- 1. Describe the issue under consideration
- 1.1 This report relates to an application for the Review of The Duke of Edinburgh Premises License brought by a local residents Mr Barnes, under 'The Prevention of crime and disorder and the Prevention of Public nuisance objectives.
- 1.2 Summary of review received:
  - i) The review was brought following ongoing disturbance caused from departing customers at the venue. Further details are contained in the residents application for review.
  - 1.3 The full review application from Mr Barnes can be found at Appendix A.
    - i) A copy of the current Premises Licence is at Appendix B.
    - ii) Copies of Respresentations are at Appendix C
    - iii) Copy of representation from Licence Holder Appendix C1
  - 1.4 Representations must relate to particular premises for which a Premises Licence is already held and must be relevant to the promotion of the Licensing Objectives. The Licensing Committee, in determining a review, may exercise the range of powers given to them to promote the Licensing Objectives.

The Authority will seek to establish the cause or causes of the concern and remedial action will be targeted at such causes. Any action will be proportionate to the problems involved.

Where reviews arise and the Licensing Authority determines that the crime prevention objective is being undermined through the premises being used to further crimes, it is expected that the revocation of the licence- even in the first instance - will be seriously considered (Amended Guidance, paragraph 11.27). Revocation also remains an option if other licensing objectives are being undermined.
