## **Early Years Foundation Stage**

Results in 2011 have improved considerably in all areas of the Foundation Stage. In Personal Social and Emotional development (PSE) Haringey results improved by 11% to 75% achieving 6 or more in all 3 scales comprising PSE. Results in Communication Language and Literacy (CLL) improved by 12% to 58%. PSE and CLL combined improved by 12% to 54%. Mathematical Development improved by 9% to 69%.

The percentage of children achieving at least 78 points and 6+ in all PSE and CLL improved by 12% to 54%.

The overall local authority gap between the median score and the lowest 20% of children improved by decreasing from 36.2% to 32.0%

### **Haringey and National FSP trends**

The table below shows the 3 year trend for the main components of the Foundation Stage. It shows that results in Haringey have improved significantly across all areas in 2011.


### Results for ethnic groups in Haringey


The table below shows the variations between the different ethnic groups in Haringey for the main areas of the Foundation Stage, that is PSE and CLL combined.

The data shows significant differences in attainment for the ethnic groups. 71% of White British children are scoring 6 or more in PSE&CLL, compared to 52% of Caribbean, 30% Kurdish, 35% Turkish and 40% Somali children. There are also significant differences between boys and girls. Care needs to be taken with some of the data where the numbers are small. There is also the issue of different rates of maturation, particularly for such a young group of children.

The map below shows the percentage of children attaining PSE and CLL combined across the Haringey wards. It is interesting to compare this map with the one below which shows the Income Deprivation affecting Children Index 2010 (IDACI). The Early Years Foundation Stage map shows how results in the least deprived wards are significantly higher than results in the most deprived wards.





## Summary of PSE & CLL with Income Deprivation affecting Children Index (IDACI)

The table shows how the results in PSE & CLL improve fro children living in the least deprived areas in Haringey. Forty nine percent of pupils living in the top 10% most deprived super output areas in Haringey attained PSE & CLL compared with 72% who live in the least deprived areas.

It is also interesting to note that 1788 children (60% of the Early Years cohort) live in the 10% most deprived areas.

### **Key Stage 2**

The KS2 2010 results were affected by the national boycott. The results published by the DFE for Haringey in 2010 were based on 18 mainstream schools out of 53. This gave Haringey a combined English and maths results of 75%, a 7% increase on the 2009 result. It is sensible to miss out the 2010 results when looking at the Haringey trend.

#### There was no boycott of the 2011 tests.

The results for 2011 are provisional. The DFE have published the results for Level 4+ combined English and maths at 69%. This result is expected to rise to between 70 – 71% when the validated results are published in December 2011.

## KS2 combined English and maths level 4+ with ethnicity

The table shows the variations in attainment across the ethnic groups and between boys and girls. Eighty six percent of White British pupils attain combined English and maths 4+ compared to 64% of Caribbean, 54% of Turkish and 49% of Congolese pupils. Only 1 traveller child out of 12 was successful at this level.

The number of looked after children is fairly small so percentages can vary significantly over the years. The Haringey trend has been fairly consistent at or above the national results for this group of pupils.




In combined English and maths L4+ (since 2008), African pupils results have improved by 10% and are currently 2% below their national peers in 2010, African-Caribbean results have improved by 8% (and currently 2% below national peers), Kurdish by 31% and Turkish pupils by 10%. White UK pupils have improved by 2% (currently 12% above national peers).

### GCSE provisional results for 2011

The provisional results for GCSE have seen a very impressive improvement in the percentage of pupils achieving  $5+A^*-C$  (inc English and maths) from 48% to 57%. This figure should take it very close to the result for England (not currently available). The percentage achieving  $5+A^*-C$  has also improved from 73% to 76%.

Many schools have made significant improvements in their results.




The map below shows the variation in the percentage of pupils achieving  $5+A^*-C$  (including English and maths) across the wards.
