Area Committee Report: Highways, Parking and Transportation issues in the Alexandra, Fortis Green, Highgate and Muswell Hill Area.

1.0 Background

- 1.1 At the 27 June Muswell Hill, Alexandra, Fortis Green and Highgate Area Committee a report was presented by the Chair highlighting issues raised over the years by the community and Ward Councillors. The Committee requested the Council to identify as many schemes as possible that could be progressed. See appendix 1 for a copy of the report.
- 1.2 The chair requested an officer to report back to the 13 September Area Committee

2.0 Local Implementation Plan (LIP) funding

- 2.1 LIP funding is provided by Transport for London (TfL) and in recent years they have changed the way in which funding is allocated. We are now required to submit a three year Delivery Plan and TfL confirm the level of funding that will be made available during this period. This enables boroughs to develop more detailed programmes that can be delivered over the three year period. The current plan runs from April 2011 to March 2014 and sets out our priorities for this period. We are still however required to submit confirmation of our yearly programme to TfL on a yearly basis. A report is being presented to Cabinet on 18 September setting out the proposals for the next year of LIP schemes (2013/14).
- 2.2 This new format provides boroughs with greater control in choosing their priorities, as opposed to allocating funding to specific programmes such as, 20mph Zones, Local Safety Schemes, Cycling, Walking, and Safer Routes to Schools etc. Greater emphasis is now given to looking holistically at areas to develop packages of measures to address various identified traffic and transport issues. Our 'Corridors' and 'Neighbourhoods' programmes, where the Corridor is the main road through an area and the Neighbourhood is the residential area, is focused on this approach. We have developed a way of prioritising the selection of neighbourhoods in need, by carrying out an assessment using a number of factors including walking routes, cycling routes, road casualties, defined employment areas, town centres and regeneration areas. Currently we are delivering "Community Streets" projects in the Hornsey Heart and Green Lanes, Harringay neighbourhoods.

- 2.3 We also have a Smarter Travel programme aimed at encouraging sustainable travel and road safety through education, promotion and travel planning. Our Neighbourhoods programme works in tandem with the Smarter Travel programme to ensure that measures delivered have benefits to encourage and promote sustainable travel.
- 2.4 We do however acknowledge the importance of road safety and the need to improve perceived as well as identified accident locations. We therefore allocate a small budget through the LIP and internal Council funding for our Local Safety Schemes programme. This budget is mainly prioritised to reducing actual personal injury accidents and is measured against their economic benefit calculated from a first year rate of return in accident savings to justify the expenditure of the scheme. Each year we undertake an assessment of the road traffic accidents in the Borough that have occurred over the preceding three years period. From this we identify a prioritised list of locations based on accident severity and frequency. The list is refined to take into consideration the funding available as well as locations that have received funding within the past three years and those locations that form part of other programmes. This is then presented to the Cabinet Member for the Environment for approval on a yearly basis.
- 2.5 A small amount of our Local Safety Schemes budget is however also utilised to addressing perceived accident locations to assist in encouraging sustainable travel, particularly in the vicinity of schools. As this budget is limited we cannot address all the issues identified from the public or Ward Councillors. We do however keep a record of all requests made and review them each year to prioritise what can be delivered through the available budget.
- 2.6 Consultation for the development of the 2014 -17 Delivery Plan will commence in April 2013 for submission in September 2013. The various Area Committees will have the opportunity to identify their priorities for consideration based on the list of issued identified through the recently submitted Area Based Plans.

3.0 Officers response to the issues highlighted

3.1 Please see table below providing officer's responses to the issues highlighted in the presented report.
