High Road West update

The Consultation:

- 8 week consultation on the HRW proposals
- 150 households and businesses attended 9 drop in sessions
- 200+ attended the Love Lane Resident Fun Day
- 400+ Feedback Forms received

Next Steps:

- Feedback report issued – Summer 2013
- Preferred master plan developed – Summer 2013
- Preferred master plan consultation – Autumn 2013
- Agree final master plan – Winter 2013/14

Transport update

Transport:

- 80m investment for improvements to the West Anglia Main Line.
- 4 trains an hour, all day, every day from Northumberland Park to Stratford by 2017.
- Northumberland Park, Tottenham Hale, White Hart Lane, Bruce Grove and Seven Sisters will become part of the London overground network.
- £90m to fund improvements to Gospel Oak- Barking overground Line. This will bring a faster and more reliable service to South Tottenham.

Regeneration News

Regeneration News:

- £500m borrowing guarantee secured for regeneration in Tottenham.
- This will aid housing delivery and regeneration, job creation initiatives, transport infrastructure and public realm projects.
- The Mayor of London launched the GLA's Enterprise Centre at 639 High Road.
- The Centre will offer space and business support for local people as well as offer help finding work, placements and volunteering opportunities.
- University Technical College secured as part of the THFC development.
