1. Describe the issue under consideration

1.1 This report relates to an application for the Review of Socialite Bar Premises License brought by the Metropolitan Police, under 'The Prevention of crime and disorder and the Public safety licensing objectives.

1.2 Summary of review received:

i) The review was brought following a serious disturbance caused from departing customers at the venue. Further details are contained in the officers report.

1.3 The full review application from the Metropolitan Police acting in their capacity as a Responsible Authority can be found at Appendix A.

1.4 Representations must relate to particular premises for which a Premises Licence is already held and must be relevant to the promotion of the Licensing Objectives. The Licensing Committee, in determining a review, may exercise the range of powers given to them to promote the Licensing Objectives. The Authority will seek to establish the cause or causes of the concern and remedial action will be targeted at such causes. Any action will be proportionate to the problems involved. Where reviews arise and the Licensing Authority determines that the crime prevention objective is being undermined through the premises being used to further crimes, it is expected that the revocation of the licence- even in the first instance - will be seriously considered (Amended Guidance, paragraph 11.27). Revocation also remains an option if other licensing objectives are being undermined.

The Police representation will include the viewing of CCTV images from the venue which would be classified as exempt information as defined under Schedule 12A to the Local Government Act 1972, paragraph 7, namely information relating to any action taken or to be taken in connection with the prevention, investigation or prosecution of crime and as such will be subject to a motion to exclude the press and
