting of a permanent weekend licence for 20 hour opening is an unreasonable proposition, given the location of the premises in the heart of one of the most densely populated residential areas in the borough.

(c) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

We have seen the brief comments relating to the prevention of crime and disorder put forward by the applicant. These seem inadequate and residents would also like to highlight the following points:

- has the use of CCTV to prevent crime and disorder been considered?
- are there policies/methods to deal with the arrival of intoxicated patrons and/or persons under the influence of illegal drugs?
- are patrons prevented from drinking alcohol brought onto the premises?
- are there procedures to deal with violence and anti-social behaviour?
- what methods are in place to discourage the handling of stolen goods etc?
- what methods are in place to address prostitution at the premises? (a particular problem on Green Lanes: Met. Police Taskforce 4 reported to the Green Lanes Strategy Group on 8 Sept 2005 that this was currently a serious concern with 5 prostitutes cautioned during the previous week)

(d) Public Safety

We are pleased to note that the applicant states that 'appropriate fire safety proceedures are in place, including fire extinguishers'. However there is a need for greater clarification regarding various aspects of Public Safety as set out in Appendix 2(2) of the Licensing Policy:

- fire safety risk assessment?
- compliance with all relevant building control rules and regulations?
- arrangements for emergency situations, including evacuation?
- arrangement for the management, supervision and training of staff to ensure that these measures are known and implemented?

(e) Prevention of Public Nuisance

We welcome the statements made by the applicant regarding the prevention of public nuisance. However, some further questions remain unanswered, in particular:

 more detail regarding the steps taken, or proposed, to prevent disturbances by customers arriving at, or leaving, the premises? (the Policy states that 'there will be greater responsibilities placed on premises operating between 23.00 and 07.00 than at other times of the day')

- the actions necessary to prevent disturbance from deliveries or collections at early or late hours, or staff cleaning up after closing time?
- the steps taken, or proposed, to prevent littering and fouling of public and open spaces what specific measures are proposed by the business? This is particularly important as the premises also advertises a take-away service
- the arrangement for storage and disposal of trade waste would the very long hours sought by the applicant lead to increased waste storage and disposal problems?
- the arrangements for cleansing and keeping clean the vicinity of the premises this will
 include litter, refuse and other items originating from the premises and fouling caused
 by customers.

The Borough's Licensing Policy points out the special importance of these issues after 23.00 and in residential areas. (See Appendix 2(3) and 13.2).

3. CONCLUSION

We believe that the above points need to be clarified by the Licensing Committee and clearly specified in any licence granted

Our comments and objections obviously make clear that residents, who are supported by all of our Ward Councillors, are very concerned at the possible implications of a 20 hour licence at weekends for these premises. We would therefore urge the Licensing Sub-committee to reject this application and to maintain the existing hours of 2am closure for Friday and Saturday nights. This is necessary in order to uphold two of the key licensing objectives: the prevention of public nuisance and the prevention of crime and disorder.

With reference to the above planning application I am writing to inform you that after taking into consideration relevant planning policies and the comments of local residents the Council has on08/03/2005, GRANTED planning permission subject to the following condition:

1. A suitable soundproofing scheme to provide effective resistance to the transmission of airbourne and impact sound shall be submitted to, approved in writing by, and implemented in accordance with the requirements of the Local Planning Authority for all compartment floors and party walls prior to the operation of the approved extension of hours.

Reason: In order to ensure that the proposed conversion does not give rise to an unacceptable loss of amenity for occupiers within the property as a direct result of inadequate soundproofing.

REASONS FOR APPROVAL

It is considered that the extension of hours proposed in relation to this application is reasonable and should not unduly affect the amenities of the locality or the existing occupiers. Accordingly it is considered to comply with the following policies STC 2.4 'A3 Uses Food and Drink', DES 1.9 'Privacy and amenity of neighbours' and RIM 3.3 'Nuisance from existing uses and road traffic'. The application is therefore recommended for approval.
