# BEST VALUE INDICATOR BV109 - DETERMINING PLANNING APPLICATIONS

## January 2008 Performance

In January 2008 there were 193 planning applications determined, with performance in each category as follows -

100% of major applications were determined within 13 weeks (6 out of 6)

82% of minor applications were determined within 8 weeks (41 out of 50 cases)

93% of other applications were determined within 8 weeks (128 out of 137 cases)

### **Year Performance – 2007/08**

In 2007/08 up to the end of January there were 1827 planning applications determined, with performance in each category as follows -


78% of major applications were determined within 13 weeks (18 out of 23 cases)

77% of minor applications were determined within 8 weeks (368 out of 476 cases)


88% of other applications were determined within 8 weeks (1166 out of 1328 cases)


## **Major Applications 2007/08**

#### **Background/Targets**

BV109 is one of the Department for Communities and Local Government (DCLG) Best Value indicators for 2007/08.

It sets the following targets for determining planning applications:

- a. 60% of major applications within 13 weeks
- b. 65% of minor applications within 8 weeks
- c. 80% of other applications within 8 weeks

Haringey has set its own challenging targets for 2007/08 in relation to BV109. These are set out in Planning Policy & Development (PPD) Business Plan 2007-10 and are to determine:

- a. 82% of major applications within 13 weeks
- b. 85% of minor applications within 8 weeks
- c. 90% of other applications within 8 weeks

#### Appendix I

#### **Explanation of categories**

The BV109 indicator covers planning applications included in the DCLG PS1/2 statutory return.

It *excludes* the following types of applications - TPO's, Telecommunications, Reserve Matters and Observations.

The definition for each of the category of applications is as follows:

Major applications -

For dwellings, where the number of dwellings to be constructed is 10 or more For all other uses, where the floorspace to be built is 1,000 sq.m. or more, or where the site area is 1 hectare or more.

Minor application -

Where the development does not meet the requirement for a major application nor the definitions of Change of Use or Householder Development.

Other applications -

All other applications, *excluding* TPO's, Telecommunications, Reserve Matters and Observations.

## January 2008 Performance

In January 2008, excluding Certificate of Lawfulness applications, there were 149 applications determined of which:

63% were granted (94 out of 149)

37% were refused (55 out of 149)


#### **Year Performance – 2007/08**

In 2007/08 up to the end of January excluding Certificate of Lawfulness applications, there were 1492 applications determined of which:

67% were granted (1004 out of 1492)

33% were refused (488 out of 1492)

# BEST VALUE INDICATOR BV204 - APPEALS AGAINST REFUSAL OF PLANNING PERMISSION

#### **January 2008 Performance**

In January 2008 there were 12 planning appeals determined against Haringey's decision to refuse planning permission, with performance being as follows -

50.0% of appeals allowed on refusals (6 out of 6 cases)

50.0% of appeals dismissed on refusals (6 out of 6 cases)


#### Year Performance – 2007/08

In 2007/08 up to the end of January there were 106 planning appeals determined against Haringey's decision to refuse planning permission, with performance being as follows -

41.5% of appeals allowed on refusals (44 out of 106 cases)

58.5% of appeals dismissed on refusals (62 out of 106 cases)

The monthly performance is shown in the following graph:




### <u>Last 12 months performance – February 2007 to January 2008</u>

In the 12 month period February 2007 to January 2008 there were 117 planning appeals determined against Haringey's decision to refuse planning permission, with performance being as follows -

41.9% of appeals allowed on refusals (49 out of 117 cases)

58.1% of appeals dismissed on refusals (68 out of 117 cases)

# **Background/Targets**

BV204 is one of the Department of Communities and Local Government (DCLG) Best Value indicators for 2007/08.

It sets a target for the percentage of appeals allowed against the authority's decision to refuse planning permission.

The target set by DCLG for 2007/08 is 30%<sup>^</sup>

Haringey has set its own target for 2007/08 in relation to BV204. This is set out in PPD Business Plan 2007-10.

The target set by Haringey for 2007/08 is 32%
