Hello

We are writing to express our objections to the licensing application for Bills (107-109 Muswell Hill Road, London N103HS), which is two doors down from our property of residence (103 Muswell Hill Road).

We object for a number of reasons:

- Delivery vans for Planet Organic already park outside our flat (103 Muswell Hill Road) during early hours 4am-5am daily to unload goods. They are very loud and continually disturb our sleep. This would be increased with the introduction of a restaurant with such long opening hours who would no doubt need constant food deliveries.
- We object the opening hours and the outdoor drinking and dining offering, for great concerns over noise and safety. Noise from outside (mainly the bus stops) already carries into our flat and we are very concerned about the daily midnight closure. Already we experience late night noise as people congregate at the nearby bus stops on Fortis Green Road (M and N stops) and this will be greatly increased with more people frequenting Muswell Hill. Most shops and restaurants in the area closed by 10pm so why does this one need to remain open until midnight??
- A drinking premise should not be allowed directly next door to residential property. Other local pubs are on the high street, away from residential property. These pubs/bars already create enough over-spill at the bus stops throughout the night. For example, on Saturday at 3am, police and ambulances were called for a disturbance at the bus stop opposite our flat (Fortis Green Road stop N). By increasing the footfall to this area, you directly affect our peaceful neighbourhood and safety. I would strongly advise Bills to hire security if they do get planning permission or be prepared for angry residents regularly phoning the local police for noise disturbances.

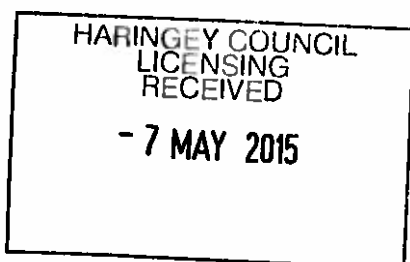

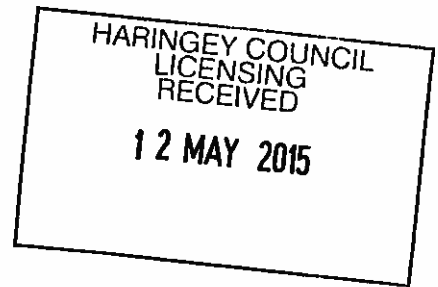

I have a young family and the increased noise from drinkers/smokers and music at such a close proximity will definitely adversely affect our quality of life - as well as the value of our property.

In such a suburban area full of young families such as mine, the serving of alcohol to such a late time and the noise of music being played late, is utterly inappropriate.

As residents of Firs Avenue we would like to object in the strongest possible terms to the above licence application.

The rear of our house and garden backs directly on to the Odeon car park and therefore the bedrooms in our house will be in extremely close proximity to the proposed venue.

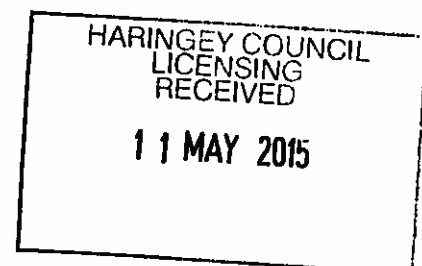
We are incredibly concerned about the opening times and use of the restaurant which have been applied for, particularly in relation to the attendant noise that is likely to come hand in hand with an extended licence for alcohol, music and opening hours. Muswell Hill is a peaceful residential area with a high number of families, young children and working people. While there are already several pubs in the area, these respect the usual opening hours and therefore provide relatively little in the way of disturbance for those who need a reasonable night's sleep.

To expect local residents to tolerate disturbance both from the noise of the venue and of its customers, beyond midnight every single day, is unreasonable. Restaurant patrons are highly likely to park in the Odeon car park-which currently sees little activity beyond about 10.30 at night-and if so, there will be noise from people leaving the restaurant & getting into cars until an hour that is completely unacceptable in a residential area. In addition to this, if restaurant customers choose to smoke, they will undoubtedly spill out not only to the front of the restaurant but to the rear, so that there will be drifting smoke and outside noise a very short distance from the bedrooms of many Firs Avenue and Grand Avenue residents.

Based on the objections above, we ask you to reject the application by Bills Restaurant to serve alcohol and play music until midnight seven days a week, and also to stay open daily until half past midnight. Such venue use is entirely inappropriate when situated so close to many family homes.

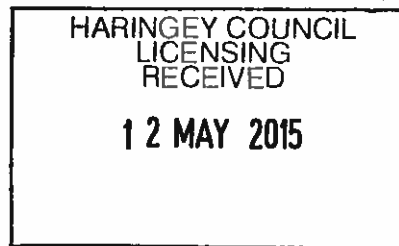

Proposals for Bills Restautant, 107 Muswell Hill Road - OBJECTIONS

As you will know from my telephone calls, I am deeply concerned at these proposals.

If your staff could visit this site, you would see that 107 Muswell Hill Road backs onto the Odeon cinema car park, which is surrounded by and on the fringe of residential properties.

Piped music from 8 a.m. to midnight is quite unsuitable for this area unless there is a strict proviso that (unlike the Covent Garden establishment) it cannot be heard outside the building.

Particularly in the summer months we all need our windows open both during the day and at night, and still need undisturbed sleep.

LOUD PIPED MUSIC SHOULD NOT BE USED TO ATTRACT CUSTOMERS TO THIS COMMERCIALY OUT-OF-THE-WAY site.

Cars leaving the car park until past midnight every day of the year will cause a great noise nuisance. I stress that this is a residential area with a working population, many with young children.

Words fail me at the thought of a clientele requiring alcohol at 8'o'clock in the morning. This is quite excessive.

The opening hours proposed for this establishment are quite unsuitable for this residential area, and I should like them to be reduced further than those suggested by Dr. Simpson at 2 Firs Avenue.

When I looked for the notices detailing these plans they were tied on two lampposts at a height where it was almost impossible to read them. The one which should have appeared on the contractor's screen was not replaced until I specifically asked for it, and then not where it was readily readable.

My objections are common sense.

I am writing to support local resident concerns about the following licence application:

Bills Restaurant, 107-109 Muswell Hill Road, N10 3HS

The location is in a densely populated area with many nearby properties occupied by young families. The late opening hours, the late requested hours for playing recorded music and the effect on neighbours of late hours for the use of the outside seating are of particular concern. I am also concerned about the effect of smoking from the outdoor seating that is in close proximity of bedroom windows in the vicinity.

I would request that restrictions are made on this application to reduce the effect of this application on surrounding residents. In particular the possible shortening of the evening hours, particularly with reference to the outside seating areas, appropriate sound-proofing to mitigate the disturbance from playing recorded music and a restriction on where smoking can take place so passive smoking does not endanger public health in surrounding properties.

I hope that Licensing Committee will take account of these concerns when considering this application.

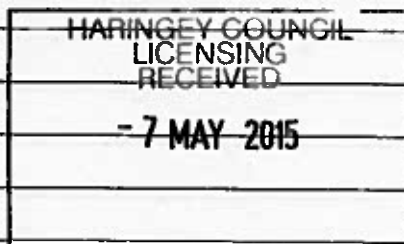

I live directly beside this newly constructed retail unit within 3 metres of their proposed outdoor seating and within 5 metres of the glazed restaurant.
I live here with my young family and have lived at this address for 29 years.
I have enjoyed the peace and quiet that this residential property offers and the fact my closest retail neighbour was previously located 10 meters away, closed at 5.30 pm and had no food and beverage licence.

I wish to object under the following licence objective. The prevention of public nuisance. The opening hours that bills have applied for are too late in the evening for this residential area.

Opening hours should be no later than 11.00pm in the evening.
The outdoor seating located within 3 metres of my property will create a lot of noise and disruption in the evenings. The number of outdoor seats should be restricted. Drinking outside without eating should not be permitted. Outdoor eating and drinking should be restricted, to no later than 8.00pm in the evening.
The recorded music should not be audible from our bedroom windows. The amount of opening glazing should be restricted to restrict noise pollution from the recorded music inside being heard out side the building.
We have a bedroom window within 5 meters of this retail unit. Noise is a big concern. There are residential flats located directly above and nearby this retail until that are currently unoccupied due to this development. These residential flats will be directly affected by the noise potentially generated by this licence application once they are occupied.

Whilst I support the restoration and improvements to the area of muswell hill I believe the licensing hours that have been applied for extend far too late into the evening and if this licence is approved under the present application the noise generated will have a very disturbing and detrimental affect on my established residential amenity and my children's well being.

Customers leaving Bills restaurant and parked in the rear car park will be walking within 2 meters of our bedroom windows and late in the evening this will be very noisy and disruptive.

We are also concerned these late hours and the outside customer seating will encourage customers to smoke and drink outside and this smoke will drift into our bedroom windows.

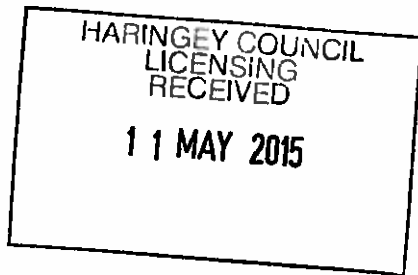

As a concerned resident and direct neighbour, I am writing to object in the strongest possible terms to the current licensing application by Bills Restaurant at no.107 Muswell Hill Road N10 3HS for:

1. Recorded music 8:00 am - Midnight Mon-Sun
2. Late night refreshments 11:00 pm - Midnight Mon-Sun
3. Supply of alcohol 10 am - Midnight Mon-Sun

This is a quiet residential area (not the West End), where people live and get up early in the morning; there are a number of nurseries and primary schools in the immediate vicinity of the proposed restaurant and a vast number of children - I have 3 under the age of 10.

I warmly recommend you inspect the site. In fact, I would be more than happy to accompany you, to show you how close the proposed restaurant is to our homes and bedroom windows.

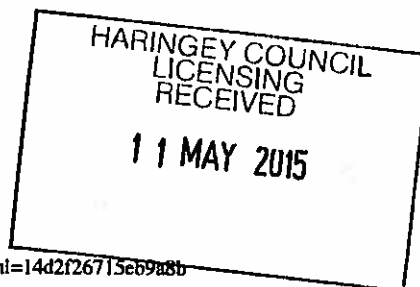

I am writing to express my serious concerns about the proposed premises licensing of Bill's restaurant at 107 Muswell Hill Road.

I have lived at 103 Muswell Hill Road for 20 years and have always enjoyed the quiet vicinity. It has been a safe environment in which to bring up my young son. A licensed premises next door which is serving alcohol and playing music until midnight seven days a week will have a considerable adverse impact on my quality of life, bringing the potential for crime and disorder into the local area.

I am concerned that my son's sleep and therefore his schooling will be affected as his room faces onto the main road and he will be disturbed by late night revellers leaving the premises. In addition, as I am a single parent I am concerned about the prospect of people leaving the premises and stumbling into my driveway and causing us unnecessary alarm. As well as the noise and anti-social behaviour issues there is also a further potential issue around littering.

Having a licensed premises so close by will have a detrimental impact on the value of my property and is not something that I am prepared to accept.

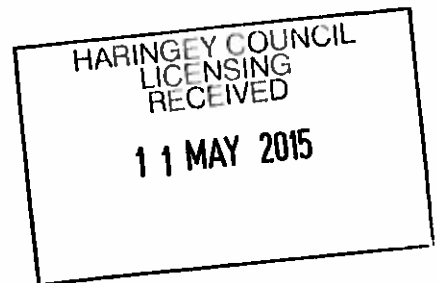
