2 Recommendations

There is no recommendation, but in considering the representations received and what is appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, the steps the Sub-Committee can take are:

- Grant the variation as requested
- Grant the variation whilst imposing additional conditions and/or altering in any way the proposed operating schedule.
- Exclude any licensable activities to which the application relates
- Reject the whole or part of the application
- 2.1 Members of the licensing sub committee are asked to note that they may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely becaus it considers it desirable to do so. It must be appropriate in order to promote the licensing objectives.

3. Background

- 3.1 During the consultation period letters of representation were received from a resident concerned that the later hours being sought would lead the premses to attract people who are already inebriated and lead to anti social behaviour and thereby lead to noise nulsance. Residents are concerned that the later hours being sought will lead to the area becoming a magnet for anti social behaviour and nulsance.
- 3.2 The representation from the Licensing Authority is requesting alternative hours are granted for the rear external area so that the objective of public nuisance can be promoted and upheld and that the hours for the new licence remain the same as the previous licence issued.
- 3.2 Under the Act representations can be received from responsible authorities or other persons. Representations must be relevant and, in the case of another person, must not be frivolous or vexatious.
- 3.3 The Licensing Authority considers that restrictions may be made to the proposed hours of use where, after receiving relevant representations, the council considers it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives to do so. The council will take into account the existing pattern of licensed premises in an area when considering what is appropriate to promote the objectives. Applications which are significantly out of character for a locality will need to demonstrate that granting the hours sought will not impact on the licensing objectives, given the potential for neighbouring premises to be adversely impacted.

4. Policy Implications

4.1 The decision should be made with regard to the Secretary of the State's guidance and the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy under the Licensing Act 2003. Where the decision departs from either the Guidance or the Policy clear and cogent reasons must be given. Members should be aware that If such a departure is made the risk of appeal / challenge is increased.

4.2 Equitles Impact

At the time of writing this report there were no implications for equality and diversity. Any decision taken by the Licensing Sub-Committee will be in



accordance with the four licensing objectives as prescribed by the Licensing Act 2003.



1. Introduction

I am writing to you on behalf of the local community in my capacity as elected Chair of both the Ladder Community Safety Partnership (LCSP) and the Harringay Ward Police Panel. The LCSP is an umbrella organisation containing many individual members, but also representatives of Neighbourhood Watches and Residents' Associations throughout the Ward, including Green Lanes. We are an independent group, although we work in partnership with many other key stakeholders to improve the quality of life for local people. The Police Panel obviously works closely with our local officers and sets priorities which aim to keep the area safe, and free from crime, anti-social behaviour and other nuisances.

As local residents, we are opposed to the very late hours of this application, an issue which we discussed at our recent monthly meeting. We believe that granting a licence for the activities and hours requested would be against the general principles of Haringey's Licensing Policy 2016-21 and specifically under the following headings

- the Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- the Prevention of Public Nuisance

We are particularly concerned about the proposed very late daily opening hours (to 03.00 daily).

More information on why we believe the Committee should reject this application as it stands is provided under appropriate headings, below.

2. Reasons for Objecting

(a) Location

We welcome the statement in the Licensing Policy that the Council 'will work with residents' associations and other community groups to ensure that Haringey residents have a real say over the development and operation of licensed premises in their neighbourhoods' (p6)

In this context, the location of the premises in our neighbourhood is very important. Although it is in Green Lanes, there are three storeys of flats both directly above and adjacent to the venue, as it is a terraced block. There is similar residential accommodation in the three storeys of flats above the commercial property opposite the venue, in the west side of Green Lanes. Finally, there are numerous houses and flats directly behind the site, at the end of Stanhope Gardens, which is entirely residential. Large numbers of residents will therefore be affected by those arriving at, and leaving, the premises in the early hours of the morning, when ambient noise levels in Green Lanes are far lower. This is not only because traffic is obviously far lighter, but also because the proposed very late daily closure of 3am is later than anywhere else in Green Lanes, which is well known for its restaurants and bars.

The Council clearly shares these concerns about very late opening hours as the Licensing Policy states that, while each case will be judged on its merits, 'there will be a presumption that permitted hours for the sale of alcohol will be restricted to between 8am and 11.30pm on Sunday to Thursday and 8am to midnight on Friday and Saturday in respect of premises in residential areas ...' (para 7, p11).

(b) Prevention of Crime and Disorder

(c) Prevention of Public Nuisance

We have serious concerns about the potential for public nuisance and anti-social behaviour both in the vicinity of the premises and in the surrounding area. Because the proposed closing time is later that any comparable premises anywhere in Green Lanes, there is a very real likelihood that customers who have already consumed more than enough will aim to continue their drinking at this venue, after others have closed, arriving and leaving noisily in the small hours of the morning.

in the case of Sunday to Thursday evenings, the proposed closing time of 3am will have a devastating impact on many local residents, trying to sleep and then having to get up for work or school only a few hours after the venue closes!

The Council clearly shares these concerns about very late opening hours as the Licensing Policy states that, while each case will be judged on its merits, 'there will be a presumption that permitted hours for the sale of alcohol will be restricted to between 8am and 11.30pm on Sunday to Thursday and 8am to midnight on Friday and Saturday in respect of premises in residential areas ...' (para 7, p11).

in addition we are surprised to see that there is no reference to the use of the area to the rear of the premises, which is currently used for smoking. As the area obviously has the potential to cause

considerable noise nuisance to residents, we would urge that the restriction in the previous licence be maintained, ie

'The conservatory at the rear of the premises shall not be used at any time other than as a smoking area (if permitted by the Public Health Act 2006). The door to the area shall be closed at 2300 hours with no customers permitted to enter/exit except as required as an emergency exit'

Similarly, in order to prevent undue noise nuisance from live and amplified music, we strongly support the condition in the previous premises licence stating:

'Live music is to be restricted to no more than two artists performing at any one time and the performance of music shall be located in the front part of the premises not beyond the stairs to the mezzanine floor. No amplified music at any time or live music after midnight'.

Both these conditions should therefore be transferred to any new licence.

3. Conclusion

The proposed opening hours are later than any other similar establishment in the whole of Harringay Green Lanes. It would be totally unacceptable to allow the venue to remain open until 3am daily.

Therefore we strongly urge the Committee to rein back the proposed opening hours. This would be in the interest not only of local residents but of Green Lanes as a whole: none of us would wish to attract a late-night drinking clientele into our area.

Finally, we are only too well aware of the problems which faced Green Lanes in the past when a latenight culture led to serious and violent crime and unrest. It is absolutely crucial that we should move forward with a tightly regulated night-time economy which balances law and order, and residents' quality of life, with the need for thriving businesses in our High Street.

I am writing because as a resident living at the rear of the above premises, I am deeply concerned about their application to open until 3am and to play live and recorded music until 2am, 7 days a week.

My house is _houses away from the open sided smoking area at the rear of Mezzo. Until its recent closure for refurbishment I could hear conversations from customers every night. I can only imagine how disturbing this must have been for people in the houses closer to Mezzo and for those living In the flats above. Fortunately this noise stopped around 11 pm and it Is my understanding that their license did not allow for the use of the smoking area after that time and any music was forbidden at all times.

I am also worried about that amplified music will now leak through the open sided smoking area and into the private gardens at the rear. This would be totally unacceptable after 11pm, in particular Sunday to Thursday when young children who have to get up early to go to school tend to sleep in the bedrooms overlooking the gardens. This is the case in my house.

I am also deeply worried that the new late music and opening hours of up to 3 am are way beyond those in operation on Green Lanes and will be a magnet for late night drinking and potential trouble making, notwithstanding the noise made by people leaving and returning to their cars in our entirely residential street, Stanhope Gardens. What is bearable at 10pm, would ruin my sleep at 1am or later.

I therefore urge the Council not to allow the proposed closing time of 3am and to follow its own guidelines in respect of premises in residential areas.

Hello,

I am writing on behalf on the St Ann's Safer Neighbourhoods Ward Panel. We work closely with our local police team setting priorities which aim to keep the area safe and free from crime, anti-social behaviour and other nuisances.

We discussed this application at our meeting last night (14 November) and the Panel was opposed to the very late hours proposed by the applicants. There is a generally accepted norm on Green Lanes of licensing until midnight during the week and up to 2.00am on Friday and Saturday. We do not support any variation to this norm.

We are concerned about the potential for public nuisance and anti-social behaviour both in the vicinity of the premises and in the surrounding area. Because the proposed closing time is later that any comparable premises in the vicinity, it seems highly likely that customers will transfer to this venue when other nearby premises close. The result of this will be that customers who have already been drinking elsewhere will continue drinking at this venue, arriving and leaving noisily in the small hours of the morning. In the case of Sunday to Thursday evenings, the proposed closing time of 3am will have a devastating impact on many local residents (some of whom live above the premises), trying to sleep and then having to get up for work or school early in the morning.

We would also like to see the previous license restrictions regarding the rear smoking area and live music maintained, again for the benefit of those living near the premises.

We urge the Committee, should they choose to grant the application, to rein the opening hours back to those stated above and to retain the restrictions mentioned in the previous paragraph.

I am writing on behalf of the Gardens Residents Association (GRA), a well established award winning organisation which represents the views and concerns of residents who live on Stanhope, Portland, Doncaster, Rutland, Roseberry, Chesterfield, Kimberley, Warwick and Cleveland Gardens as well as the flats above the shops of Grand Parade, Green Lanes. The GRA aims to improve the quality of life for all who live in the Gardens area.

Which is why residents have expressed their deep worries about the proposed very late night opening hours of the above premises to 3am.

We believe that granting a licence for the activities and hours requested would be against the general principles of Haringey's Licensing Policy 2016-21 and specifically under the following headings

- the Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- the Prevention of Public Nuisance

Residents in the flats above or with houses at the rear of the premises are most at risk of noise disturbances

In this context, the location of the premises in our neighbourhood is very important. Although it is in Green Lanes, there are three storeys of flats both directly above and adjacent to the venue, as it is a terraced block. There are numerous houses and flats directly behind the site, at the end of Stanhope Gardens, which is entirely residential. Residents at the end of Rutland Gardens with houses on the south side will also be affected. Bedrooms are normally located on the upper floors and particularly sensitive to noise escaping from the premises.

It is therefore of a great concern that the open sided smoking area at the rear of the premises are not mentioned in this application. In the previous license which was in operation until a few weeks ago, it was stated that

'The conservatory at the rear of the premises shall not be used at any time other than as a smoking area (if permitted by the Public Health Act 2006). The door to the area shall be closed at 2300 hours with no customers permitted to enter/exit except as required as an emergency exit' clearly recognising the great risk for local residents.

Similarly in order to prevent undue noise nuisance from live and amplified music, we strongly support the condition in the previous premises licence stating:

'Live music is to be restricted to no more than two artists performing at any one time and the performance of music shall be located in the front part of the premises not beyond the stairs to the mezzanine floor. No amplified music at any time or live music after midnight'.

Both these conditions should therefore be transferred to any new licence.

Large numbers of residents will be also be affected by those arriving at, and leaving, the premises in the early hours of the morning, when ambient noise levels in Green Lanes and the surrounding side streets are at their lowest.

We have serious concerns about the potential for public nuisance and anti-social behaviour both in the vicinity of the premises and in the surrounding area. Because the proposed closing time is later that any comparable premises anywhere in Green Lanes, there is a very real likelihood that customers who have already consumed more than enough will aim to continue their drinking at this venue, after others have closed, arriving and leaving noisily in the small hours of the morning.

The Committee should be reminded that metal gates at the entrance of the alley at the rear of the premises must remain closed after dark. This measure was imposed on the owners of the various shops sharing it, in order to prevent antisocial behaviour in that area following the opening of Mezzo in 2008. The gates have proved largely successful in removing the direct link between the open sided smoking area and Stanhope Gardens, as well as reducing the frequency of urinating, littering and other unpleasant manners in that area. It is essential that they should be retained.

A deceitful application

The concerns raised by residents were based on the impression that Mezzo as we have known it since 2008 was applying for longer trading hours. As of today it has become clear that Mezzo is knocking two shop units together: Mezzo at 64 Grand Parade and the former Chinese Medicinal shop at 63 Grand Parade. No indication has been given to the general public that Mezzo would be more than doubling in size. Indeed the Planning department of Haringey Council has not been informed. Two units are being brought together, party walls are knocked through, change of use Class of 63 Grand Parade is being carried out, all without planning permission, all without a planning application being even lodged.

This new development raises even more issues about the open sided smoking area which was discussed above. The sketch submitted to the Licensing Team does not permit to establish where the walls at the rear of the new Mezzo are intended to be. What part of the ambit of the Licensed premises is solid wall and roof, what part is surrounded by fencing? where is the limit between the closed and open spaces and what is it made of? Should we assume the premises are entirely closed in with walls and ceilings with an emergency exit at the back?

The previous licence did not allow for tables and seats to be located in the open sided smoking area, nor were drinks allowed to be sold or served. It was a place to have a cigarette, never to have a meal or a drink.

This condition should also be transferred to any new licence.

The residents will never accept the creation of a licensed patio just 3 meters away from the nearest bedroom windows. Not at 3am, not at 11pm, not at 3pm.

We therefore urge the Committee to reject this application.

Because the proposed closing time is later than any other comparable premises anywhere on Green Lanes, there is a very real likelihood that customers who have already consumed alcohol will aim to continue their drinking at the venue after others have closed, arriving and leaving noisily in the small hours of the morning.

In the case of Sunday to Thursday evenings, the proposed closing time of 3am will have a detrimental effect on residents who will be trying to sleep and then having to get up for work.

In addition there is no reference to the use of the area to the rear of the premises which is currently used for smoking. This area has the potential to cause considerable noise nuisance to residents particularly in the summer months and I feel the restrictions in the previous licence should be maintained.

Equally, in order to prevent undue noise nuisance from live and amplified music, I strongly support the condition in the previous premises licence.

Therefore both these conditions should be transferred to any new licence.

The proposed opening hours are later than other similar establishments in the whole of Harringay Green Lanes. It would be unacceptable to allow this venue to remain open until 3am daily.

I strongly urge the committee to rein back the proposed opening hours. This would be in the interest not only of local residents but of Green Lanes as a whole. In the past Green lanes had many problems associated with a late night culture: serious and violent crime and unrest. The night time economy should be tightly regulated which balances law and order and residents quality of like with the need for businesses.

I am writing because as a resident living at the rear of the above premises, I am deeply concerned about their application to open until 3am and to play live and recorded music until 2am, 7 days a week.

My accommodation is only a few meters away from the open sided smoking area at the rear of Mezzo. Until its recent closure for refurbishment I could hear conversations from customers every night. Fortunately this would stop at 11pm and there was no music as it was not allowed by their license.

What was acceptable at 10pm would be unbearable at 2 or 3 in the morning when the residential gardens at the back of Green Lanes are so quiet.

I am also worried about the noise made by customers as they leave the restaurant and go back to their cars in our entirely residential street, Stanhope Gardens. Again what is bearable at 10pm, would ruin my sleep at 2am or later. This is particularly disruptive given I have a young baby, who may then need to be re-settled.

I therefore urge the Council not to allow the proposed closing time of 3am and to follow its own guidelines in respect of premises in residential areas.

We have read the application submitted for Mezzo 63-64 Grand Parade Green Lanes, and note that the operating schedule does not mention how the noise and the potential public nuisance will be adequately addressed. We have concerns with the external area and offer reduced hours of use for this area in order to promote and ensure that public nuisance from the use of this area does not impact on nearby residents.

In determining what conditions are appropriate, it will be necessary to consider the individual circumstances of the premises, including:-

- · The nature and style of the venue.
- · The activities being conducted there.
- · The location, and.
- · Anticipated clientele.

We take the view that live and recorded music shall be restricted to the following:

Live Music

Monday to Sunday

1000 to 0000

Live music is to be restricted to no more than two artists performing at any one time and the performance of music shall be located in the front part of the premises not beyond the stairs to the mezzanine floor. No amplified music at any time or live music after midnight.

Recorded Music & Facilities for Making Music

Monday to Sunday

1000 to 0130

No amplified music at any time.

The potential for noise nuisance even people noise from those having a meal from the conservatory area at the rear was an issue for residents in order to ensure that residents are not adversely affected we require the doors to this area to be closed at 2300 hours each day with no customers permitted to enter /exit from this area except as required if it is an en emergency exit route.

The overall operating hours of the premises should therefore be Monday to Sunday 0700 to 0200.

This will ensure that noise from patrons in the area is better managed so as not to cause nuisance to neighbours.

I would like to confirm that I have considered the above proposal with regard to the prevention of public nuisance on behalf of the Enforcement Response (Noise) Team & would like to make representations to the Application

The operating schedule does not address the prevention of public nuisance from:

- airborne entertainment noise
- Structure borne noise or vibrations from entertainment
- Noise generated by patrons in external areas of the premises
- Noise generated from patrons queuing to enter
- Noise generated from deliveries
- Noise generated from refuse collections
- Noise from plant and machinery
- Light nuisance
- Cooking odour
- Litter nuisance

Prevention of nuisance from noise / vibration

All doors and windows will remain closed during the licensed regulated entertainment activities or in any event after 11pm. The entrance door will be fitted with a self-closing device and staff required to ensure that it is not propped open. A member of staff shall be made responsible to ensure the door is opened for as brief a period as possible. Where necessary adequate and suitable mechanical ventilation should be provided to public areas

Entrance/exit from the premises whilst regulated entertainment licensable activities are ongoing shall be via a lobbied door to minimise noise breakout.

The regulated entertainment licensable activity shall conclude 30 minutes before the premises is due to close to prevent excessive noise breakout as the premises empties

Structure borne noise

All speakers are mounted on anti-vibration mountings to prevent vibration transmission of sound energy to adjoining properties

Sound limits

The licensee shall ensure that no music played in the licensed premises is audible at or within the site boundary of any residential property

All regulated entertainment amplified activity will utilise the in-house amplification system, the maximum output of which is controlled by the duty manager

Outside Areas

No music will be played in, or for the benefit of patrons in external areas of the premises

No form of loudspeaker or sound amplification equipment is to be sited on or near the exterior premises or in or near any foyer, doorway, window or opening to the premises

Signs shall be displayed in the external areas/on the frontage requesting patrons to recognise the residential nature of the area and conduct their behaviour accordingly. The management must reserve the right to ask patrons to move inside the premises or leave if it is felt that they could be disturbing neighbours

Deliveries and collections.

Deliveries and collections associated with the premises will be arranged between the hours 08:00 and 20:00 so as to minimise the disturbance caused to the neighbours. This will include refuse collections.

Empty bottles and non-degradable refuse will remain in the premises at the end of trading hours and taken out to the refuse point at the start of the working day rather than at the end of trading when neighbours might be unduly disturbed

Plant and machinery

All plant and machinery is correctly maintained and regularly serviced to ensure that it is operating efficiently and with minimal disturbance to neighbours arising from noise

Dealing with complaints

A complaints book will be held on the premises to record details of any complaints received from neighbours. The information is to include, where disclosed, the complainant's name, location, date time and subsequent remedial action undertaken. This record must be made available at all times for inspection by council officers

Patrons entering/exiting premises.

There will be no queuing outside the premises.

Where people queue to enter the premises a licensed door supervisor shall supervise and ensure the potential patrons behave in an acceptable manner.

Signs should be displayed requesting patrons to respect the neighbours and behave in a courteous manner

Prevention of Nuisance from Odour

All ventilation and extraction systems shall be correctly maintained and regularly serviced to ensure that it is operating efficiently and with minimal disturbance to neighbours arising from odour.

Prevention of nuisance from light

Illuminated external signage shall be switched off when the premises is closed
