HARINGEY PREVENT DELIVERY PLAN 2015/2016

Introduction

This document has been informed by the national strategy, the Counter Terrorism Local Profile (CTPL) supplied to the borough and by additional and current local intelligence.

National Context

The UK faces a range of terrorist threats which play out differently in each local authority area. Attention will be given to all forms of terrorism and violent extremism however the national priority is currently focused on preventing people from travelling to Syria. It is assumed from current research and experience that radicalisation is driven by ideology that sanctions the use of violence for particular ends.

Governance arrangements

The Haringey Prevent Delivery Group (HPDG) is made up of the following specified agencies and key strategic partners including Local Authority (Adult Services, Children and Young People's Service, Community Safety, North Middlesex and Whittington Hospitals, BEH Mental Health Trust, Homes for Haringey, Police Service (local), Prevent Engagement Officers (SO15), Fire Service, Probation Service, College of HENEL. The Group meets four times a year and has previously met on an emergency basis following local or national incidents. The delivery group has an agreed TOR and reports quarterly to the Haringey Community Safety Partnership whose membership comprises of elected members, service directors and key stakeholders from across the borough who provide a strategic overview and oversight for the key community safety outcomes for Haringey.

Analysis of Threats and Vulnerabilities

We would summarise the current key threats and vulnerabilities as follows:

Primary concerns:

- **Syria:** Residual concerns over individuals travelling to Syria. Sizeable support amongst local community re aid for Syrian humanitarian crisis. Dialogue with community representatives suggests no evidence of aid convoys leaving Haringey although some fundraising has occurred.
- **Syria:** London wide concern about young females being targeted to travel to Syria to become brides for jihadis. This has been highlighted by the issues pertaining to Tower Hamlets Academy.
- Syria: Concerns that individuals from the Kurdish community are motivated to travel to Syria to fight against ISIL.
- There has been a noticeable increase in referrals through to the Prevent Case Management function. This underlines the increased prominence of Prevent in the public arena and the impact of upcoming legislation.
- Visits by extremists to the borough to raise their profile and gain support. There has been limited activity but there have been instances
 where Al Mahajiroun (ALM) have set up stalls in Haringey. A high profile incident took place in March which led to disorder between
 Kurdish and ALM members.
- A significant Somali community presence within the borough with signs of social exclusions and disengagement from mainstream
 education and youth based activities. There is concern regarding a small but significant group of Somali young men either involved in
 local street gangs or entering the CJS and their vulnerability to radicalisation resulting from exiting gang involvement or from
 radicalisation whilst in YOI
- Emergence of Eastern European (Polish) Far Right Neo Nazi activity in S. Tottenham (Seven Sisters ward) resulting in incident in Markfield Park June 2014.
- Haringey is home to a diverse Jewish community which contains a highly visible Charedi/ Orthodox community in the Seven Sisters
 ward in S. Tottenham. There have been community safety concerns raised from within the Jewish community following attacks in Paris
 and Brussels. Which have compounded by an Anti-Semitic attack on the local Synagogue and a Far Right rally in the neighbouring
 borough of Hackney
