

Decision Notice

The Licensing Sub Committee carefully considered the application for a Premises License at, Stadium Lounge, Restaurant & Wine Bar Ltd, 783 High Road, Tottenham, London, N17 8AH

In considering the application, the Committee took account of the London Borough of Haringey's Statement of Licensing Policy, the Licensing Act 2003, the Licensing Act 2003 section 182 Guidance, the report pack, and the applicant's and objector's representations.

Having considered the application and heard from all the parties, the Committee decided to **GRANT** the application subject to the conditions below:

Hours open to Public

Sunday to Thursday 09:00 to 23:30 hours

Friday to Saturday 09:00 to 02:00 hours

Provision of Regulated Entertainment: Recorded Music Sunday to Thursday 09:00 to 23:00 hours Friday to Saturday 09:00 to 01:30 hours

Late Night Refreshment

Friday to Saturday 23:00 to 01:30 hours

Sale of Alcohol

Sunday to Thursday 09:00 to 23:00 hours

Friday to Saturday 09:00 to 01:30 hours

Supply of alcohol **ON** the premises only.

Seasonal variations:

Christmas Eve all licensable activities until 01:30 and closing time 02:00

Boxing Day all licensable activities until 23:00 and closing time 23:30

New Years Eve all licensable activities until 01:30 and closing time 02:00.

THE PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER

CCTV shall be installed, operated, and maintained, to function all times that the premises is open for licensable activities. Said CCTV will comply with the following criteria:

(a) The premises will ensure that the system is checked on a regular basis to ensure that the system is working properly and that the date and time are correct.

(b) There will be a camera on the entrance to the premises, to capture a clear image of anyone entering.

(c) The system will provide coverage of the interior of the premises accessible to the public.

(d) The system will record in real time and recordings will be date and time stamped.

(e) At all times during operating hours, there will be at least 1 member of staff on the premises who can operate the system sufficiently to allow Police or authorised Council officers to view footage on request.

(f) Recordings will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and downloaded footage will be provided to the Police or other authorised officers on request (subject to the Data Protection Act 2018) within 24 hours of any request.

(g) Signage stating that CCTV is in operation will be clearly and prominently displayed at the premises.

An incident and refusal log [whether kept in written or electronic form] shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to the Police or an authorised officer, which will record:

(a) Any and all allegations of crime or disorder reported at the venue

(b) Any and all complaints received by any party

(c) Any faults in the CCTV system

(d) Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service

(e) Any refused sales of alcohol

(f) Any and all ejections of patrons

Police suggest the following conditions be added to the operating schedule:

At least One SIA officer to be on duty from 21:00 Hours on Friday and Saturday until the premises is closed, and patrons disperse from the area. This is to be risk assessed by the premises if more are required.

MATCH DAY and EVENTS CONDITIONS:

The Licensee is to ensure the following Police conditions are complied with on football match days at Tottenham Hotspur Stadium, and all event days:

- The sale of alcohol shall not take place before 11:00 Saturday and Sunday.
- On match/ event days all drinks will be served in Plastic or polycarbonate glass Four (4) hours before start time and until one hour after the end of the match/event.
- No glass bottles are served 4 hours before start time and until one hour after the end of the match/event.
- On match/event days a minimum of two (2) SIA security will be hired at the premises and SIA Security staff shall wear body worn video cameras and high visibility clothing so easily identified.
- No more than 6 persons shall be permitted to smoke outside the front of the premises at all times on match/event days.

PUBLIC SAFETY

The premises shall permit a maximum of sixty (60) patrons on premises at any time. All emergency exits shall be always kept free from obstruction.

The premises licence holder shall cooperate with local authorities, violence reduction partnerships and law enforcement agencies to regularly review and improve safety measures as and when required.

THE PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

No more than 6 persons shall be permitted to smoke outside the front of the premises after 21:00.

The area shall be adequately supervised to control the number and behaviour of patrons and to ensure that they do not block the highway or cause a noise nuisance. Any person who appears intoxicated or whose behaviour causes nuisance or disorder will be refused entry or service and shall be asked to leave.

No new admissions on Fridays and Saturdays after 00:30 hours.

At least one SIA Officer to be on duty from 21:00 hours on Friday and Saturday, when the premises is operating after midnight for licensable activities or event, SIA TO DISPERSE PATRONS from the area at close of venue at 2am. This is to be risk assessed if more are required.

REASONS:

The committee gave serious consideration to the submissions by the Applicant and to the concerns raised by the objectors.

It was noted that prior to the commencement of the Committee meeting the representative for the applicant indicated to the Committee that they had been in mediation with the Police and they were agreeable to the amended proposed conditions made by the Police & the Police also accepted one further condition from the Applicant. As such it was apparent to the Committee that there were no further objections & all conditions had been agreed.

In light of the above, it was deemed that a grant of the application with the above conditions balanced the interest of the applicants, the residents and the licencing objectives.

Appeal rights.

This decision is open to appeal to the Magistrates Court within the period of 21 days, beginning on the day upon which the applicant is notified of the decision. This decision does not take effect until the end of the appeal. Or, in the event that an appeal has been lodged, until their appeal is dispensed with.
