





## a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e) (please read guidance note 9)

Following an assessment of the premises and its surrounding area the following is proposed: 30 minutes drinking up time will allow appropriate dispersal, use of lavatories etc. In order to further the licensing objectives the licensee reserves the right to move the Fire appliances, cigarette machines and any other similar objects temporarily in a fixed location which may impact on the ability of individuals on the premises to use exits or escape routes without impact.Good

#### b) The prevention of crime and disorder

There will be no promotions that encourage illegal or irresponsible or immoderate consumtion of alcohol. no open vessals to leave the premises.

CCTV to be recorded and a bank of 31 days tapes to be held, and produced on demand from a police officer.

Alarm fitted to the premises, and metal shutter also fitted to the front entrance.

Zero tollarance to controlled substance's on the premises, any person found in possesion of a suspected controlled drug will be reported to the Police.



#### 1 INTRODUCTION

The Ladder Community Safety Partnership (LCSP) contains representatives of Neighbourhood Watches and Residents' Associations from the 'Ladder' roads, adjacent to Green Lanes, Harringay, and from Wightman Road and Green Lanes itself. We are an independent group, although working in partnership with Haringey Council and the Metropolitan Police where appropriate.

We are writing to you as members of the LCSP to oppose this application.

We believe that in the context of the well known problems in the area, coupled with high-density residential accommodation, granting a licence for the hours requested would be against the general principles of Haringey's Licencing Policy and specifically under the following headings:

- The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- **Public Safety**
- **Prevention of Public Nuisance**

We are concerned that the applicant has only addressed these key issues in a limited way in his application which could indicate a lack of understanding and/or commitment to their importance, particularly given the record of compliance associated with this premises.

More information on why we believe the Committee should reject this application is provided under appropriate headings below.

#### 2 PLANNING CONSIDERATIONS: PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

At the time of writing, we believe that the premises lacks not only planning permission for the licensing hours requested, but even for the use of the premises itself as a snooker club. An application for retrospective change of use to a snooker club was made in 2004, but was refused on 12 November 2004 (HGY/2004/1299). The reasons for this refusal included UDP policies DES1.9 (Privacy and Amenity of Neighbours) and RIM3.2 (Pollution and Nuisance from New Development). These policies seek to prevent public nuisance (noise, local disturbance, parking stress, rubbish generation etc) in the same way as the key Licensing Objective of the same name. (Copy of Planning Decision attached)

#### 3 REASONS FOR OBJECTING

- (a) Relevant sections of the Borough's Licensing Policy/Objectives
  We believe the following statements in the Borough's Licensing Policy support our objections:
- 'the Council considers that licensing law plays a key role in both preventing and controlling ... anti-social behaviour ... by regulating and applying conditions to affect the number, location and hours of premises' [2.4]
- 'the council will have special regard to the local impact of licensing on related crime and disorder ... particularly when concerning location, impact, operation and management of all proposed licenses, applications, renewals and variations of conditions' [7.14]
- 'licensed premises, especially those operating late at night and in the early hours of the morning, can cause a wide range of nuisances that can impact on the people living, working or sleeping in the vicinity of the licensed premises. The Council is committed to protecting the residents in the vicinity of these licensed premises.'
  [13.1]
- 'in particular, late night activities cause much of this nuisance. Late night cafes ... can have a number of adverse effects on the residents in the vicinity of these premises.

  Nuisance such as noise, litter, anti-social behaviour, lights and odour all contribute to the loss of amenity to the general public' [13.2]
- 'the potential for additional crime and disorder and/or public nuisance is increased with longer hours.' [18.1]
- 'operating hours between 23.00 and 07.00 are considered to give greater potential for

#### (b) Licensing Hours and Alcohol Licence

We believe that granting a permanent licence for such late hours as 02.30 seven days a week is an unreasonable proposition, given the location of the premises in the heart of one of the most densely populated residential areas in the borough. There are numerous flats adjacent to and above the premises in Green Lanes, while residents in Allison Road are also extremely close.

The LCSP understands that each application must be decided on its own merits; however we would point out that there are currently no licenced premises in Harringay Green Lanes regularly open until 2.30am throughout the week. All previous applications for such late hours have been refused by Licensing Sub-Committees, on the grounds of prevention of crime and disorder and prevention of public nuisance. We firmly believe that the same arguments apply in this case, too, the more so given the track record of this premises, which gives us particular concerns about the supply of alcohol both on and off the premises.

Previous refusals of very late hours in Green Lanes are as follows:

- (1) Salisbury Public House refused 3am Lic.Sub Cttee C 04.10.05
- (2) 403 Green Lanes late night café refused 5am Lic.Sub Cttee E 18.04.05
- (3) 429 Green Lanes late night café refused 4am Lic.Sub Cttee A04.07.06
- (4) 657 Green Lanes late night entertainment licence venue. refused 3am weekdays, 4am weekends Special Lic.Sub Cttee 08.08.06
- (5) 1 Grand Parade, Green Lanes late night café refused 5am Lic.Sub Cttee E 03.10.06

Most relevant of all is the case of

(6) 1-9 Salisbury Promenade, Green Lanes (Harringay Snooker Club) heard by Lic.Sub Cttee A 26.07.05. This premises is almost directly opposite that of the present applicant. It was granted opening hours only until 12 midnight (Sun-Thurs) and 2am (Fri-Sat), with all sales of alcohol to cease 30 minutes before closing.

#### (c) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

We have seen the comments relating to the prevention of crime and disorder put forward by the applicant (which we strongly support) However, given the very late hours requested for both opening and drinking, residents would like to highlight the following questions, drawn from App.2 of the borough's Licensing Policy Guidances:

- what will be done to promote safer drinking?
- will door supervisors be used at/in the premises?
- procedures to deal with violence and/or anti-social behaviour?
- methods to discourage the handling and distribution of stolen goods etc?
- methods to address prostitution at the premises? (a particular problem on Green Lanes: Met. Police Taskforce 4 reported to the Green Lanes Strategy Group on 8 Sept

2005 that this was currently a serious concern with 5 prostitutes cautioned during the previous week. Further incidents have occurred in 2006).

#### (d) Public Safety

We assume that all staff would be trained to ensure that all safety measures are known and implemented, especially for emergency situations such as evacuation. We also assume that the premises is compliant with all relevant building control rules and regulations.

#### (e) Prevention of Public Nuisance

The only comment from the applicant refers to 'customers requested to leave the premises in a quiet and orderly manner'. There are therefore a large number of questions remaining unanswered, in particular:

- the steps taken, or proposed, by the applicant to prevent noise or vibration escaping from the premises (whether music, ventilation equipment or human voices)? The Licensing Policy states that this is 'particularly important in residential areas'.
- the actions necessary to prevent disturbance from deliveries or collections at early or late hours, or staff cleaning up after closing time?
- the steps taken, or proposed, to prevent littering and fouling of public and open spaces what specific measures are proposed by the business?
- the arrangement for storage and disposal of trade waste would the very long hours sought by the applicant lead to increased waste storage and disposal problems?
- the arrangements for cleansing and keeping clean the vicinity of the premises this will include litter, refuse and other items originating from the premises and fouling caused by customers.
- the steps taken, or proposed, by the applicant to prevent disturbances by customers arriving at or leaving the premises?
- what proposals have been made, or are proposed, for parking by customers and what effect will this have on local residents?
- in the event of customers using taxis or mini-cabs, what measures have been taken by the applicants to prevent disturbance to local residents?

The Borough's Licensing Policy points out the special importance of the above issues after 23.00 and in residential areas. (See Appendix 2(3) and 13.2).

#### (f) Record of Compliance

Throughout the Operating Schedule of the Council's Licensing Policy there are references to the importance of the record of compliance 'particularly where statutory or warning notices have been served'. In the case of this premises, there is already a serious history of lack of compliance.

- (1) In 2004, the premises was found to be open without planning permission as a social/snooker club. The club was requested to make a retrospective planning application for change of use, which it did, from residential to snooker club. As already noted, this was refused on 12 November 2004.
- (2) On 3 June 2004, police and LBH officers seized and destroyed three unauthorised

- gaming machines from the premises. The contents of the machines was also seized and the manager of the club was reported for the offence of operating unlicensed gaming machines.
- (3) Despite the planning refusal, the club continued to operate and enforcement and stop notices were issued on 13 December 2004.
- (4) The use briefly stopped, but then restarted in 2005, following which LBH has been planning prosecution for non-compliance.

In the light of this repeated, consistent and still continuing lack of compliance over a number of years, we have serious objections to the present application

#### 4. CONCLUSION

We believe that the above points should be given due weight by the Licensing Sub-committee and that appropriate conditions should be specified if any licence were to be granted.

We firmly believe that the proposed combination of very late hours and the supply of alcohol, for consumption both on and off the premises, are totally unacceptable in the heart of our residential community. We further believe that the potential for noise nuisance and anti-social behaviour and crime are far too great for this application to be approved given the poor record of compliance noted above.
