Cuts to local policing

This Council acknowledges:

- The importance of local policing
- The concerns of local residents about the Metropolitan Police's plans to scrap all 1000 Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs) working in neighbourhoods across London, including Haringey.
- The significant reduction in PCSOs is likely to have a serious impact on neighbourhood policing and police visibility, as well as community relations with the police.

This Council notes:

- The Metropolitan Police Service has borne the brunt of the Conservative
 Government's cuts to public services. It is estimated that between 2010 and
 2020 the Metropolitan Police Service will have been forced to save £1.4 billion
 from their budget
- Slashing the budget of the Met so far has led to:
 - Over 5,655 uniformed officers (PCs and PCSOs) being cut from the boroughs of London
 - A 74% reduction in neighbourhood PCSOs due to the restructure of neighbourhood policing under Boris Johnson, which reduced numbers of officers and PCSOs per ward from 6 to just 2.
 - o the loss of 63 police stations across London
 - o A 4% rise in total offences in London
- There are now 600 Police Officers in Haringey which is 132 less than in 2010 and just 26 PCSOs compared to 86 in 2010
- The impact that the loss of these officers will have on the local community and the Safer Neighbourhood Teams in Haringey.
- That Caroline Pidgeon the Liberal Democrat Assembly Member has launched a petition against the proposals which has already been supported by thousands of Londoners.

The Council resolves:

- To oppose the Metropolitan Police's plans to cut the number of PCSOs in London, including Haringey.
- To call on the Conservative Mayor of London to intervene and stop the cuts to Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs) numbers in Haringey and across the capital.
- To write to Labour London Assembly Member for Enfield and Haringey,
 Joanne McCartney AM to ask her to continue fighting these cuts her role as
 Chair of the Police and Crime Committee on the Greater L:ondon Assembly
