**1. Purpose**

To consider an application for a review following a Closure Order issued by The Metropolitan Police for 'Shout' Unit 4 Hollywood Green, High Road N22. A copy of the premises license is attached at appendix 1.

**Summary of application**

A Closure Order was made by Inspector Paul Hughes in respect of the above premises on 1<sup>st</sup> January 2008 at 04.00a.m. An application was then made to the Magistrates Court The Court determined not to exercise its powers as the order had expired and there was no need for further action.

It is now for the Licensing Authority to review the premises license as required under section 167(2) of the Act.

In accordance with regulation 38 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Premises and Club Premises Certificates) Regulations 2005, officers arranged for notices of the review to be published for 7 days on the affected premises, on the public notice board at the Civic Centre and on the Councils website.

## 4. REPORT

### Background

- 4.1 The premises benefited from a justices' license until 24<sup>th</sup> November 2005 granted by the Magistrates, which allowed the sale of alcohol and a Public Entertainment License at that time granted by the Council.

The licences were converted and varied by the then holders Luminar Leisure Ltd. An application to transfer the license into Summit Clubs Ltd was made in August 2006. The current DPS was assigned to the premises is April 2007.

The current license permits the following activities and times: copy at appendix 1.

The review has been brought about due to the high levels of crime associated with the premises. The Police have had meetings with the Licensee in July 2007 in an attempt to address their concerns.

The evidence produced by the Police shows various crimes and public disorder breakouts as well as grievous bodily harm.

## **6.0 POLICY CONSIDERATIONS**

- 6.1 The following provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 apply to this application:  
Section 13(3) (definition of interested parties)  
Section 51-53 (review of premises licenses)

In determining the application the Licensing Sub Committee can take such steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objective, which are:

1. Take no further action
2. to issue formal warnings to the premises supervisor and /or premises license holder
3. modify the conditions of the license
4. exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the license
5. remove the designated premises supervisor
6. suspend the license for a period not exceeding three months
7. revoke the license.

Where the Licensing Sub Committee takes steps mentioned in 3 or 4 it may provide that the modification or exclusion is to have effect for one such period (not exceeding three months) as it may specify. The licensing sub committee is asked to give full reasons for its decision.

The Licensing Sub Committee must make its decision within 5 working days of the end of the hearing. Any decision of the Licensing Sub Committee is stayed from coming into effect for 21 days from the date of the decision, pending any appeal that might be made and the determination of that appeal. Any party to the proceedings may appeal against the decision of the decision of the Licensing Sub Committee.

- 6.2 The following provisions of the Secretary of State's guidance apply to this application: Paras 11.1 – 11.10, 11.14 – 11.21, 11.22 – 11.27. These provisions are attached at appendix 5.
- 6.3 The following paragraphs of the licensing authority's statement of licensing policy apply to this application; 7.13-7.14, 11.1-11.3, 12.1-12.4, 13.1-13.7, 14.1-14.3, 18.1-18.2, 25.1. These provisions are attached at appendix 6.
- 6.4 The Licensing Sub Committee is reminded of their duty under the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 to consider the crime and disorder objective in their decisions and the authority's responsibility to co-operate in the reduction of crime and disorder in the Borough.
- 6.5 The Licensing Sub Committee is reminded that the Human Rights Act 1998 guarantees the right to a fair hearing for all parties in the determination of their civil rights. The Act also provides for the protection of property which may include licences in existence, and the protection of private and family life.

## **Annex 1 -Mandatory Conditions**

**(2) Supply of alcohol:** No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (3) The second condition is that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

### **Exhibition of films:**

(2) Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection (3) (b) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that body.

(3) Where-

- (a) the film classification body is not specified in the licence, or
- (b) the relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question,

admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.

(4) In this section-

"children" means persons aged under 18; and

"film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984.

**Door supervision:** At specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity and each of these individuals must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.





## **Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule**

### **THE PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER**

The current level of lighting outside the premises will continue for the additional hours of trading.

The existing CCTV system will continue to operate during the additional hours of trading.

Notices stating that CCTV is in operation 24 hours a day will be displayed throughout the venue.

The venue will actively participate in the local Pubwatch or equivalent scheme.

Where already used text/radio pagers will continue to be used for the additional hours of trading and will be monitored by a responsible member of staff.

Music and dancing will be a prominent feature of trading.

### **PUBLIC SAFETY**

The total number of persons accommodated at any one time within the premises shall not exceed 550.

The Licensee shall ensure that no noise shall emanate from the licensed premises or vibration be transmitted through the structure of the licensed premises, which gives rise to a nuisance to the occupiers of premises in the vicinity of the licensed premises.

The fire alarm changeover switch shall be in the 'FIRE ALARM LIGHTS AND BUZZERS' position during the whole time that the premises are in use under the Licence.

The fire alarm installation shall be under the supervision of a competent person who shall arrange for regular maintenance and testing to be carried out. Officers of the Council or London Fire and Civil Defence Authority shall record the results of the tests in a logbook, which shall be readily available for inspection.

All Certificates required by the Council to be submitted promptly when they become due.

Free drinking water will be available at all times.

A person trained in first aid will be at the venue who will have received training in any problems associated with alcohol and drug misuse.

Toughened glass will continue to be used during additional hours of trading.

### **THE PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE**

If a DJ is used on any night then he/she will ask customers to leave quietly;

Reasonable steps will be taken to recognise the needs of local residents and businesses

Any person who appears to be intoxicated or who is behaving disorderly will not be allowed entry to the venue. Any person within this venue who appears to be intoxicated or who is behaving disorderly will be given care and consideration in leaving the venue.

### **THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN**

A person under the age of 18 years will only visit the venue with a responsible adult usually for the purpose of dining unless there is an event especially organised for the youth market.

Unaccompanied persons under the age of 18 will not be permitted in the venue except at events especially organised for the youth market.

A person under 18 years of age will not be allowed to use any AWP machine.



## **Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule**

Alcohol may only be sold to individuals over the age of 18 with valid proof of identification with one of the following:

- A valid passport
- A photo driving license issued in a European Union Country
- A proof of age standard card system
- A citizen card, supported by the Home Office





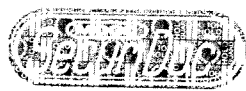




**Re: Shout, Hollywood Green N.22**

On Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> July 2007 at Wood Green Police Station a meeting took place with Mr. Dilan Karunanayake the Designated Premises Supervisor and Mr Martin Winter the Area Manager for Shout, Hollywood Green N.22. Representing the Police was Chief Inspector Mawson, Head of Operations and Geoff Parker the Police Licensing Officer.

C/I Mawson stated that the reason for the meeting was due to an unacceptable large number of incidents of crime and anti – social behaviour that had taken place in and around the premises in the last 7 months.

A full and frank discussion took place and the representatives of Shout put forward the following proposals to alleviate the problems.

They will employ 7 door staff on a Friday and Saturday night with the head supervisor on the entrance to the premises and one to be employed in and around the dance floor area. They will be carrying out a review of the door staff

A Incident manager will take control of any problems occurring at the premises.

A monthly meeting will take place between Geoff Parker and Dilan Karunanayake .

They will be reviewing the possibility of introducing polycarbonates at a later date.

Re introduction of the Challenge 21 policy.

Police suggested the following to the representatives of Shout.

Operation Pubdog to visit.

Crime Prevention Design Advice

Pub Link radio to be kept by the DPS.

BATS team to visit

Contact with the SNT

Duty officers to carry out licensing visits on a regular basis.

Notices to be displayed re search as a condition of entry and a zero tolerance on drugs.

A further meeting to be held with all interested parties in 3 months time to review the situation.

All agreed these proposals.

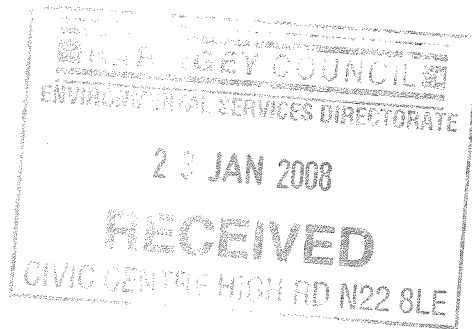

Officers came across a large disturbance outside the Shout Bar. There was a male unconscious. Officers required Urgent Assistance Serious disorder was taking place involving customers from the bar. Customers spilling out of premises and joining in disorder. Male arrested nearby with a lock knife. Male armed with broken bottles. Serious + imminent disorder present. This is a continuation of ongoing gang problems in the area. Attention is drawn to the attached Notes which form part of this order.

A senior police officer has decided to make this closure order under the terms of section 161 of the Licensing Act 2003, requiring the relevant premises specified in the order to be closed for the period of time specified in the order.

Your attention is drawn to section 161(6) of the 2003 Act. This makes it an offence for a person, without reasonable excuse, to permit relevant premises to be open in contravention of this closure order or any extension of it, and any person found guilty of such an offence shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £20,000 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or to both.

By virtue of section 171(2) and (3) of the 2003 Act, relevant premises are to be regarded as open, for the purposes of this order, if any person other than the holder of the premises licence for the premises, any designated premises supervisor, the premises user in connection with a temporary event notice, a manager of the premises, any person who usually lives at the premises or any member of the family of any of the former, enters the premises and buys, or is otherwise supplied with food or drink or any item usually sold on the premises or, while he is on the premises, they are used for the provision of regulated entertainment.





The following statement is made in connection with a serious disorder issue which arose outside the 'Shout Bar' Wood Green High Road in the early hours of Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> January 2008 and the subsequent closure notice served by me on this premises.

On Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> January 2008 at about 0315 hours Police received a call from local CCTV operators stating that they could see a large fight outside the 'KO Club' in Wood Green High Road (CAD 3285). Shortly afterwards Police received a further call from 'Dillan' the manager of the 'Shout bar' stating that a large group of Turkish males had caused a disturbance at his premises and the doormen had intervened. This group were now outside and causing damage to the front of the premises. Further information from Dillan stated that he was closing the club and that the London Ambulance Service (LASO) were required for an unconscious male outside the 'Shout Bar' bleeding from his head. Whilst police were receiving the details of the call further information was received that there were at least 25 people outside the bar and that another male had been attacked with a bottle over his head. Further information was that the door staff were looking after the injured male. At that time the first Police Officer, PC 431YR Philips stated that he was on scene. (CAD 3419).

At 0328 a further call was received from a 'Sara' stating that there was a large disturbance at the location and that there was a large disturbance and that a male had been stamped in the head. (CAD 3518).

At 0329 another call was received from an anonymous female stating that she had witnessed a large fight between 15-20 males and that cars and shops were being smashed up. (CAD 3521).



At 0330 hours PC 475YR Montgomery called up via her radio and stated that she required 'Urgent Assistance' as she was on scene outside the 'Shout Bar'. She stated that she was with an unconscious male and required the LAS. I attended very shortly afterwards and upon my arrival other Police units were arriving from both Haringey borough and off Borough units from Hackney and Edmonton. As I arrived I could see a large disturbance outside the 'Shout bar' and officers were struggling and fighting with members of the crowd, which I would estimate to be in excess of 100 people. With the number of police officers on scene I initially asked for no other units to be deployed, as I believed we could deal with the situation with the number of officers I had to deploy. However after a period of 5 minutes of so of continued disorder and the fact that Officers had their Batons drawn and CS Spray had been discharged I requested the attendance of the Territorial Support Group to disperse the crowd. I also requested the attendance of a dog unit to assist with this task. Once I had sufficient units on scene I then formed the Officers into a protective cordon around the casualty, who had still not been treated, and pushed back the crowd. This allowed the Las to attend to the unconscious male with the protection of the Police Officers. I had to deploy in excess of 25 Officers to ensure that the area around the casualty remained sterile. Once I was satisfied that the area was contained I deployed 6 officers to form a protective 'bubble' around the casualty in order to safely transfer him to the waiting Ambulance. Even once the casualty was removed the crowd refused to disperse and I approached the door staff of the 'Shout Bar' and advised them to clear their bar. Taking the remaining customers out through the rear of the premises facilitated this. Once I was sure the premises were closed I then instructed all of the Officers to leave the area to diffuse the situation. As we were doing this more members of the crowd confronted officers and further Arrests were made by various officers for a variety of offences. In addition at this time PC 475YR Montgomery had blood spat into her mouth by a male she was arresting at the location. She was immediately taken to St. Thomas hospital to have checks carried out on her. I was then contacted by a PS Ian Bond of the Metropolitan police Clubs and Vice Unit. He advised me that he was on Central London Duty and was attending the location to liaise with me regarding serving a closure notice on the 'Shout Bar'. By the time he attended the majority of the crowd had left the area apart from a group of about 10-15 black males, who appeared to be from opposing groups. I monitored these small groups with the members of the Clubs and Vice Unit who by now had attended the location. I instructed all Officers who had attended the scene to make a note of the fact they had and in particular those who had drawn their batons to do so. I was also made aware that during the disturbance a caller by the name of 'Maxwell' had called to state that involved in the fight outside the 'Shout Bar' he saw a gun and a knife flash in front of him. (CAD 3608).

Once the situation appeared to have finally calmed sufficiently I attended the 'Shout Bar' with Sergeant Bond from Clubs





and Vice and spoke to the Duty Manager Mr. Dilan KARUNANAYAKE. I then served him with a Form 690, Closure Order Under Section 161 of the Licensing Act 2003. The notice outlined who I was, the address of the premises to be closed, the length of the closure and the reasons. I served the order at 0400 hours and closed the premises until 0400 hours on 2<sup>nd</sup> January 2008. My reasons were that the Officers who had come across the large scale disturbance outside the 'Shout Bar' had required 'Urgent assistance' to deal with the casualty and crowd at the location. Serious disorder had involved the customers from the Bar. A male had also been arrested nearby in possession of a lock knife and males had been armed with broken bottles. I also stated that there had been serious and imminent disorder and was linked to ongoing gang problems in the area. Mr. Karunanayake accepted the Closure Notice and stated that he understood the reasons and rationale behind the decision. I then left the Bar along with all Officers. There were no repercussions that night.

I was next on Duty on Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> January 2008 when I was asked to attend Highgate Magistrate's Court to give evidence of my decision to serve the Closure notice and to have my decision ratified by the Magistrates. This was completed that afternoon and the magistrates heard my evidence and agreed with my decision to close the premises for 24 hours.



## Review of licence under Licensing Act 2003 following closure under S161 LA 2003

### “ Shout “ Bar, Hollywood Green, Wood Green N22

This review is a requirement of the Licensing Act 2003 following the closure of a premise by police on 1<sup>st</sup> January 2008. It is the intention of Police to offer the Review panel a balanced and fair perspective and to present all of the issues receiving Police interest from 1/6/07 to the present date.

### Brief Overview

On 1<sup>st</sup> January 2008 during the early hours of the morning major disorder occurred in the area of Hollywood Green, N22. “ Shout” Bar is located at this venue and a decision was made by the Haringey Police duty officer, Insp Paul HUGHES, to close the premises to reduce the level of violence in and around the area. In order to do this he used powers under S161 LA 2003. Eventually order was restored.

On 2nd January 2008 Insp Paul Hughes attended Haringey Mags. Court and the court reviewed the Police decision under S164 LA 2003. The Court decided to take no further action.

### Statement from Insp Paul Hughes

This statement relates to the incident that occurred outside “ Shout” Public House on 1/1/ 08

### CAD Reports

I have included a copy of all CAD reports to the “Shout” Bar from 1 June 2007 to the present day. There are currently 20 reports on an attached grid, which relate to 11 separate incidents. Because of system failings it is possible that there may be more calls to the premises but these can be lost because of the information input by the operator taking the call. E.g. A call to Shout may be listed as a call to 1) Shout Bar 2) Hollywood Green 3) Spouters Corner 4) High Road N22 5) Outside a) Waterspoons b) MacDonald’s c) Nandos d) Yates 6) Outside a street number. It is clearly

impractical to search such a wide range of criteria and I have restricted this report to those easily identifiable.

It should be noted that the majority of these CAD calls originate during the early hours of the morning towards the end of licensing hours and it is believed that this may be a contributing factor to the problems experienced

### **CRIS Reports**

I have included a copy of all CRIS reports, which show "Shout" Bar as the venue for an alleged offence. It should be noted that these are purely the allegations and do not in any way indicate what the final result of the investigation was. There are a total of 18 allegations included that range from theft to GBH. Again it should be noted that the majority of these offences have occurred during the early hours of the morning and it is felt that the fact that "Shout" bar is open as late as it is may be a contributing factor.

One of the most concerning offences for this period relate to an assault on 12/1/08 in which a member of the public was allegedly assaulted by two of the door supervisors. One of these men were arrested at the time and the second is currently avoiding arrest

### **CRIMINT Reports**

Ordinarily I would include a summary of all CRIMINT reports in relation to "Shout" Bar dating back approximately 6 months but unusually there is no CRIMINT intelligence whatsoever for this period for this premises

### **Impact on Police Operations**

Whilst it is accepted that the current management from "Shout" Bar assist police at every possible opportunity I feel that the large volume of CRIS and CAD reports highlight the fact that this premises is having a disproportionate effect on the Policing operations from Haringey Borough. I believe that this compulsory review of the licence is a timely intervention and must be seen as an opportunity to examine in detail the matters that have occurred based on the principles of the licensing objectives: -


- 1) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- 2) The Prevention of Public Nuisance
- 3) Public safety

### **Summary**

Whilst until recently "Shout" appeared not to be a problem premises on a regular basis this research has highlighted a few concerns for me. I believe a full review of the licence will ensure that appropriate weight is given to the evidence included in this

application and will allow the licensing committee to reconsider the conditions affixed to this licence.

I also reserve the right to rely on further incidents of crime and disorder or breaches of licensing objectives that take place at or in the vicinity of the premises between now and any review hearing
