Performance Overview

Overall MOPAC 7 offences are performing well driven particularly by reductions in Robbery (39%), Theft/Taking of MV (38%), Criminal damage (31%) and Burglary (20%). These indicators remain on track to meet/exceed their target. However, Violence with injury(1% increase) and particularly Theft from MV (18% increase) offences remain a concern.

Key Improvers and Success

End of year performance showed Burglary, Criminal damage, Robbery and Theft of MV offences had already exceeded their respective four year targets (2011/12 benchmark); this performance could permit a an increase this year and still achieve their overall 20% MOPAC reduction. Rolling 12 month offences to May 2014 shows performance for these offences has remained consistent;

- Burglary is 20.% down compared to 2011/12
- Criminal damage is 31.1% down compared to 2011/12
- Robbery is 39.4% down compared to 2011/12 and
- Theft/Taking of MV is 37.5% down compared to 2011/12

Key Challenges

Theft from MV, Theft from person and Violence with injury missed their annual targets last year. Of the three Theft from person and Violence with injury had the worst performance and the latest performance shows no improvement; these were the only indicators recording rolling 12 month offence increases compared to their overall MOPAC target

- Theft from MV is 12% down compared to 2011/12 but missing long-term target
- Theft from person is 18% up on 2011/12 and
- Violence with injury is 1% up on 2011/12

Decision Required by CSP

Discussion around mitigating action needs to focus on 'Theft from Person' and 'Violence with Injury' + its component parts, both of which are departing from their overall MOPAC 20% reduction target
