5. Background information



Haringey Council

- 5.1 The Standards Committee is responsible for promoting and maintaining high standards of conduct, including monitoring the operation of the Members' Code of Conduct.
- 5.2 In 2013-14 the Monitoring Officer received 8 complaints that a member had breached the Code, 3 of which related to the same councillor arising from the same incident but made by three different people.
- 5.3 Of the 8 complaints:
 - 3 were rejected by the Assessment sub-committee and no further action was taken;
 - 4 (including the three arising about one member from the same incident) were referred by the Assessment sub-committee for investigation;
 - 1 was withdrawn following an apology by the member
- 5.4 Of those referred for investigation, one went to a Hearing sub-committee and the Member was found to have breached the Code. The investigation in relation to the member with 3 complaints against them was discontinued following the 2014 local elections when he was not re-elected. One additional hearing took place during the year following an investigation although the original complaint was made in the previous municipal year. The outcome of that Hearing was a finding of breach of the Code of Conduct.
- 5.5 Where appropriate, any lessons learned from complaints are considered by the Standards Committee and/or Monitoring Officer and any improvements that might assist members are implemented (e.g. in training). Lessons learned from both hearings and other complaints have been incorporated into the proposed changes to the Code of Conduct and arrangements for dealing with complaints against members.
