

The Prevention of Public Nuisance:

1. My flat's location.

My flat is located on the first floor of No. 26 Avenue Rd. It is adjacent to both the tennis courts and the path leading to them and a short distance from the clubhouse itself. I am, therefore, particularly "vulnerable" to the noise and other kinds of nuisance generated by the tennis club's activities.

2. Experience from the past.

The club has hosted music and dancing events in the past. All of them lasted well after midnight. Evidently, the club found it difficult (or was unwilling) to contain the

duration of these events within the prescribed time limits. The noise generated, in the early hours of the morning, by very loud music, and people's laughter and loud conversation was very annoying indeed. There was no question of anybody being able to sleep.

3. The club's application for an extension of its license.

An extension of the club's license that will enable it to host music and dancing events every weekend is unacceptable. It will compound the noise problem and, still worse, it will transform it into a regular occurrence. The entire neighbourhood will have to learn to anticipate it with dread. Furthermore, the resulting traffic as well as the fact that strong lights (inevitably reflected into our bedrooms) would have to be kept on late at night will increase the degree of nuisance. And there is no guarantee that any limitations imposed by the terms of the new license will be upheld.

4. A reasonable compromise.

A new license with extended drinking hours and permission for music on all Saturdays, will increase public nuisance to an unacceptable level. A mutually acceptable compromise could be the following:

- The club should be allowed to hold live or recorded music events ONE Saturday per month only.
- They should continue to apply, on a case by case basis, for a limited number of additional events, as they do now.
- There should be an explicit and credible commitment by the club that in all such events drinking and music will cease by 11.30 pm and that its premises will be vacated by midnight.

This is not the first time the tennis club has tried to pursue its, rather grandiose, ambitions with scant consideration to other people's concerns. I am afraid that a new, extended license will encourage them to ask for more. Indeed, I am sure there is more to come.

As far as I am concerned I have to say this: I have chosen a flat situated in a peaceful, almost idyllic environment. If I wanted a property with a night club right next door to it, I would have bought one. It is unfair to have a night club forced down my throat after so many years.

I am writing to you with regard to an application by Coolhurst Lawn Tennis and Rackets Club, Courtside, Coolhurst Road, N8 8EY, for a variation of the terms of a Club Premises Certificate granted under the Licensing Act 2003.


According to a notice which has been displayed in the vicinity, the Club is seeking to extend by one hour the permitted time for the supply of alcohol on Saturdays throughout the year and on February 14, October 31 and November 5 and for up to 30 minutes' "drinking-up" time to be allowed for the consumption of alcohol served during permitted hours.

As the occupier of a flat at Brook Lodge, Coolhurst Road, immediately adjacent to Courtside, I am asking for this application not to be granted.

Any extension of the terms of the Club's licence will inevitably cause further damage to the amentities of residents of Brook Lodge and Courtside who already have to suffer considerable traffic and noise nuisance every week of the year, quite apart from the frequent intrusions by club members into Brook Lodge residents' car park, which the club management seem unable or unwilling to prevent. Any extension of permitted hours will mean more traffic noise even later at night than at present.

For historical reasons, going back a century or so, Coolhurst Tennis Club is still called a club but, of course, it is a business, operated on commercial lines, and the members are, in fact, its customers. Understandably, the management are keen to increase trade, but for the sake of the local residents I ask that this application be not granted.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance:

I live adjacent to the club car park with my two children 4 and 7. Their bedrooms are situated at the front of the house and their sleep is often disturbed by members talking (and shouting) as they leave the club bar late at night, as well as by the noise of cars leaving the car park.

Since I moved to the house three years ago there has been a noticeable increase of activity at the club both during the day and at night which has led to problems with parking and general safety for pedestrians, including my children, as members arrive at and leave the club during the day and at night.

The club is situated in a completely residential area. Please see the attached noise map which clearly shows this as well as how quiet it is. Whilst I anticipated some disturbance from the car park I did not anticipate disturbance from members late at night. The club is a sporting facility, not a drinking and late night entertainment facility.

I am very concerned that a late licence on Saturday nights with permission for live music will exacerbate the existing problems. I am also concerned that the club will be open to non members for these late night activities as at present there is no system for checking membership when you go into the club bar. I feel very strongly that the club should be able to have an occasional function late in the evening for their members but that the extension they are asking for goes beyond this. Their existing licence allows them to have an extension of their licence at least once a month and the club have given residents no reasons as to why they need more despite repeated request for this information.



I am a resident of Coolhurst Road and my bedroom looks over the tennis courts. I am also a member of the club. I understand the Club has applied to extend its licence on Saturdays until 12 midnight with a drinking up time until 12.30. They have also applied for a licence for live (or recorded music) until 11.30pm on Saturdays and on 3 other nights for 'special events'.

I am concerned about live music and people drinking outside late at night, the noise of which will carry across the courts. The Club has installed outdoor heaters which means the smokers will be able to drink outside, even in colder weather. This noise will interfere with my own enjoyment of being outside in my garden and sleeping at night.

Although the Club has gone some way to appease the local residents after their objection to the first application, I still feel that the extension until 12 midnight every Saturday is too much and would prefer it to end at 11.30 with a drinking up time until 12. The licence to be extended until 12 midnight on the 'special occasions' only, which could be more than 3, perhaps 12 per year.

The residents will then not have to dread every Saturday night because of the noise coming from the Club. I'm sure most people don't mind putting up with it on the odd occasions but not on a regular basis.

I hope that the Council will help decide on the right balance between enjoyment for club members and a peaceful life for the residents.

When the weather permits, I like to sit in my garden in the afternoon and evening. My garden is peaceful and quiet and I can enjoy birdsong. In the evening there are even bats flying. I am far enough from the Archway Road, Shepherds Hill and Hornsey Lane that traffic noise is just a faint distant rumble. Sitting in my garden, you could believe you are in the country.

My flat is separated from the tennis court site by only one other garden. I am close enough to hear music from the club clearly in my garden in summer, when I assume the club has its windows open for ventilation.

Whilst It would be unreasonable for me to complain about very occasional disturbance on rare special occasions, I do not agree that the club be given carte blanche to play live or recorded music every Saturday night (+ three other nights). On warm evenings, they will inevitably open windows and doors for ventilation. I understand that smoking is banned at the club and that they have installed patio heating and tables outside for them. I assume that even on colder evenings, the doors will be open much of the time. Sound will inevitably travel all along the back gardens of Avenue Road, funnelled between the houses on one side and the bank of St Aloysius playing fields on the other.

I currently sleep at the front of the building so sleep disturbance is not currently an issue. This may not always be the case, as I have two currently unused bedrooms facing the rear that would be badly affected, especially in summer when my windows are open for ventilation.

I am also concerned that granting this application might set a precedent should St Aloysius wish to make a similar application for their clubhouse on their Hurst Avenue playing fields. My home and garden are about midway between the two clubhouses.

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder:

The club is situated on a residential street with family houses adjoining it. There is inadequate off-street parking available in its own car park. An increase in events or extended Saturday drinking would result in an influx of cars and would cause additional inconsiderate parking, congestion in the narrow streets and disruption and noise to the neighbours.

Public Safety:

Most locally resident members of the club do not support the extensions requested and do not feel the need for additional facilities on this site. Couch End, Highgate, and Muswell Hill already have numerous bars, restaurants and venues with music, to which we can walk. Extended drinking hours would increase the risk of members of the club who do not live locally driving home from events held at the club when they have been drinking.

The garden of our home backs directly onto the courts immediately in front of the clubhouse. We can see into the bar from every room at the back of our house. This is a tranquil residential area, with no other public premises within sight or earshot. It is normally very quiet in the late evening.

When the club holds parties with music and dancing, there is considerable noise and we have been kept awake on these occasions. We also go to parties and do not object to this happening occasionally. We feel that the current license, which allows for an extension to the drinking hours up to twelve times in a year is reasonable. Permitting this level of noise to happen every Saturday and on the additional dates would be a significant intrusion and a change in the character of the neighbourhood and of the club, which we do not support. There is no evidence that there is a demand from members of the club (we are also members) for lots of special events with amplified music and extended drinking, as very few have actually been held in recent years. We fear that if the extension is granted, the attendees would not be the regular playing members of the club.

The licence application appears to imply that drinking and entertainment in the clubhouse would be entirely indoors. In practice, during all but the very wettest and coldest weather, the glazed doors of the clubhouse are open and drinkers sit out on the large terrace, where patio heaters are now provided. There is too little ventilation in the clubhouse for them to do anything else in warm, let alone hot, weather. The impact of loud amplified music on the surrounding neighbourhood is therefore a significant issue. We feel that whilst any DJ or band might well be inside the building, the application is misleading in this regard.

The Protection of Children from Harm

We are also concerned that many children and teenagers are now playing members of the club and use the clubhouse. Their interests are not mentioned. Children are regularly brought to the clubhouse in the evening and allowed to play both in the area where adults are drinking and unsupervised on the courts. This is noisy for the neighbours and as it often happens after dark, it is not really safe for those children. An extension to the drinking hours and more music at the clubhouse would probably increase this behaviour.

At a public meeting held in the summer of local residents many people reported, even under the old licensing, late night noise of people and cars in the access road and car park of the club. Parents complained of having to move children to other rooms in order to sleep, and those nearer Courtside complained of the noisy activity of cars and people--some of whom the club admitted were sometimes not club members but had somehow been allowed in. A number of people at the meeting were actually members of the club and thus committed to its welfare, but queried the need to so drastically extend both the licensing hours and the number of days in the years when they might be drawn upon. No one at the meeting (estimate about 45-50 people from the immediately adjoining streets) was impressed by the explanations given nor the assurance that while the extension of the days and hours were quantumly increased the social practice of the club would remain exactly the same as it was before. It was clear that money from the bar was the real reason for the extension of an increase in the club's social activities. While no-one objects to a push for funding, we felt that the proper balance of these activities was not encouraged by the degree of activity the new license would actually permit and especially in a future where it might be in the hands of less scrupulous operators.

There was more or less a good balance in the original status quo. I have been a resident here for 21 years and indeed have been a member of the club which I wish well.

The main concern is with late night drinkers and noise from adjacent social activity outside the bar. The other main concern, as always, is the noise from amplified sound. Current government police is I believe firmly on the side of those who oppose noise pollution and the law has been amended accordingly. All the residents fear and extension of noise from these two causes.

We also do not feel that the club itself has always shown itself to be an efficient policeman of its own members activities especially on those occasions on which it has lent its premises to private members own functions. This was admitted by the club at the meeting and they were perfectly polite and courteous in saying they would make an extra effort in this direction. But this kind of assurance, taken on trust, is not reassuring when the law will allow so many more opportunities for social activity. Chair persons seem to change with startling rapidity.

My personal view is that something near the previous status quo should be maintained. On the whole residents have negociated problems amicably with the club and we obviously wish that to continue. Many of us are actual member. All the

more reason therefore that the club's activities should be primarily sporting with the social activity at the appropriate subsidiary level that it is now.

I have no objection to the proposal for a slightly extended drinking up time.

That three weekday variations (Valentine, Halloween and Fireworks) be permitted

I live in Avenue Road, backing onto the courts at coolhurst club & diagonally across from the clubhouse. Over the years I have suffered constant intrusion and aggravation emanating from activities at the club, with unacceptably loud music & loud behaviour, presumably alcohol-fuelled, carrying on long past expected hours. Apart from sometimes complaining about the volume of music however (as many residents are forced to do) I have always accepted these occasional events as part of everyday life.

The emphasis here is on the word <u>occasional.</u> I was appalled to learn that Coolhurst Club have applied to extend their licensing agreement for live music and alcohol to cover every Saturday night – and a variation in addition – and this is totally unacceptable in the midst of a residential neighbourhood.

I chose to live here as it is a peaceful and friendly area in an almost rural environment, & in many ways it is pleasing to have a neighbourhood tennis club adjoining the property. But that is exactly what it should remain – a neighbourhood club with social events that reflect that status. It seems clear to me that this extraordinary drive to increase massively the music and alcohol elements of the club activities can only indicate a desire to promote Coolhurst as a late-night live music and drinking venue, open to non-members also, available to hire – all presumably with the desire to bring in money and certainly with no consideration at all for the residents in the area. (Since live music events are not arranged without considerable organisation, I also wonder whether further outside elements would gradually start to be involved, increasing even further a change of status for this club.) It is not unknown that Coolhurst Club has ambitions for development, and the concern is also that this is only the beginning.

The noise would be intolerable and as parking for all the clubbers is not possible even now, it is inevitable that they would try and park in Avenue road, and as current members have keys to the path adjoining this house, that would increase the amount of human noise to an unacceptable level. As things stand now, there are frequently some very loud, drunk-sounding people staying long past time and leaving that way, noisily. To have that every Saturday night, and other nights in addition if granted, would be an unacceptable intrusion.

Everybody has a right to relax in their own way at night, without the stress caused by this sort of activity. However, it is also the case that some events are of course to be expected, and should therefore continue for club members. I believe that a compromise situation would be to allow the club to hold live/recorded music events ONE Saturday a month only, and they can continue to apply for a certain number of additional events when the need arises, on a case by case basis, as they do now, and no further. With regard to the time, the music should stop totally at 11.30pm, as should the alcohol serving, so with a 30 minute clear-up/drinking up time, the premises should be vacated by midnight. That is an acceptable time for any event – private or otherwise – to stop, and I believe it presents a fair compromise that deals with the situation from both points of view.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance:

The club has recently had a change in chairman who is insisting in making this application in spite of objections from members, neighbours and staff. We do not believe that this application is based on any clear need and does not represent the best interests of either the club or the neighbourhood. The chairman has given such contradictory explanations for the reasons behind the current application that it is difficult to establish the real issues. The following written statements made by him demonstrate this point.

'what we have applied for will not make any difference to current arrangements'
'the point of the application is to give the Club the option of holding events that would utilise the proposed licence changes.'

The existing license arrangements have proved perfectly adequate in the past and the club has never applied for anywhere near the full number of Special Events for which it is entitled. It is hard, therefore, to see what these additional events are likely to be if the variation is granted.

It is our view that the application is in fact being made purely to support the drinking habits of a very small number of club members.

We have lived in Avenue Road for 17 years. This area is quiet and residential with private gardens facing onto the tennis courts and playing fields beyond. Our bedrooms face the bar and terrace of the clubhouse which is set in the middle of the courts with no buildings between.

We fully support the activities of the club and are active members.

We do however suffer inconvenience from the current arrangements and do not feel that a change should be permitted which will inevitably lead to more noise occurring later into the night every weekend of the year together with the 3 weekday events. Other neighbours with small children find that they are disturbed when trying to get to sleep even with the current arrangements.

Our concern rests in the fact that in the past we have suffered from periods when the club abused its licensing privileges resulting in considerable public nuisance. We, along with many members, do not believe that a heavy drinking culture should be central to a sports club. This has been encouraged in the past through 'out of hours' drinking, though more recently this has been much more tightly controlled with less public nuisance arising. We are concerned that the situation is now changing back to where it was previously.

The public nuisance arises in several ways as follows:

- Children are left unattended whilst their parents drink and play noisy games outside unsupervised. This results in loss of sleep for residents.
- Drinkers sit outside on the terrace throughout the year until closing time generating noise through conversation and laughter. This results in loss of sleep for residents.
- Smoking is not permitted in the bar so smokers drink outside at all times generating
 noise through conversation and laughter. The recent introduction of outside heaters
 encourages this activity. This results in loss of sleep for residents.
- Loud music is played for club functions but also private parties, until closing/extended closing. This sound carries and results in loss of sleep.
- Abuse of the court PA system late at night results in loss of sleep.

In the recent past the new club bar staff have managed all of the above so that they are at acceptable levels with little abuse. Events have been limited and the club has not been let out for members to have private parties, a major source of problems in the past. In previous periods there was poor management leading to regular complaints by neighbours to both the club and Haringey noise prevention department. We are concerned that these times are about to return.

On a particular issue, there has recently been a case of noise leading to loss of sleep from smokers drinking on the terrace late on a Friday night. The issue of smokers causing disturbance outside pubs and clubs is now on the national agenda. It is relevant to note that Westminster Council have applied to the Department of Health for 'the power to prohibit smoking *outside* certain premises' because of the public nuisance caused.

In our view a variation to the existing license with extended drinking hours and permission for music on all Saturdays, with the 3 additional weekdays, is unnecessary and will lead to increased public nuisance of an unacceptable level. The stated intention of the club to return to the policy of letting out the club out for member's private functions will lead to further nuisance as events in the past have clearly shown. These will all result in further loss of sleep for us, other neighbours and their children. The club has shown in the past how difficult it is to manage impromptu and private events late at night. Junior bar staff

would normally be on duty and they do not have sufficient influence to stop members, and in particular their guests, from taking advantage. Guests are also not familiar with the local sensitivities and this inevitably leads to increased noise and nuisance. We also understand that there is a proposal that club members be permitted to serve drinks rather than staff. This would also be a situation that would lead quickly to abuse and further nuisance, as past experience has demonstrated.

The club has had three different chairmen in the last three years, each with a different agenda. Whatever verbal assurances that may be given by the current chairman about limited use of the variation to the license, there will be no guarantee of these being upheld in future. Indeed past experience has shown how dramatically the use of the club can change with a new chairperson. As neighbours, we need the protection of a limited license to cover any future uncertainty.

We think that the status quo should be maintained and control of existing arrangements at the club improved. However, to overcome the issue of flexibility and to save making repeated applications for Special Event Notices, we believe that there is a reasonable compromise to be had as follows:

- The extended drinking up time be permitted.
- The 3 weekday variations namely Valentines, Halloween and Fireworks nights be permitted.
- The Saturday variations to 12 o'clock be permitted but with a limit of one a month.
- No activities outside on the club terrace should be permitted after 11.00 pm.
- No additional events should be permitted.

This proposal will allow a considerable increase over the current number of events and whilst increasing potential nuisance to neighbours this should be acceptable with assurances in writing that suitable controls will be put in place by the club.

We strongly oppose the proposed variation to the existing licence with the exception of three dates: 14th February, 31st October and 5th November.

There are current issues which we feel would be exacerbated should the variation be granted outside these dates. This would severely impact on our enjoyment of our property.

Our reasons for objecting are as follows:

1. There is already insufficient parking for members and their guests. During the club's busy periods/functions this results in cars parked across the front of our properties, all along our private cul-de-sac and on all four extreme corners of Coolhurst Road (which is very dangerous for drivers trying to exit Courtside and for children crossing).

If musical events were to go ahead at the club, which would only be viable if large numbers of people attended, the lack of sufficient parking would impact upon Courtside residents and those in neighbouring streets. It would also substantially increase the volume of traffic entering and leaving Courtside. There is evidence of drink driving in the past which we strongly feel should be discouraged.

- 2. People leaving the club at night often do so noisily. Those on foot frequently stop to chat beneath our bedroom windows and those in cars sometimes bid farewell to friends by sounding their horns or chat with their engines running. This is a nuisance and has woken our children on numerous occasions. Parents in the bar often leave their children unattended in the evening to run around in the car park outside our house playing noisily, kicking balls etc. They also run up and down along the path which runs at the back of our property. It would be unacceptable if this disturbance became more frequent and continued even later than it does at present.
- 3. Having, what could potentially be, a weekly disco/live music event on our doorstep would have an adverse impact on the value and saleability of our home. Drinking, dancing and loud or live music is fine where appropriate but is highly inappropriate in a sports club sited in an wholly residential area

We are concerned that the club is trying to boost it's income by encouraging the members to purchase more alcohol, thereby moving the club in another direction.

We have lived in Avenue Road N6 for 26 years, and over that time we have suffered from a continual programme of irritation from the Coolhurst Tennis Club. As I recall, it began with the slicing off of several feet from the bottom of our garden so that members could continue to gain access to the courts from the adjacent pathway, once an additional court was added Trees of ours with overhanging branches were lopped without notice; noise-generating junior practice courts added right next to our boundary; and an on-going debate about additional lighting and an overscaled inflatable still persists.

I mention these issues because the current licence application should be seen in the context of the bigger picture- of a club continually looking for ways to increase revenue- regardless of it's effect on the community.

Whilst- because of trees- we do not see the clubrooms from our windows, our bedroom and living rooms- open for most of the year, certainly get the full force of any noise they generate. All of these activities, irritating and at times-upsetting, have usually been settled amicably, and we accept the need for the club to hold it's occasional late night eventsdisruptive though they are. Knowing that they don't happen very often, we are resigned to lie awake and wait for them to finish. Generally speaking these night time activities have been viewed as an after-play wind down, and an opportunity from time to time, for a few discreet private members to socialise, in an otherwise peaceful pocket of domestic coexistance.

Untill now.

These current proposals; regular late night eating and drinking, accompanied by live or recorded music, outdoor carousing, and the potential of attracting non-members, signal a move by the club into an aggressive, moneymaking, rowdy, noisy, highstreet-style phase which is totally unacceptable, and which has thrown local residents into a state of anger and fear that I have never seen before.

In the spirit of understanding and compromise, we would accept- as a maximum- ONE Saturday night a MONTH till midnight, and any other ad-hoc midweek events- such as New Years Eve, Halloween or fireworks night- to be the subject of special application in the way they currently are. In addition-guidelines must be given to the club to limit the number of non-members attending social events (say- one or two per member) and we urge that restrictions be put in place to prevent the club from using the facilities as a venue-for-hire.

I wish to register my objection to the extended licensing hours, the provision for live and/or recorded music with/without dancing and the increase in the number of times that this extension will apply.

This club is surrounded by private homes and the residents in these homes have a right to enjoy their gardens and a right to continue to enjoy the peaceful environment that has always been associated with living in this area. Both these rights will be severely curtailed should this extension be granted. This will apply particularly in the summer when it will not be possible to sit quietly in your own garden on a Saturday night as the noise from the club bar and the attached patio will be terribly intrusive. In addition there is also the noise associated with the people leaving the club at circa midnight, slamming their car doors, laughing, shouting and generally making noise as people do at the end of an evening where alcohol has been consumed. Finally we, at Brook Lodge, already suffer continually from members parking in our private car park thereby making it impossible for the residents to park. Despite repeated complaints to the club, this problem has not been resolved. The entertainment and dancing will exacerbate this problem as more people will be inclined to stay at the club for the extended drinking hours. The management of the club admits that the additional revenue resulting from the increased evening usage of the bar is the reason the club has applied for the extended license.

The purpose of this club has always been to provide a facility for playing tennis and, more recently, squash. It was never meant to be a nightclub. There are numerous facilities in Crouch End and Muswell Hill where drinking and dancing are permitted. There is no need for another such facility.

This extended license would ruin this area for the residents living around the club and I urge you to refuse the application.

The problem is that the music, whether live or recorded, can be amplified to an unacceptable level. We can hear it in every room of our house. If this license is granted, on Saturdays it would be very difficult for local residents to have an evening with friends in their own house with the windows open. On Summer evenings at the weekend, residents are entitled to enjoy their own gardens without constant loud music. If drinking is extended to midnight it will be 12.30 before the drinking and noise stops. I have lived in Avenue Road for 43 years occupying a garden maisonette which backs on to the the grounds of the Coolhurst Tennis Club. The clubhouse is located to the garden boundary in a diagonal line. During the day and early evening the sounds of tennis court activity are what one would expect of this sporting facility which ceases at about 10.30 pm. Occasionally, when some event is celebrated in the clubhouse the music, particularly the bass sounds, can be intrusive which will continue until late hours.

However, permission is requested now for a variation to the existing club premises licence certificate number LN 0000 1247. If granted by the Licensing Authority it would entail extended drinking hours and permission for the performance of recorded or live musical entertainment with provision of facilities for dancing. This activity could occur every Saturday plus a further three non standard timed events throughout the year.

I am the freehold owner of the ground floor flat in this converted house (numbered 24 because I have the original front door), which is situated in a quiet residential area. Although the frontage is at street level the rear windows are high up facing at quite a short distance diagonally across the club's two synthetic grass courts towards the club house at a level well above garden foliage, etc. so that when events involving dancing with live music or recorded music directed by a disc jockey take place I can clearly hear the sound. I do find this disturbing, especially at times of the year when windows need to be open, but I have never raised any objection since these occasions have been infrequent and I recognise that the club, although essentially a sports, rather than a social, club naturally wishes to provide some social activities for its members.

I am, however, very concerned that, whatever the present intentions of the club may be, granting of the option sought in its Application for Variation of its Licence could result in my being subjected to 'noise nuisance' from events of the kind described above every single Saturday night of the year. I therefore request that if a Variation should be granted it should be subject to a set maximum number of such Saturday events. It seems to me that the equivalent of one Saturday a month plus perhaps a few extras for unexpected circumstances should be more than adequate for a club of this kind situated as it is in a wholly residential area.

Dear Sirs.

I write to register my strong opposition to the granting of the above license to the Coolhurst Lawn Tennis club.

The club is situated in the heart of a completely residential area surrounded by houses and flats. As it is, the Tennis Club is a source of much disruption to those living here.

The club parking is hugely inadequate for the size of their membership and as a result cars belonging to members of the club are frequently parked with haste making access difficult and sometimes impossible for even moderately large cars let alone Emergency vehicles trying to get through. Naturally club members also feel free to park in the private car park reserved for Brook Lodge residents only. Complaints to the management have not proved effective and problems continue.

Furthermore upon leaving the club as can be expected, members talk loudly amongst themselves without due consideration for people in surrounding residential area. This coupled with the constant barrage of traffic and car doors slamming open and shut is enough to wake even the soundest of sleepers. Young children needing to sleep are no doubt affected, as are adults — self included — who need their rest prior to leaving for work early in the morning.

Already the club hours extend to 10pm at night, granting an extended drinking license with live entertainment with DJ and dancing option will effectively make living here intolerable. Late night drunken fights, vandalism and general public nuisance is a certainty and not something we should be subjected to. There is no reason why a residential area should be subjected to this when the club members can walk five minutes to Crouch-End high street where they can already enjoy drink and live entertainment in a variety of existing venues away from residential living spaces.

We have had a number of run-ins with the club regarding parking, noise levels and damage to our property. In each instance the management has not impressed us with their response. The club management is interested only in the size of their

membership and has already demonstrated casual disregard for the needs of the residents who live in its vicinity. So while they may preach restraint and consideration this has not been reflected in their actions. Please do not put us further at their mercy.
