Haringey's new Travel Policy Consultation:

Closing date 4th October 2016





Background

We want your views on our proposed new Travel Policy. We are consulting on the policy, which covers travel arrangements to facilitate attendance at schools, colleges and services for all eligible:

- Children and young people with a special educational need and/or disability
- Adults in receipt of social care and support

The policy is intended to provide clarity for parents/carers and service users in a wide range of circumstances, and to ensure that those with particular and significant needs are appropriately supported.

The Policy is divided into two main sections: Children and Young People (0 to 18 years); and Adults (18+) in receipt of social care and support.

Why are we consulting?

It is our practice that when there is a change in policy that affects our residents, we consult them at the earliest opportunity.

We want to ensure that all of our service users are aware of what the council is able to provide or assist with in terms of travel.

We are consulting on three key proposals in the new travel policy that we are asking specific questions on:

- 1) The independent travel model
- 2) The assessment process
- **3)** Paying for travel arrangements

We also want your views on the policy as a whole.

By giving your views we will be able to make sure we have a greater understanding of what you consider is important.

Who are we consulting with?

We want to hear the views of Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) service users, Adult Social service users, their carers, families and any other interested parties.

This policy will impact a wide range of stakeholders from across the borough.

In order to encompass the views of our wide range of stakeholders we will:

- Run focus groups with service users and parents/ carers
- Develop and execute online surveys
- Write a letter explaining our policy change to service users
- · Publish a draft a policy on our corporate website

How will the proposals affect you?

The policy offers a single approach to travel assistance for children and young people attending school or college. The aim is to ensure that the service received and the user experience are consistent and that the most efficient, effective and suitable travel assistance is provided.

The council expects all pupils to travel to their education provision by walking where possible, wheel chairing or making use of the free travel available on London Transport unless the criteria set out in the travel policy apply.

The council also provides travel arrangements through a variety of options to people with learning disabilities, mental health needs, physical disabilities, frailty and dementia across the borough.

This policy outlines how we will move towards a consistent and equitable way of supporting such people in the provision of council funded travel.

What happens next?

After the council's Cabinet has considered the results of this consultation and agreed the policy it is anticipated that the new travel policy will be put into effect during the autumn of 2016.

Travel option alternatives to the in-house Haringey buses (provided by Passenger Transport Service.) Tick as many as you would be interested in using:

- a) Freedom Pass or free Oyster photocard for all under 18s from Transport for London (train, tube, DLR in addition to use of bus and tram currently available via Transport for London).
- **b)** Provision of a **bus pass** for a parent/carer or responsible adult (of parent/carer choice) to accompany the child to/from school.
- c) Reimbursement of mileage costs for parents/carers who are deemed able to transport their children to school.
- **d)** An allocated **personal budget** for parent/carers to arrange transport themselves.
- e) Car Share Scheme. A lift may be provided through a car journey matching service where a parent or carer already driving a similar route has room and is willing to provide a lift to someone else. In these circumstances the driver maybe paid a mileage rate in line with HMRC's directions.
- **f) Walking Bus** A community walking bus scheme led by a volunteer or parent(s) taking groups of pupils to their destination where it is practical and local.
- **g) Travelmate** peer accompanied journeys.
- h) ZipCar or DriveNow scheme is a car club that gives you access to the car or van you need when you need it, perfectly maintained but with none of the hassle or expense or ownership.
- i) Dial-a-Ride membership is open to people with a permanent or long-term disability which prevents them using scheduled public transport services. https://tfl.gov.uk/modes/dial-a-ride/

j) Taxicard is a service that allows Haringey residents with a mobility impairment that prevents them from using buses or trains, to travel in licensed radio taxis or black cabs at lower rates. http://www.haringey.gov.uk/environment-and-transport/travel/passes-and-concessions/taxicard.
