## BACKGROUND

4.1 The Annual Meeting appoints Committees of the Council. Wherever possible bodies have been constituted in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989 in terms of political balance. Labour Councillors constitute $52.63 \%$ of the available seats on the Council; the Liberal Democrats occupy the remaining $47.37 \%$ of the seats. Where practicable the allocation of seats on Committees should be in line with the proportion of seats on the Council held by the political groups.
4.2 In calculating the allocation of seats on Committees, the following bodies were excluded:

- the Cabinet and its subordinate bodies
- the disciplinary pool
- Licensing Committee
- the Standards Committee and
- other Committees where membership is determined on the basis of electoral ward represented (eg. Area Assemblies)

On this basis a total of 64 seats were available on Committees and SubCommittees, 34 or $53.125 \%$ were allocated to the Labour Group and 30 or $46.875 \%$ to the Liberal Democrat Group. In view of the volume of appointments to be made it is expedient to approve the appointments on a "slate" basis rather than on an individual basis.
4.3 Changes to appointments can be made at any stage during the Municipal Year with the changes being reported to the Council as appropriate.
4.4 The proposed appointments to Committees and Sub Committees and appointments of Chairs are as detailed in the attached Appendix.
4.5 Members might wish to note the following changes to the Committee structure:

Planning and Pensions are both now full Committees. However the number of members and political balance have not changed.
