




### Why does the data look the way it does?

QA are naturally concerned by the low percentage of peps, and up to date care plans / pathway plans. IROs have been asked to check prior to meetings if there are outstanding peps and to alert the social worker to complete this. IRO will be using a similar chase and checking system for care plans and health assessments.

CIC visits have dropped slightly, but Haringey has a local arrangement that these should be monthly, which in some instances is more frequent than the level required by regulation, and the drop here relates to the local arrangement and not to the regulatory requirement. In any event, a drop of 1 percent could not be regarded as statistically significant. Health Assessments are good at 97% and this relates to staff being better at inputting them properly into FWi, rather than them being recorded in casenotes. PEP numbers have increased but remain of concern. Staff report that there is resistance from schools in convening these meetings. Percentage of LAC over 20 days with an up to date Care Plan has dropped from the August high point of 75% and is now 50%. This activity takes place in First Response and S & S, and when cases come into LAC, we have to catch up.


