



Late-night premises licence application: Mezzo, 64 Grand Parade, N4 1AF Applying for Mon-Sunday 07.00 -02.00 late-night café and provision of live and recorded music, dancing etc.

### 1 INTRODUCTION

The Ladder Community Safety Partnership (LCSP) contains representatives of Neighbourhood Watches and Residents' Associations both from the 'Ladder' roads, and in Green Lanes itself. We are an independent group, although working in partnership with Haringey Council and the Metropolitan Police where appropriate.

We are writing to you as members of the LCSP to oppose this application.

We believe that in the context of the well known problems in the area, granting a licence for the activities and hours requested would be against the general principles of Haringey's Licencing Policy and specifically under the following headings:

- The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- Public Safety
- Prevention of Public Nuisance

We are concerned, in particular, at the issues surrounding the prevention of public nuisance, in the light of the applicant's request for live music and dancing until 1.30am daily and the late-night refreshment both indoors and outdoors until 2am daily.

More information on why we believe the Committee should reject this application is provided under appropriate headings below.

# 2 REASONS FOR OBJECTING

- (a) Relevant sections of the Borough's Licensing Policy/Objectives
  We believe the following statements in the Borough's Licensing Policy 2008 support our objections:
- 'the Council considers that licensing law plays a key role in both preventing and controlling ... anti-social behaviour ... by regulating and applying conditions to affect the number, location and hours of premises' [2.7]
- 'this licensing policy statement is intended to support the Antisocial Behaviour
   Strategy by reducing the impact of drink related antisocial behaviour and the
   environmental crimes and nuisance that can be associated with licensed premises'
   [7.12]
- 'the council will have special regard to the local impact of licensing on related crime and disorder ... particularly when concerning location, impact, operation and management of all proposed licenses, applications, renewals and variations of conditions' [8.6]
- 'licensed premises, especially those operating late at night and in the early hours of the morning, can cause a wide range of nuisances that can impact on the people living, working or sleeping in the vicinity of the licensed premises. The Council is committed to protecting the residents in the vicinity of these licensed premises.'
  [14.1]
- 'in particular, late night activities cause much of this nuisance. Late night cafes ... can have a number of adverse effects on the residents in the vicinity of these premises.

  Nuisance such as noise, litter, anti-social behaviour, lights and odour all contribute to the loss of amenity to the general public' [14.2]
- 'noise nuisance is of particular concern' [14.3]
- 'the potential for additional crime and disorder and/or public nuisance is increased with longer hours.' [19.1]
- 'operating hours between 23.00 and 07.00 are considered to give greater potential for noise nuisance' [19.3]

#### (b) Licensing Hours

In the light of the above statements and of the licensing objectives in general, we believe that a daily closing time of 2.00am is very late for ordinary weekday evenings, after which most residents will have to get up early to go to work. However, our major concerns are with the issues of live music daily until 1.30am and the outdoor late-night refreshment daily until 2am.

We believe that these are unreasonable propositions, given the location of the premises in the heart of one of the most densely populated residential areas in the borough.

# (c) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

We have seen the comments relating to the prevention of crime and disorder put forward by the applicant. Although helpful, they consist solely of comments on CCTV. We would like to highlight some of the provisions recommended by the Council on p30 of the Licensing Policy:

- are there policies/methods to deal with the arrival of intoxicated patrons and/or persons under the influence of illegal drugs?
- are patrons prevented from drinking alcohol brought onto the premises?
- are there procedures to deal with violence and anti-social behaviour?
- are there methods to discourage the drinking of alcohol in a public place in the vicinity of the premises?
- do staff have training in crime prevention measures?
- what risk assessment procedures are in place?

## (d) Public Safety

We are pleased to see the measures proposed by the applicant regarding public safety. however, there is no reference to a Health and Safety statement or to capacity limits, whether to prevent overcrowding or to help prevent noise nuisance when leaving the premises. We assume that staff will be adequately supervised and trained in all emergency procedures, especially evacuation.

### (e) Prevention of Public Nuisance

We welcome the statement that 'signs will be installed to remind customers to respect neighbours and leave quietly'. However, some further questions remain unanswered, in particular:

- what measures are proposed to prevent noise and vibration escaping from the
  premises, including live music, noise from ventilation equipment and human voices?
  How can noise be prevented from customers who are taking late night refreshment
  outdoors until 2am?
- apart from signs, what steps will be taken, or proposed, to prevent disturbances by customers arriving at, or leaving, the premises? (the Policy states that 'there will be greater responsibilities placed on premises operating between 23.00 and 07.00 than at other times of the day')
- the actions necessary to prevent disturbance from deliveries or collections at early or late hours, or staff cleaning up after closing time?
- the provision to properly extract and disperse odours and smells from cooking by properly installed and maintained ventilation equipment? There seem to have been complaints in the past.
- the steps taken, or proposed, to prevent littering and fouling of public and open spaces
   what specific measures are proposed by the business? This is particularly important if the premises also advertises a take-away service
- the arrangement for storage and disposal of trade waste would the very long hours sought by the applicant lead to increased waste storage and disposal problems?
- the arrangements for cleansing and keeping clean the vicinity of the premises this

will include litter, refuse and other items originating from the premises and fouling caused by customers.

The Borough's Licensing Policy points out the special importance of these issues after 23.00 and in residential areas. (See 14.1-14.3; 19.3 and Appendix 3 of the Licensing Policy).

### 3. CONCLUSION

We believe that the above points need to be clarified by the Licensing Committee and clearly specified in any licence granted.

Our comments and objections obviously make clear that residents are very concerned at the possible implications of a 19 hour daily licence for these premises, particularly because of the likely noise nuisance from live music and outdoor refreshment. Above all, have the owners taken sufficient measures to provide adequate sound insulation? We would therefore urge the Licensing Sub-committee to support a balanced decision bearing in mind both the concerns of local residents and the needs of the present applicant to continue to operate a successful business.

In the light of these concerns, we would urge the Licensing Sub-Committee to consider several different solutions, including either earlier closing times on Sunday-Thursday (when residents need a good night's sleep before work the next day) or granting the proposed hours but limiting music, dance and outdoor refreshment to no later than midnight (Sun-Thurs), on the understanding that neither is accompanied by any increase in noise nuisance etc. We believe that these proposals may be a workable way forward for residents and applicant alike

#### Dear Ms Barrett

I am the owner of a house only three houses away from the above premises and it has been brought to my attention that Mezzo Café was putting an application for a change of license including live and recorded music, dancing, performances as well as providing food and drinks indoors and outdoors until 2am daily.

- 1 The premises back onto a residential area of quiet gardens owned by families with young children and old people. Having people drinking, dancing, making music and noise until 2am 7 days a week is not acceptable, especially is this is taking place outside.
- 2 The extended hours will also increase the noise pollution caused by people leaving the premises, in particular those rejoining cars parked at the Green Lanes end of Stanhope Gardens. At 2am, even a normal conversation taking place in the street will ruin the sleep of people in the houses nearby. The noise of doors closing, engine starting, cars reversing will be equally disturbing to those who live there.
- 3 The mews area at the rear of Mezzo and adjacent shops is often littered with rubbish, empty, broken bottles and generally feels unsafe at night. The extended drinking hours will make this area even more unsafe and dirty.

Given the reasons expressed above, I object to the License being granted.

I also would also like to point out that the notice of the licensing application has not been posted outside the premises and that may invalidate the application on technical grounds.

#### Dear Daliah

I would like to lodge my strongest objection to the licensing application submitted by Mezzo Care, 64 Grand Parade.

As a resident of Stanhope Gardens (owner of No. 5), I believe such a plan by Mezzo would significantly impinge on the quality of life of the entire neighbourhood.

Already, we have a problem with anti-social behaviour on the corner of Stanhope Gardens and Grand Parade, and in the rear of the Mezzo Cafe. Encountering individuals, loitering, urinating, smoking, or consuming alcohol is a regular feature of my nightly return from work. This results in an intimidating environment for the women, children and elderly residents of the street.

As the rear of the Cafe backs directly onto the gardens of the homes along Stanhope Gardens, noise levels would be unacceptable.

Traffic and parking are already very congested in the area. This would be further exaggerated by the granting of a late night license.

In terms of the Cafe itself, I have seem some very disturbing examples of health violations from this establishment including: the preparation of unrefrigerated meat on a table, outside the rear of the premises; rotting food piling up outside the 'kitchen' door; a bag of rotting meat being dumped in my front lawn (upon investigation, similar bags of the same meat were piled at the back of the cafe).

Grand Parade has a fairly chequered past, and given the frequent changes of appearance and abuses of simple health guidelines by the owners of this establishment, I would be very disturbed if the Cafe were to be granted even further freedoms by the Haringey Council.

Dear Daliah,

I am extremely concerned to hear of the late-licence application of the Mezzo Café (64 Grand Parade, Green Lanes N4).

As a house-owner on Stanhope Gardens, I would actually question whether management should be allowed to operate on their current basis, without extending the ill side-effects of their business. I frequently see uncooked meat left by the garage entrance at the back and there are nearly always kitchen staff lingering around the back smoking cigarettes and leaving butt ends on the ground. The level of hygiene is questionable and to suggest encouraging the additional nuisance of noise in a residential area surely will not be tolerated.

The idea that the establishment should be allowed to serve 'refreshments' until 2am is absolutely unacceptable and I assure you I will go to every length to block this application. Like many of my neighbours, I moved to this area to settle down and have children. It would be impossible to contain the noise levels of amplified live music proposed until 1.30am. For children and parents needing to sleep well before 11pm, this surely must be out of the question. It would be wholly anti-social and unfair on the local residents to allow the café to effectively become a nightclub on our doorsteps. We already have to cope with the disturbance of patrons lingering on the street which can be very unsettling after dark as it is. That is while the activities are supposedly contained inside, but we can at least block unnecessary, additional noise of evening drinkers outside, by our homes.

I am happy to say that so far, I have found Haringey Council to be very supportive and I do hope that you will not let us down on this occasion. We have the opportunity to maintain some dignity and respect for families in the area and I truly hope we will be listened to in this consultation process.

If you would like to discuss my absolute objection to this application at any stage, please do not hesitate to contact me. I will post a copy of this letter to you first class today with my signature. I would appreciate acknowledgement of my concerns and assurance that the rights of the residents will be taken as the first consideration in considering this application.
