## **Annex 1 –Mandatory Conditions**

**(2) Supply of alcohol:** No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

(3) The second condition is that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

### **Exhibition of films:**

(2) Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection (3) (b) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that body.

(3) Where-

- (a) the film classification body is not specified in the licence, or
  - (b) the relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question,
- admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.

(4) In this section-

“children” means persons aged under 18; and

“film classification body” means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984.

**Door supervision:** At specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity and each of these individuals must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

## **Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule**

### **THE PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER**

That CCTV be installed, maintained and operated on the premises for the duration of operating hours for the prevention of crime and disorder.

CCTV system to be recording at all times when the premises are open and the recordings shall be made available to the police and council on request.

Anti-Drugs signs will be displayed on the premises.

Two door supervisors will be present between 22.00 and the closing of the premises.

### **PUBLIC SAFETY**

Fire safety equipment will be checked regularly and any requirements made by the Fire Safety Officer will be complied with.

The maximum number of persons accommodated at any one time shall not exceed:

Restaurant: 50

Bar Area: 150

The inward opening gate to Philip Lane and the inward opening doors to the High Road shall be kept locked in the open position whilst the premises are open to the public.

All Certificates required by the Council to be submitted promptly when they become due.

### **THE PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE**

Signs will be displayed at the exit reminding customers to leave quietly and respect the neighbours.

Staff will call Taxis/ Mini cabs for the use of customers leaving the premises when requested to do so.

No new admission to the premises after 00:00 every night.

### **THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN**

All staff will be trained that alcohol will only be sold to persons who can produce photographic identification where there is any doubt that they are over the age of 18.

Persons under the age of 18 will not be permitted to use Gaming machines.

No persons under the age of 18 will be admitted into the back bar when 18 certificate films are being shown.

Alcohol may only be sold to individuals over the age of 18 with valid proof of identification with one of the following:

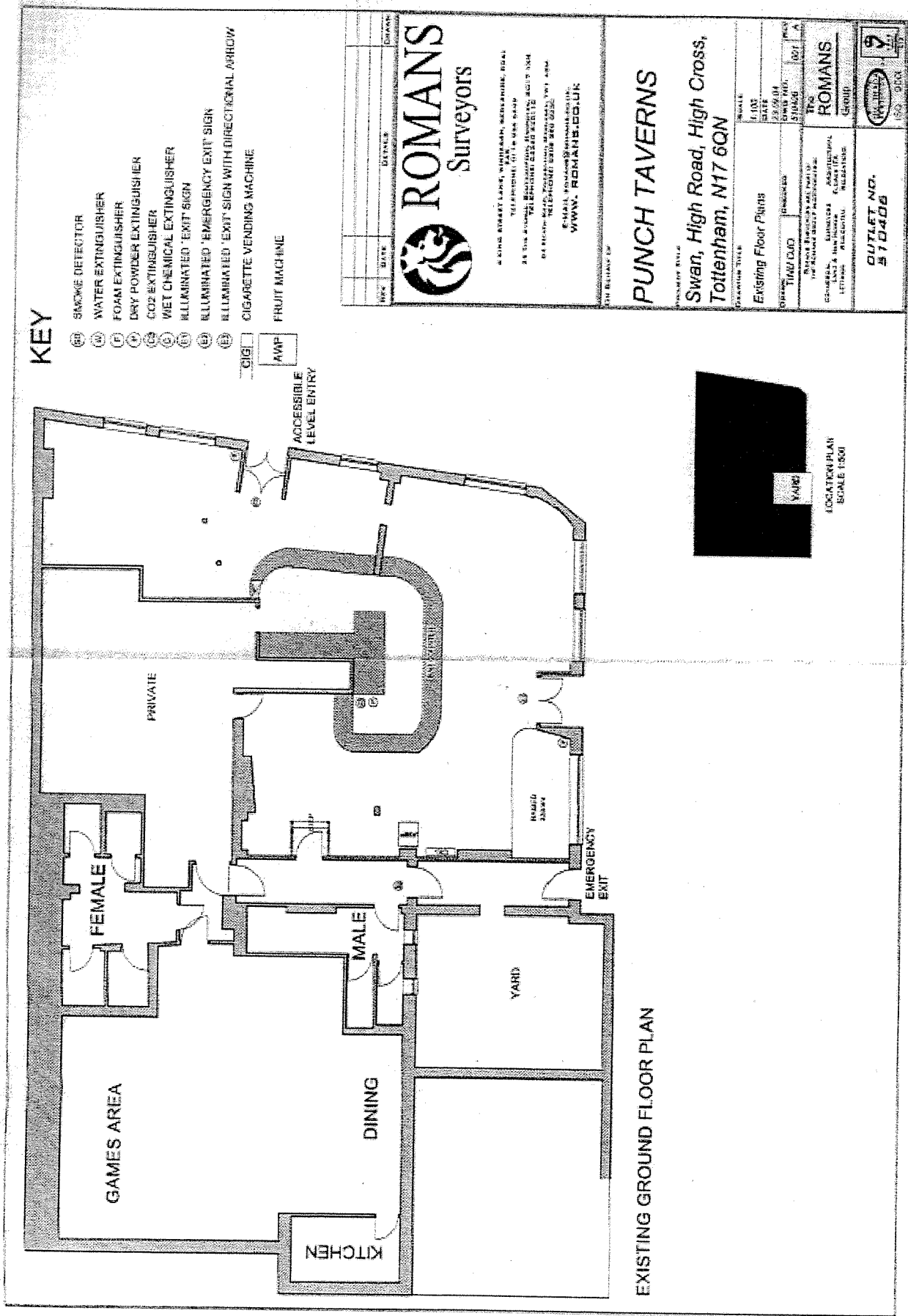
- A valid passport
- A photo driving license issued in a European Union Country
- A proof of age standard card system
- A citizen card, supported by the Home Office

### **Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority**

That the Committee grants the application in part and subject to the following conditions:

- (i) Conditions to enforce the operating schedule to ensure the Licensing objectives are met.
- (ii) Impose recommendations of the Child Protections Agency on age restrictions to meet the crime prevention objective.
- (iii) Standard mandatory conditions are enforced.
- (iv) Hours of operation are as follows
  - Sale of Alcohol is Monday to Wednesday 10:00 to 00:00; Thursday to Saturday 10:00 to 03:00; and Sunday 12:00 to 00:30.
  - Provision of Regulated Entertainment is Monday to Wednesday until 00:00; Thursday to Saturday until 03:00; and Sunday until 01:00.
  - Opening hours for public are Monday to Wednesday until 00:30; Thursday to Saturday until 03:30; and Sunday until 01:00
- (v) Days before Bank Holidays and for Christmas Eve, one extra hour beyond the usual permitted hours are granted.
- X (vi) That two door supervisors be SIA approved and will be present between 22:00 and closing times.
- x(vii) No new admission to the premises after 00:00 every night.
- (viii) That CCTV be installed, maintained and operated on the premises for the duration of operating hours for the prevention of crime and disorder.
- (ix) That anti-drugs signs be displayed in the premises for the prevention of crime and disorder.
- (x) Signs for exiting customers to leave quietly for the prevention of public nuisance
- (xi) Conditions to restrict numbers in the premises to 50 in the restaurant and 150 in the bar area for the benefit of crime and disorder, public safety, and public nuisance objectives.

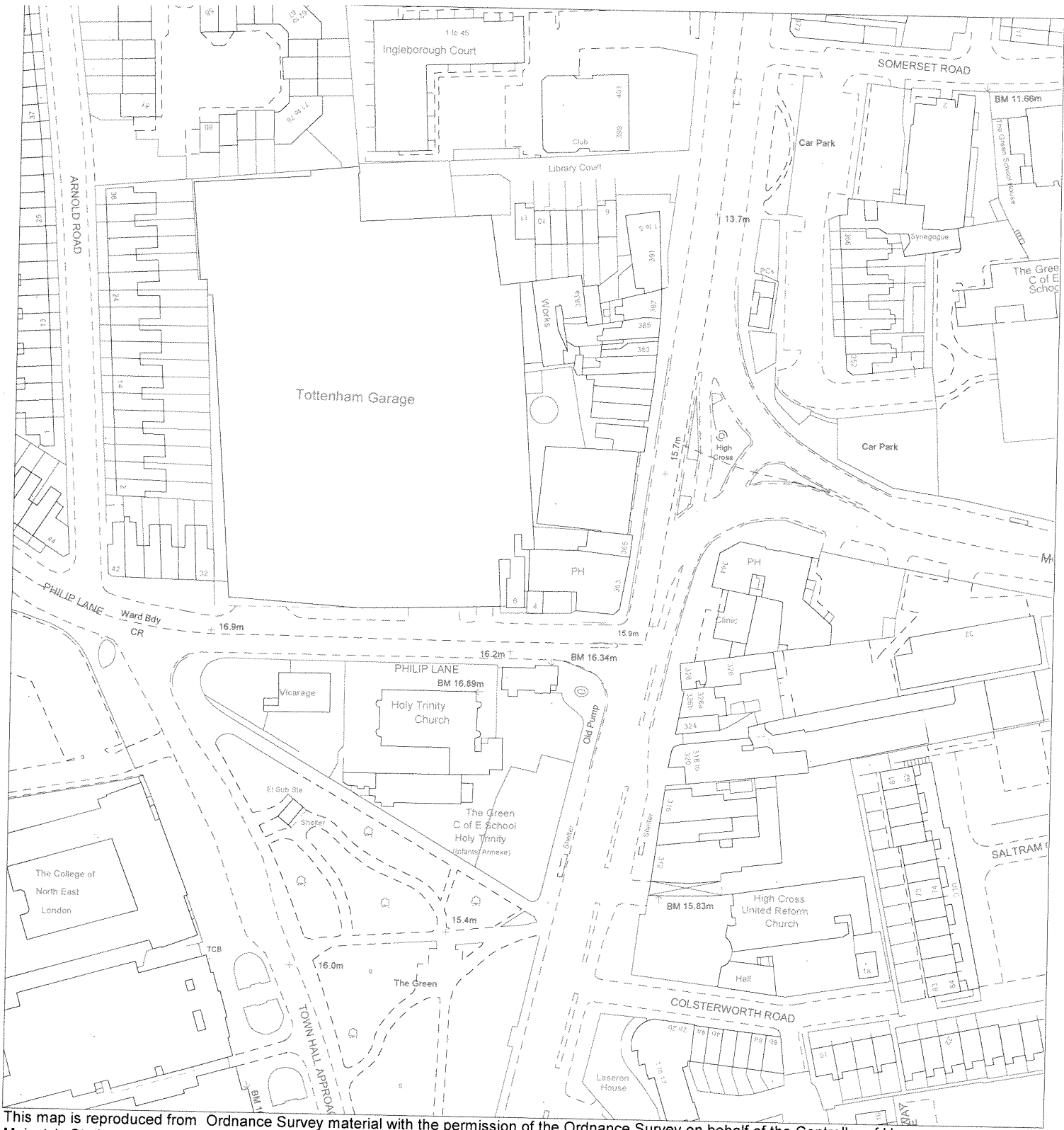

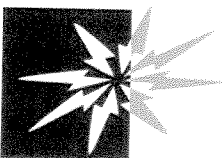

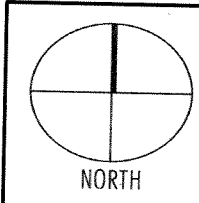
