1.0 Describe the issue under consideration

- 1.1 To report on the feedback of statutory consultation carried out from 28 July to 24 August 2017, for a proposal to introduce a Bikehanger on Vale Grove where it meets Hermitage Road.
- 1.2 To request approval to proceed to implementation, having taken objections into consideration.
- 2.0 Recommendation
- 2.1 It is recommended that the Head of Traffic Management:-
- 2.2 Approves the making of the Traffic Order to introduce a Bikehanger on Vale Grove where it meets Hermitage Road.
- 3.0 Reasons for decision
- 3.1 This facility has been consulted upon following numerous requests from Hermitage Road/Vale Grove residents. It should be noted that this Bikehangar will be fully funded via the Seven Sisters Ward Councillors ward budget.
- 4.0 Alternative options considered
- 4.1 None.
- 5.0 Background Information
- 5.1 Encouraging more people to cycle is a vital part of Haringey Council's plan to tackle congestion, improve air quality, promote physical activity and improve accessibility. The council is committed to the promotion of cycling as a serious form of transport. As the number of people who cycle increases, we recognise the need for safe and secure parking.
- 5.2 Following numerous requests from Hermitage Road/Vale Grove residents, the Council proposes to install a second Bikehangar on Vale Grove. This will require an existing residents parking bay to be reduced by 2.6 meters and will be fully funded via the Seven Sisters Ward Councillors ward budget.
- 5.3 The Bikehangar is a communal bike locker that stores six bicycles and only occupies half a car parking space. It's easy to open with a self-lifting door; the steel design protects bicycles from vandalism and wet weather.
- 5.4 The Bikehangar is manufactured by Cyclehoop Ltd, which is a firm of award-winning designers and architects specialising in producing innovative indoor and outdoor cycle parking infrastructure.



- 6.0 Statutory Consultation
- 6.1 Ward Councillors were informed of the proposals on the 29th June 2017 and had no comments.
- 6.2 Notification documents were distributed to residents in the vicinity of the proposals on the 28th July 2017. A copy of the statutory consultation document is shown in Appendix A.
- 6.3 Legal Notices were placed on street at the location where the Bikehangar is proposed. A copy of the legal notice is shown in Appendix B.
- 7.0 Responses to Consultation
- 7.1 The council received seven responses to the consultation. All seven responses were in favour of the Bikehangar.
- 8.0 Contribution to strategic outcomes
- 8.1 This project will improve cycling facilities in the area and thus encourage cycle usage.

- 9.5.1 As there were no objections during the statutory notification period, the council has concluded that no alterations should be made to the proposed scheme. The Bikehangar will reduce vehicle parking by half a space but will allow six




bicycles to park safely, which will help to promote the use of more sustainable forms of transport contributing to the council priority 2.


We would like to help residents who do not have adequate space to store their bikes by offering an additional Bikehangar facility in which space can be rented.

Proposed Location


Following requests for further secure cycle parking, we now propose to install an additional Bikehangar on Vale Grove where it meets Hermitage Road, as per the plan below.
