Prior to making this application, we have had regard to the boroughs licensing policy, along with the Section 182 guidance and the Licensing Act 2003.

The standard practices listed below will be maintained at all times. All reasonable steps will be taken to ensure that the premises will have a positive impact upon the local environment and its residents at all times.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

CCTV system shall be installed and maintained at all times. Recordings will be kept securely for a minimum of 31 days and made available to police on request.

Notices shall be clearly displayed at all times advising customers that CCTV is in operation.

Red card or similar panic alarm system to be installed and maintained at all times.

The applicant will take all reasonable steps to ensure that crime and/or disorder does not occur on the premises.

Any incidences of a criminal nature that may occur on the premises will be reported to the Police.

c) Public safety

Appropriate fire safety procedures are in place including fire extinguishers (H2O and CO2), internally illuminated fire exit signs, a smoke detector and emergency lighting.

All emergency exits will remain clearly marked at all times.

Emergency escape routes will be kept free of obstruction at all times.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

All customers are asked to respect neighbours and leave quietly. Notices will clearly displayed reminding customers to leave quietly.

e) The protection of children from harm

Clear and prominent notices to be displayed reminding customers that alcohol cannot be served to persons under the age of 18.

All members of staff at the premises shall seek credible photographic proof of age evidence from any person who appears to be under the age of 18 years and who is seeking to purchase alcohol. Such credible evidence, which shall include a photograph of the customer, will either be a passport, photographic driving licence, or Proof of Age card carrying a "PASS" logo.

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

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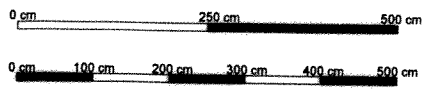
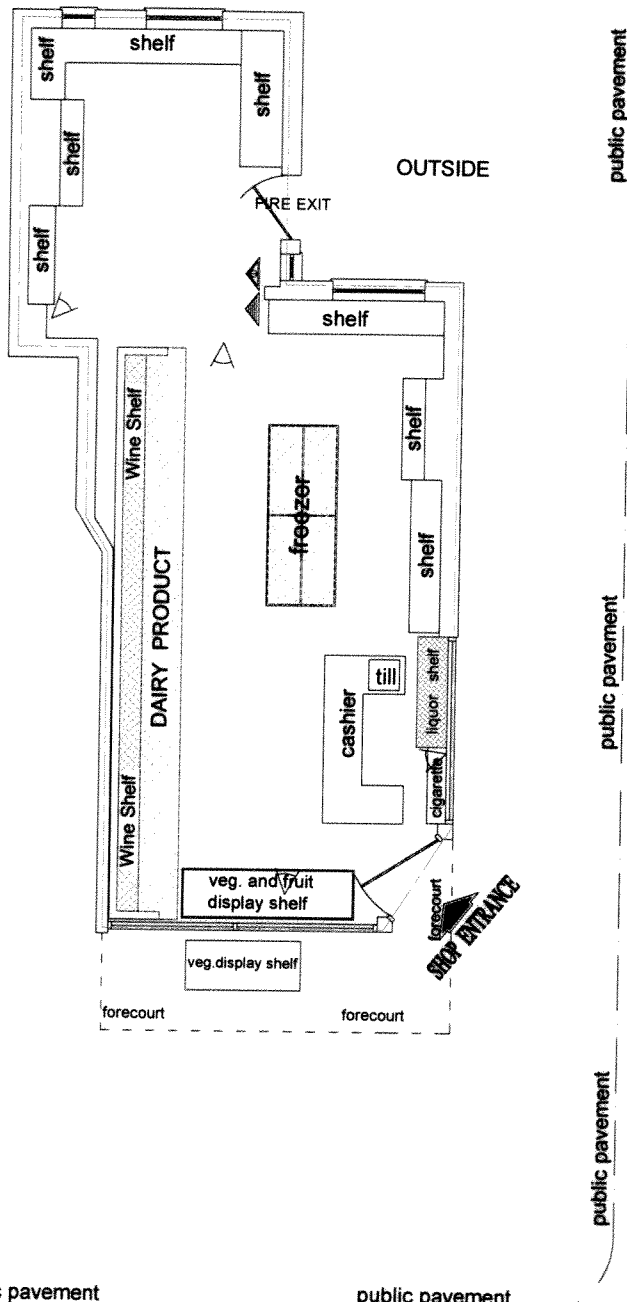

Hello, Myself and other officers attended the 'Polski' shop today which is located on Wargrove Avenue N15 on the junction with High Road, N15. We attended this premises with Kelly a member of the concil enforcement agency due to many complaints from local residents regarding problems associated with this shop. Mainly commercial type waste which has not been disposed of from this shop and his other shop 4 doors away due to the fact the owner has not renewed his waste contract, resulting in a 2 month build up. As you can imagine this has been attracting rats and all sorts to the area which the residents are not happy about.

The problem we have now is that the owner is applying for a licence to sell alcohol from these premises, we would like to strongly oppose this as the residents in the area are having endless problems with members of the Polish community who are constantly drunk after buying alcohol throughout the day from his off licence 4 doors away. The anti social behaviour they have been displaying are that they have been found urinating in residents gardens and have also been found asleep on residents door steps. This is believed to be directly the result of the owner of the two shops selling alcohol to these people.

I have been told to contact you regarding this problem and if there is anyway we can stop the owner of the premises in question obtaining an alcohol licence it would be very much appreciated.

I write with reference to the above mentioned premises, who have applied for a licence to sell alcohol.

This shop has many notices in the window in Polish therefore the small notice re the licence has not been noticed or responded to by the English speaking shop keeper or residents in the area.

We have at least the nearest approx twelve outlets within a five minute walking distance, selling alcohol, the last licence given to 76. High Rd. Seven Brothers

At the moment we have a great increase in Anti Social Behaviour, one of the main priorities of our local Police team being Alcohol mis use. Since the relaxation of drink licencing laws, and the influx of the Polish in this area we have had to endure constant drunken behaviour, the avenue around footgore used as urinals, a place to be sick, to spit or just lie blind drunk on the pavements, to throw empty or half filled bottles or cans to congregate in groups with drinks, drugs & cig's etc for hours on end disturbing and frightening the local residents.

Our area has become a no go area for any decent people. Therefore I request that no further licences be granted
