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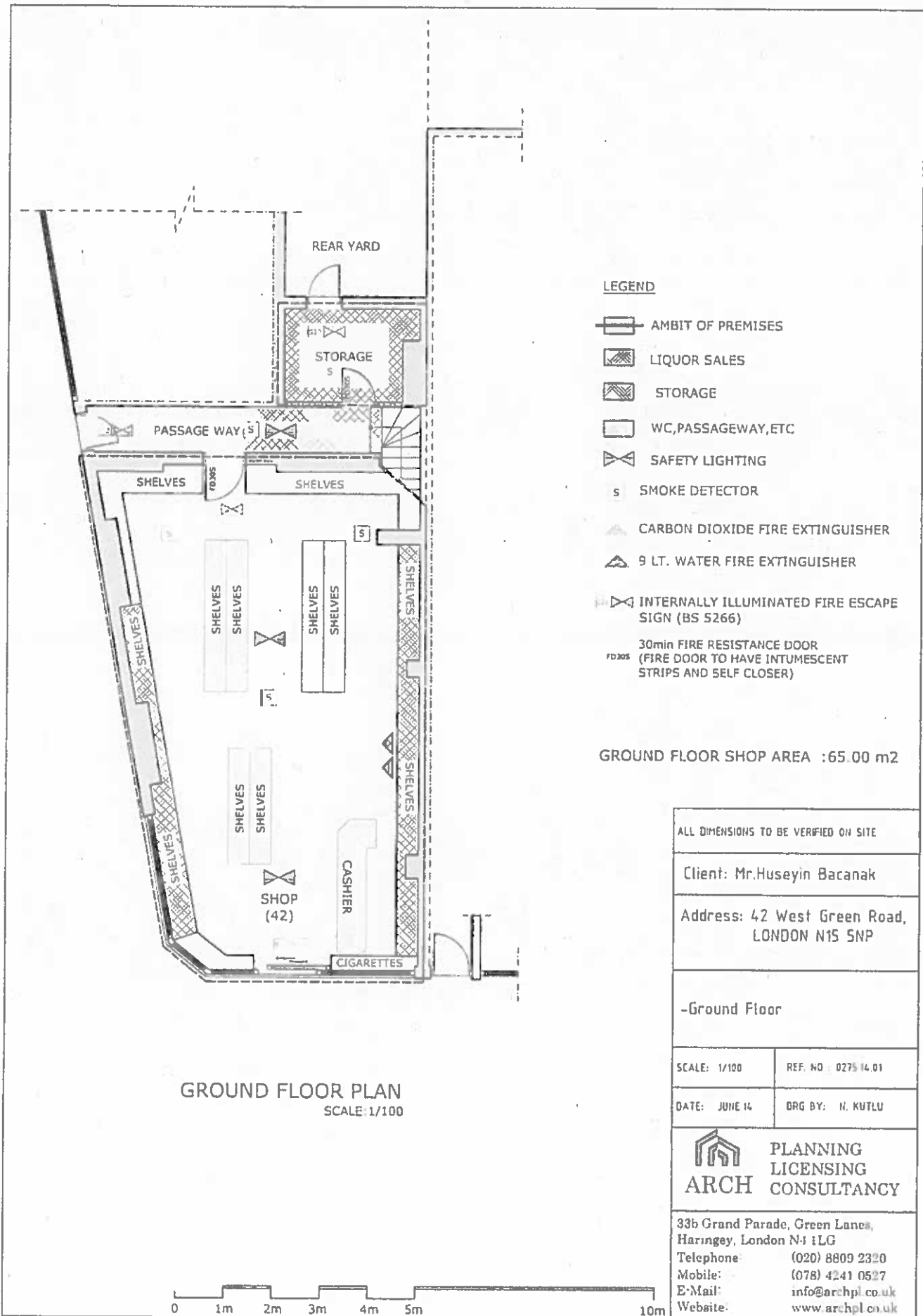

(2) Supply of alcohol: No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

(3) The second condition is that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Additional Mandatory Conditions in relation to Supply of Alcohol

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

THE PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER

- A CCTV system will be installed, operated and maintained at the premises.
- Cameras must be sited to observe the entrance door, the alcohol display and floor area.
- Cameras on the entrances must capture full frame shots of the heads and shoulders of all people entering the premises i.e. capable of identification.
- Cameras viewing till areas must capture frames not less than 50% of screen.
- Cameras overlooking floor areas will be wide angled to give an overview of the premises.
- Cameras will capture a minimum of 16 frames per second.
- Be capable of visually confirming the nature of the crime committed.
- Provide a linked record of the date, time and place of any image.
- Provide good quality images-colour during opening times.
- Operate under existing light levels within and outside the premises.
- Have a monitor to review images and recorded quality.
- Be regularly maintained to ensure continuous quality of image capture and retention.
- Have signage displayed in the customer area to advise that CCTV is in operation
- Digital images must be kept for 31 days. The equipment must have a suitable export method, e.g. CD/DVD writer so the Police can make an evidential copy of the data they require. This data will be in the native file format, to ensure that no image quality is lost when making the copy. If this format is non-standard (i.e. manufacturer proprietary) then the manufacturer should supply the replay software to ensure that the video on the CD can be replayed by the Police on a standard computer. Copies will be made available to Police on request.
- Licensee will not stock super strength beers lagers and ciders with a volume above 6.5 ABV.
- The Licensee will ensure that the street drinkers in the area are not sold alcohol from the premises thereby further exacerbating the problems being experienced along the street.

PUBLIC SAFETY

- Emergency lights and fire extinguishers will be installed.

THE PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

- No alcohol will be consumed by the public in or outside the premises.
- All occasions when persons have been refused service, this will be recorded in a refusal book, which will be kept on the premises for no less than 12 months.
- Signage will be displayed at the point of exit advising customers leave the premises quietly.
- Deliveries to the premises will only be made during normal working hours.

THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN

- Alcohol will only be sold by the DPS or person authorised by the DPS at all times.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

All staff selling alcohol will be trained in the role by the DPS with regular refresher training. Records of training will be kept and made available for examining officers of the relevant authorities.

Persons who appear under the age of 21 photographic ID will be required, if not provided the sale of alcohol will be refused.

Alcohol may only be sold to individuals over the age of 18 with valid proof of identification with one of the following:

- A valid passport
- A photo driving licence issued in a European Union Country
- A proof of age standard card system
- A citizen card, supported by the Home Office

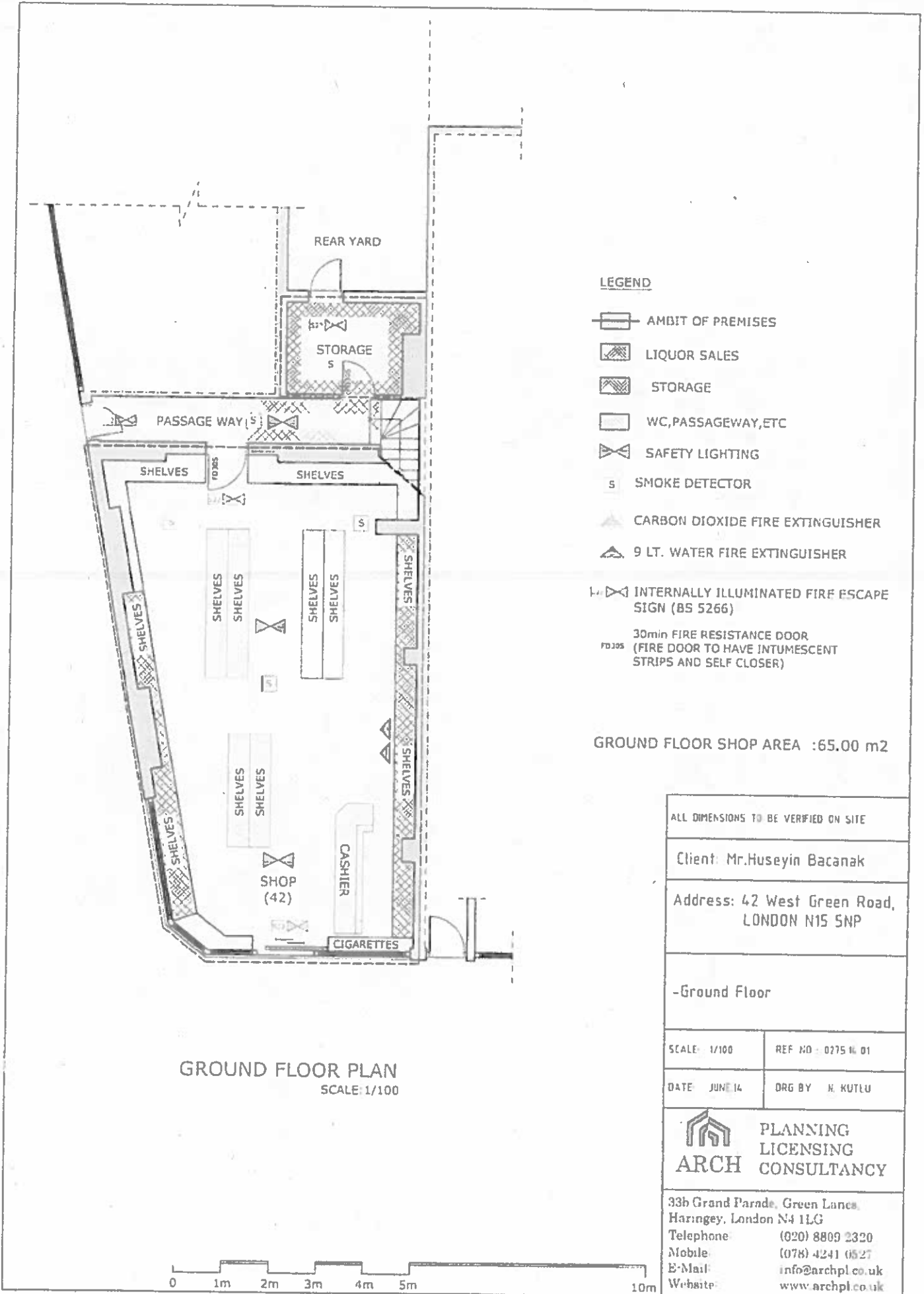
Suitable signage will be displayed at the point of entry and at the service area advising customers that the premises operates the "Challenge 21" proof of age scheme.

This venue has applied to vary its times authorised to sell alcohol from the present:

Monday - Saturday 0800 - 0200 Sunday 0800 - 0100 to

Monday - Sunday 24 hour sales.

The venue also wishes to remove a Condition stating: 'Licensee will not stock super strength beers lagers and ciders with a volume above 6.5 ABV.'

The area where this venue is situated is known for anti-social behaviour caused by street drinkers resulting in it being designated an Alcohol Control Zone. Police consider that whilst they must be proportionate with regards allowing a business to thrive they must be equally proportionate in not allowing a business to risk contributing to crime / disorder and anti-social behaviour. In this case Police consider it reasonable and proportionate that the venue does not sell beers, lagers and ciders with a volume above 6.5 ABV which still allows the sale of the vast majority of such products but prevents the sale of a very small group of products generally associated with heavy / street drinkers.

With regards the authorisation to sell alcohol from 0200 hours until the present start of 0800 hours Police feel that persons frequenting the venue to purchase alcohol after 0200 may well be already alcohol fuelled from other 'On License' venues or previously consuming alcohol in the street or residential premises. The basic consideration is the requirement for the ability for members of the public to purchase alcohol in the early hours of the morning, in this case between 0200 and 0800, compared to the risk of increased drunkenness affecting others suffering crime / disorder and anti-social behaviour.

Whilst Police accept there are other venues selling alcohol throughout the night they do not consider that a blanket justification for nearby venues to be given the same authorised hours. In this case Police feel the ability to serve alcohol, including beers /

cidars up to 6.5% ABV until 0200 hours is sufficient in the attempt to balance alcohol related crime / disorder with a venue thriving financially.

Dear Sirs,

We are making representation in regard to your application for variation to the premises licence for 42 West Green Road London, N15.

In determining what conditions are appropriate, it will be necessary to consider the individual circumstances of the premises, including:-

- The nature and style of the venue,
- The activities being conducted there,
- The location, and,
- Anticipated clientele.

We would particularly like to remind applicants of their existing legal obligations regarding:-

- Irresponsible Drinks Promotions,
 - Selling alcohol to a person who is drunk, and
 - Underage sales
- Fire Risk Assessments.

Licensees and premises supervisors are also reminded of the offence of selling alcohol to a person who is drunk, and to ensure that all staff are aware of the consequences.

You are seeking the ability to remove the conditions related to beers/ciders and lagers being sold below 6.5% ABV. We would not support this request and consider it a necessary action in promoting the licensing objectives due to the wider community issues with street drinking in the area.

Alcohol harm and violence where alcohol is a contributing factor is high in the West Green Road area.

Also on a recent late night visit to the premises we observed the types of sale being carried out and the practices being put in place and compliance with existing licence conditions. At no time throughout the visit did I witness any questions/challenge to customer seeking proof of age verification when alcohol or cigarettes were being sold.

We therefore feel that the current times of operation and the existing conditions need to be adhered to and promoted by the licensee before we are able to consider extending the hours of the licence.
