Hi Kendra

I have spoken with Sgt Clay-Michael, St Ann's SNT, about his views on this application and visited the venue with Sgt Davies. During our visit we spoke with the licensee of the restaurant next door regarding his concerns about the access gate at the rear of his venue which are reflected by Sgt Clay-Michael. Licensee states he often finds used condoms in the alley in the mornings and that allowing this application would leave the alley insecure at night thus allowing prostitutes to enter. As he is finding condoms each morning before this application is approved it would suggest the gate is not being locked at night at present. The gate may also be a fire exit. I have therefore made Representations regarding this entry point along with CCTV requirements and have attached them. I feel this gate should be secured at night to prevent access by prostitutes and drug users and that the landlord / venue licensees could enable this as stated in my Reps.

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POLICE REPRESENTATION

I wish to make representation on the following:

- Prevention of crime and disorder

If this application were granted in full or part, I would recommend the following alterations be made to the licence conditions. I also suggest that additional conditions be attached to the licence, as set out below, to further promote the licensing objectives.

	Current Conditions	Recommendation
1	CCTV System will be installed.	<p>A digital CCTV system to be installed in the premises.</p> <p>Cameras must be sited to observe the entrance doors from the inside.</p> <p>Cameras on the entrances must capture full frame shots of the heads and shoulders of all people entering the premises i.e. capable of identification.</p> <p>Provide a linked record of the date, time, and place of any image.</p> <p>Provide good quality images - colour during opening times.</p>

2		<p>Have a monitor to review images and recorded quality.</p> <p>Be regularly maintained to ensure continuous quality of image capture and retention.</p> <p>Staff trained in operating CCTV.</p> <p>Digital images must be kept for 31 days. The equipment must have a suitable export method, e.g. CD/DVD writer so that Police can make an evidential copy of the data they require. Copies must be available within a reasonable time to Police on request.</p> <p>This venue's access point from the street is via an alley controlled by a 6' metal gate. It is known that prostitutes and drug users use this alley at night leaving behind debris therefore the gate needs to be shut. As this is the only exit from the rear for a neighbouring late night venue then it could well be considered a fire exit and therefore should not be locked until all venues using the exit have closed. This could be overcome by fitting a release mechanism inside the gate enabling exit from inside when gate is locked. When a decision regarding fire regulations is reached regarding this exit point, should it require</p>
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			applicant to ensue it is secured at the end of his licensed hours then he must do so.
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If these conditions were accepted in full I would withdraw my representation.
